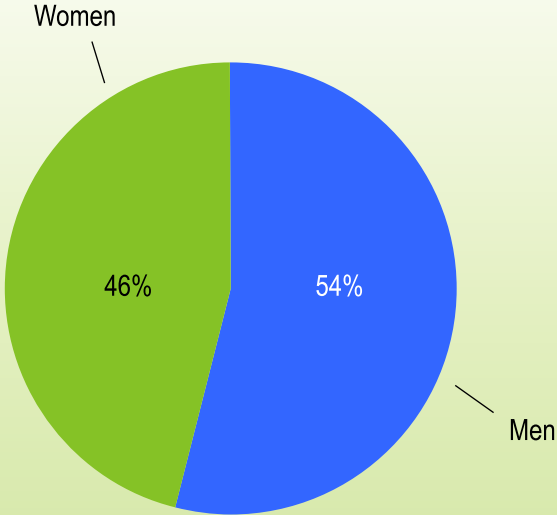
Men experience a disproportionate share of fatalities relative to their share of employment.

Since 1995, women's on-the-job fatalities have declined. In 2004, the 415 women succumbing to fatalities at work represented a series low for the fatality census.

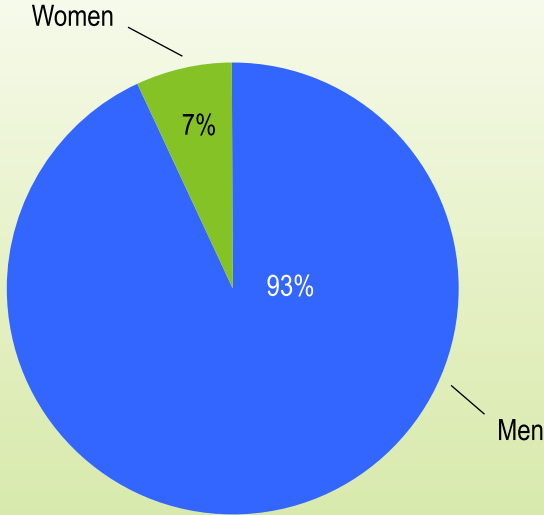
Fatalities to men generally declined from 1995 to 2002, but since then have risen from a series low of 5,092 in 2002 to 5,349 in 2004.
