Product Installation contractors offer different products to the mining industry. They offer both products and labor to mining industry. Expertise needed to install our products is unique and changes almost daily – the four companies represented here work approximately 82,200 UG man-hour per year. Our safety record is excellent – ZERO for three of the four companies in 2004.

We use well trained people for specific tasks and hold ourselves to a high level of safety. We meet and exceed the mandated training requirements per man – MSHA, OSHA, individual State and on-site at each job.

We need training focused on site specific work place issues – at least 20 hours of 64 hrs are repetitive – need detailed escape way training (entry marking system, self rescuer storage locations, reference maps for our shift leaders) – Hoist operating systems– minimize general training issues. Our employees don't need the same training as a new hire.

These are the issues we have to deal with – liability insurance, certified in multiple states, man hours and accident reporting in each state, etc.

Looking to the future, we believe the need for products and installation will grow because it is cost effective, etc.

These are our suggestions – eliminate duplicate training – reduce paperwork – direct mailing to contractors – categorize contractors – open the line of communication – establish local problem solving groups. Establish a national database on contractors showing training, required forms, etc and make it available to all MSHA districts and state agencies. Effect hazard training at mine site-more on site specific information and less on things we get repeatedly like SCSR donning technique.

To help reduce injuries and fatals– enforce safety rules and regulations, efficient onsite training – share and provide contractors with up-to-date information from MSHA and state agencies.
