Rates for injuries and illnesses ranged from 1.7 cases per 100 full-time workers in financial activities to 7.0 cases per 100 full-time workers in transportation and warehousing.


Among goods-producing industries, rates ranged from 3.6 cases per 100 full-time workers in mining to 6.3 cases per 100 full-time workers in construction and in manufacturing.

In service-providing industries, rates ranged from 1.0 case per 100 full-time workers in finance and insurance to 7.0 cases per 100 full-time workers in transportation and warehousing.
