Meeting Summary

Friday, December 16, 2005

On December 16, 2005, the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts and the Executive Office for the United States Trustees hosted a meeting for all interested vendors on the new “smart forms” technical standard for electronically filing bankruptcy forms with the U.S. Bankruptcy Courts.

Background and Overview of New Data Enabled Smart Forms Standard

- * Monique Bourque of the United States Trustees Program (USTP) provided an overview of the events leading to the new data enabled form standard.
- * Specifically, for several years, the USTP has been discussing the possibility of creating data enabled forms with the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts (AOUSC). The USTP and AOUSC established a technical working group to initially focus on implementing the daily exchange of filing data from CM/ECF to the USTP.
- * In 2004, the USTP and AOUSC tested a “proof-of -concept” for filing a data enabled form through the test CM/ECF system.
- * The new Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention and Consumer Protection Act (BAPCPA) requirements raised the priority of pursuing a data enabled form standard. The USTP felt it would be much more efficient, and would save taxpayer’s money, to perform the USTP’s review and annual reports and other statistical reports if they were able to electronically parse the petitions and schedules on a more granular level. For example, new BAPCPA review requirements include means test, Chapter 11 small business, and new studies and reports (means test analysis, household goods analysis, debtor audits annual reporting). Plus, the Small Business Administration is required to report on Chapter 11 small businesses.
- * In addition, the courts could automate more of their internal tracking and reporting as well as other potential benefits to the private trustee community and the bankruptcy community – such as end-users of PACER.
- * In order to receive the data electronically, the USTP and the AOUSC looked at setting a standard, one that would integrate with the existing CM/ECF system “as is”.
- * After many meetings and discussions over this past summer, the AOUSC and the USTP

released a new standard for vendor comment in June and adoption in September.

- * The current Acroform standard **is not mandatory** at this time. However, it is the only data enabled form standard accepted by CM/ECF. Long term - if it appears the data enabled form standard is not being universally adopted, then a mandatory standard will be considered by the AOUSC.
- * The AOUSC expects to stay with the Acroform standard for the foreseeable future since it fits in nicely with the archive requirements identified by NARA (National Archives and Records Administration). However, we anticipate some modifications to the schema as the process is refined. For example, the schema needs to be modified to accommodate filing combined forms (to ensure all names are unique across forms), and the address information needs to be changed to follow the format in place for Case Upload.

Note that the Instructions/Legend Page offers some guidance on repeating rows/fields. Also, note hidden/non-displayed tags.
- * Monique Bourque also provided an overview of the schedule for posting the Census Bureau income and IRS expense data. This data will be updated annually. The IRS data is updated usually in January of each year and the Census Bureau data is updated usually in August of each year. Any delays in this schedule will be posted to the Census Bureau, IRS and USTP websites. In addition, the Census Bureau data may be adjusted at the beginning of the calendar year. The Chapter 13 multiplier information will be updated annually at the beginning of the calendar year along with the IRS data.
- * John Brinkema of the AOUSC provided an overview of why Acroform was selected as the standard and the issues surrounding PDF, PDF/A, and XML. John Brinkema also provided an overview along with some examples of his research into the use of various commercial merging and open source tools to manipulate data enabled forms (both populating and extracting data to create an Forms Data Format (FDF) file, for example). - * Diane Traylor of the AOUSC provided the status of the upcoming CM/ECF releases for the bankruptcy courts. Tom Lane also of the AOUSC provided an overview of the new Claims Batch Filing Process. Specifically, Release 3.0 is due out in late January 2006 for Solaris and in March 2006 for Linux. Of most interest to vendors, Release 3.0 will offer the new Case Upload feature and include a claims batch filing module. Release 3.1, due out in August 2006, will address the statistical gathering requirements under the new bankruptcy legislation as well as requirements put forth by the Judicial Conference's Committee on the bankruptcy system. Please note: If you would like access to the test version of the above releases, you must coordinate with local courts to gain access to their test sites once they have upgraded to the above versions.

- * In general, additional forms may be added to the data enabled form library/suite. Currently, just the petitions, schedules, statement of financial affairs, and means test forms are defined.

Attendee Suggestions and Comments

- Several individuals requested to be notified of changes or new postings to the USTP and PACER data enabled web pages. Plus, a mechanism for collaboration was requested.

- *USTP and AOUSC will use the vendor e-mail contact list (used to announce this meeting) to notify companies when updates to the web pages are made.*

- Some attendees suggested that a posted list of local court IT contacts would be helpful.

- *AOUSC staff will pursue this suggestion.*

- One vendor noted that we may want to consider data enabling the B21 form (Social Security number form) and B10 (claim form).

- *AOUSC and USTP will consider this suggestion.*

- One attendee asked how one could get access to preferred mailing addresses for creditors.

- *AOUSC staff indicated that the issue of posting this information to the general public user is under consideration within the AOUSC. Posting the creditor's preferred address for court produced notices could be misleading due to other noticing address requirements in the BAPCPA.*

- A suggestion was made that courts not be so quick to "blackball" a company's product when a bug is discovered.

- *AOUSC will relay this suggestion to the bankruptcy clerks.*

- A suggestion was made that courts post and date all of their local forms on their web pages.

- *AOUSC will relay this suggestion to the bankruptcy clerks.*
