* Torch lighters create a thin, needle-like flame that is hotter (reaching 2,500 degrees Fahrenheit) and more intense than those from common lighters. Torch lighters are often used for pipes and cigars, and maintain a consistent stream of air-propelled fire regardless of the angle at which it is held. Torch lighters continue to be banned.

** Lighters without fuel are permitted in checked baggage. **Lighters with fuel are prohibited in checked baggage**, unless they adhere to the Department of Transportation (DOT) exemption, which allows up to two fueled lighters if properly enclosed in a DOT approved case. If you are uncertain as to whether your lighter is prohibited, please leave it at home.

*** Up to 4 books of safety (non-strike anywhere) matches are permitted as carry-on items, **but all matches are prohibited in checked baggage**.

Additional Useful Information:

Alcohol

Carry-on Checked

Brought from outside the security checkpoint - unless in 3 ounce containers or smaller, carried in a 1 quart (1 liter), plastic zip-top bag.*

Bought Inside the security checkpoint* Yes Yes

* More than 70 percent alcohol content (140 proof) is prohibited from carry-on and checked luggage. Up to 5 liters of alcohol with alcoholic content between 24 percent and 70 percent are allowed per person as carry-on if bought inside checkpoint.

More Information on Medication

All medications in any form or type (for instance, pills, injectables, or homeopathic) and associated supplies (syringes, Sharps disposal container, pre-loaded syringes, jet injectors, pens, infusers, etc.) are allowed through the security checkpoint once they have been screened. Liquid, gel and/or aerosol medications are permitted in reasonable amounts and should be declared to a security officer at the checkpoint. We recommend that they are labeled to assist with the screening process.

Permitted and Prohibited Items

The prohibited and permitted items list is not intended to be all-inclusive and is updated as necessary. To ensure traveler's security, transportation security officers (TSOs) may determine that an item not on the prohibited items chart is prohibited. In addition, the TSO may also determine that an item on the permitted chart is dangerous and therefore may not be brought through the security checkpoint.

<u>Liquids, Gels and/or Aerosols</u>	<u>Carry-on</u>	<u>Checked</u>
3 oz containers or smaller in a 1 quart (1 liter), plastic zip-top bag.	Yes	Yes

Exceptions (in reasonable amounts over 3 ounces):

- Baby formula, breast milk and baby food.
- Medications (liquid, gels and/or aerosol)
- Liquids (to include water, juice or liquid nutrients) or gels for diabetic or other medical needs.

Note: The exceptions must be declared to a security officer at the checkpoint.

Insulin in any form or dispenser must be labeled identifying the medication or manufacturer's name or pharmaceutical label.	Yes	Yes
Nitroglycerine pills or spray for medical use - if properly marked with a professionally printed label identifying the medication or manufacturer's name or pharmaceutical label	Yes	Yes

Firearms, Guns and Ammunition

Check with your airline or travel agent to see if ammunition is permitted in checked baggage on the airline you are flying. If ammunition is permitted, it must be declared to the airline at check-in. Small arms ammunitions for personal use must be securely packed in fiber, wood or metal boxes or other packaging specifically designed to carry small amounts of ammunition. Ask about limitations or fees, if any, that apply.	No	Yes

Firearms - Carried as checked baggage MUST be unloaded, packed in a locked hard-sided container, and declared to the airline at check-in.	No	No
