The U.S. Trade and Development Agency (USTDA) invites you to attend a Business Briefing to meet with senior African public and private sector officials from the Roads and Highways sector in Burkina Faso; Ghana; Mozambique and Tanzania. The delegations will comprise officials and Government Decision-Makers whose countries are recipients of funding for their transportation infrastructure programs through Compact Agreements with the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) which total over \$1 Billion.

# MEET THE DECISION MAKERS and EXPLORE NEW COMMERCIAL OPPORTUNITIES

The Briefing will explore opportunities for the export of U.S. transportation equipment and services, including the use of Information and Communications Technology (ICT) infrastructure, during the planning and implementation of regional road network development in the four African countries.

<u>Burkina Faso</u> – the MCC Compact Program assistance includes approximately **\$300 million** in transportation investments for rural road construction.

<u>Ghana</u> - Transportation Infrastructure Development Project (\$143 million) includes upgrading sections of National Highway N1; upgrading of main roads by paving or laying gravel; and improvement of the Lake Volta ferry system services; construction of 1,200 kilometers of feeder roads.

<u>Mozambique</u> - Transportation Project (\$176.3 million). MCC funding will rehabilitate 491 km of key segments of the National Route 1 which forms the backbone of country's transportation network.

<u>Tanzania</u> - Transport Sector Project (\$373 million) will focus specifically on the rehabilitation of high-traffic roads on the mainland; upgrade the airport on Mafia Island; and repair of selected rural roads on Zanzibar. The Project also includes funds for road maintenance.

Attendees will have the opportunity to receive the latest information on new developments in the highway construction sector in these four countries and to discuss your products and services during one-on-one meetings with those responsible for decision-making.


