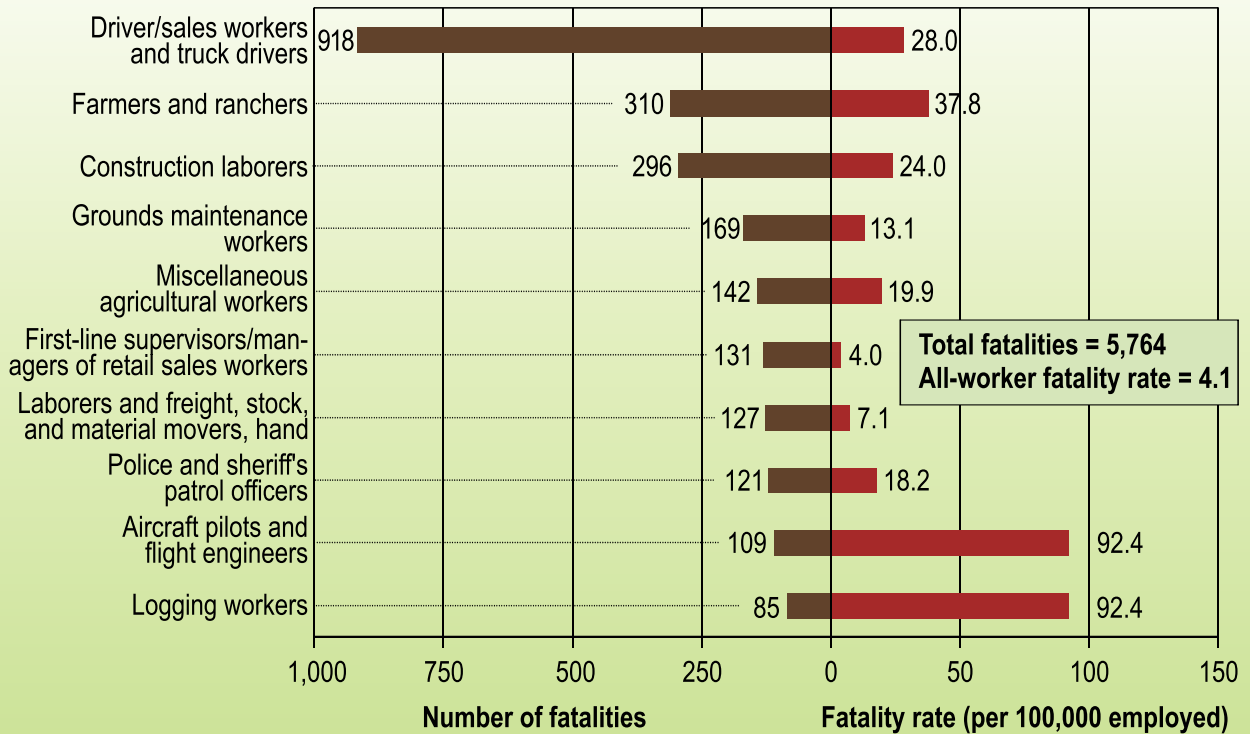
Drivers/sales workers and truck drivers accounted for the highest number (918) of fatalities in 2004, nearly 3 times as many as farmers and ranchers, the occupation with the next-highest fatality count.

Construction laborers recorded 296 fatal work injuries, the third-highest total among occupations.

Logging workers and aircraft pilots and flight engineers had the highest fatality rates per 100,000 workers.
