CPSC, Firms Announce Recall of Flammable Spray String

WASHINGTON, D.C. - In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), three firms, Stelex Enterprises Inc., of Los Angeles, Calif.; Major Import, of Whittier, Calif.; and LeSa Yang Family Ltd. of Diamond Bar, Calif., are recalling about 912,000 cans of spray string sold under the names "Crazy Ribbon" and "Crazy String." These spray strings' propellant is extremely flammable, creating a serious risk of burn injuries when sprayed near an open flame, such as birthday candles. Flammable products intended for use by children are banned by federal law.

CPSC is aware of at least one report of a burn injury resulting from the use of these spray strings. An 11-year-old boy suffered serious burns during his birthday party that left permanent scars.

Crazy Ribbon sprays strings of various colors, and comes in a round metal spray can about 6.5 inches high. The can is silver with a plastic cap that matches the color of the spray string. Depictions of various colored streamers cover the can. Writing on the can includes "CRAZY RIBBON" in multicolored block letters, "FOR PARTY CELEBRATION AND DECORATION," and "MADE IN TAIWAN."

Crazy String also sprays strings of various colors, and comes in a round metal spray can about 6.5 inches high. The can is silver with a plastic cap that matches the color of the spray string. Depictions of various colored streamers cover the can. Writing on the can includes "CRAZY STRING," "FOR PARTY CELEBRATION AND DECORATION," and "MADE IN TAIWAN."

Party and hobby stores nationwide sold the spray string from October 1996 through July 1999 for between \$2 and \$4.

Consumers should take these spray strings away from children and stop using it immediately. It can be returned to the store where purchased for a refund. For more information, call CPSC's Hotline at (800) 638-2772 anytime.

The staff has completed its examination of the sample of "Crazy Ribbon" Party String. The item is a banned hazardous Substance under the Federal Hazardous Substances Act (FHSA) which we administer and distribution in this country is prohibited. The staff requests that you stop the distribution of any current inventory and voluntarily recall to the consumer level any distributed units.

On July 16, 1999 we obtained a sample of "Crazy Ribbon" Party String from a lot of 31,680 units in import status at the Port of Los Angeles/Long Beach, California. The sampled lot was entered under #638-0056499-7, dated 7/9/99 and invoice #A-9038, dated 6/21/99. Your firm is shown as the Importer of Record.

The staff tested the product by the method described in 16 C.F.R. § 1500.45 and determined that the product is flammable as defined under 16 C.F.R. § 1500.3(c)(6)(viii) as the flame projection exceeded 18 inches when the valve was opened. Testing also determined that the product exhibited flash back. As a result, the product is a hazardous substance as described under 16 C.F.R. § 2(f)(1)(v) of the Federal Hazardous Substances Act (FHSA), 15 U.S.C. § 1261(f)(v), and, as it is a child's product, it is a banned hazardous substance under § 2(q)(1)(A) of the FHSA, 15 U.S.C.§ 1261(q)(1)(A).

The sale, manufacture for sale, offer for sale in commerce, or importation of any banned hazardous substance is a prohibited act under Section 4 of the FHSA. 15 U.S.C. § 1263 and could subject your firm to the Penalties outlined in Section 5 of the FHSA, 15 U.S.C. § 1264. This regulatory voluntary recall is now ready for monitoring. The firm started the voluntary recall on 8/10/99. Staff considers the hazard to be very serious. The product is "Crazy Ribbon" party string in 6" aerosol cans.

Attached is a final copy of the firm's available recall documents. We are working on a joint press release. See Mark Ross. Everything else you should need is recorded in the IFIS Recall Data Base under 99-860-5295. When I get a copy of the final, printed point-of-purchase poster I shall send you one.

Also attached is a list of the firm's 15 direct consignees of the product. Please share with Mark Ross.

I would pick 3 consignees at random for REC's by FOWR. However, please do not pick CBB, Los Angeles, California for a REC as we have already inspected this consignee about the matter. There are no REC's for the other regions and MASC to do unless they are involved in the sub-recall. Wholesalers may be done by phone/mail. Retailers should be done on-site. At least one sub-recall check should be done for each REC of a Wholesaler. The REC's should not be done before 9/1/99, but as soon as possible after 9/1/99.

Larry B.,

On 6-7-99 I sent Stelex a fax message requesting the importation records, distribution records, and other information on the Crazy String. Stelex had denied having ever imported the Crazy Ribbon and claimed that it had imported only the Crazy String. Then I did not know that Stelex imported the Crazy Ribbon in 1996.

On 7-7-99 when I learned Stelex's importation of the Crazy Ribbon, I sent the firm a fax message requesting the importation records and distribution records on both Crazy Ribbon and Crazy String.

The only records I've been able to receive from Stelex so far are the ones that cover the "only" lot of the Crazy Ribbon imported by the firm in 1996. The invoice issued to Stelex by New International Corp., Taipei, Taiwan, covers 4,560 units of the product. Stelex provided a copy of seven sales receipts covering only 2,160 units.

I insisted Stelex should provide all importation and distribution records on the Crazy String. Mr. Cheng said the firm would provide them but would need more time to search for the records. When I spoke to his attorney Albert Chang by phone about the records, he repeated what Mr. Cheng had told me.

Mr. Cheng does not know if the Crazy Ribbon and the Crazy string use the same chemical formula.

Mr. Cheng insisted that Top Grease Industrial Co., Ltd., the manufacturer of both Crazy Ribbon and Crazy String had shipped mixed lots of both products to Stelex and other US importers. He said that Top Grease had agreed to use the brand name, Crazy String, exclusively for Stelex. He added that Stelex had been gathering information to confirm that Top Grease had been selling the Crazy String to other importers. He said that Stelex would sue Top Grease for a breach of agreement.

Mr. Cheng claimed that Stelex had never sold any Crazy Ribbon to One Stop Party Shop, Fontana, CA, where Sample 99-860-5373 of the Crazy Ribbon was collected on 6-3-99. He insisted that Stelex sold the Crazy String, not the Crazy Ribbon and that the retailer did not purchase the sampled Crazy Ribbon from Stelex.

Mr. Cheng claimed that the LoA on Sample 99-860-5373 did not instruct Stelex to recall the Crazy Ribbon it had imported and distributed. He said that if CPSC requested Stelex to recall the product, Stelex would. (Larry, sorry. I forgot to tell you this during our telephone conversation of this morning. I believe if we "order" him to voluntarily recall the product according to our guidance, he will do so.)

Folks: Maybe this will help clear things up:

It is our understanding that "Crazy String" party string is a brand name that is reportedly used on product imported by Stelex Corporation only. "Crazy Ribbon" party string is used on the product imported by any importer. Stelex has claimed that it only imported "Crazy Ribbon" once in 1996. The unit involved in the incident is a "Crazy Ribbon" product that was PROBABLY distributed by Stelex but actually imported by another firm. Stelex is not yet come forth with records and a decision to recall its imported brand "Crazy String" or the "Crazy Ribbon" lot it imported in 1996. We have no information yet about how many or when it imported "Crazy String".

We obviously believe that both brands are the same item, and a sample of "Crazy String" will go a long way to clear this up. the sample will also give us ammunition to get Stelex to recall and produce records and/or support our need for a subpoena to get the records we need. This is why a sample of "Crazy String" is so important. Norvan is the CO for this firm. Ron Yelenik is our lawyer on the matter from the Legal Division.

*** As you can tell it is important to report the correct brand of party string you sample.***

The Le Sa Yang Family, Ltd has already agreed to a voluntary recall of "Crazy Ribbon" it imported and we sampled under 99-860-5295. Major Import, Inc. has also agreed to a voluntary recall of the "Crazy Ribbon" it imported and we sampled as 99-860-5290/1/2/3/4. (I am the CO for these two firm.)

Ameri-China Intl., Inc. has an imported lot of "Crazy Ribbon" under Customs seizure (99-860-5682). It reports no other shipments. Norvan is handling Ameri-China.

We have inspectional assignment 990727WRC1818 issued to Keven to inspect four firms that according to a trade complaint also imported "Crazy Ribbon". The firms are to be inspected by 8/15/99. They are: Royal/Regency Merchandise, Los Angeles; Y.B. Toys, Alhambra; K & F Intl., Inc., Los Angeles; and, Kimsley Trading Co., Inc., Arcadia. We have indicated that Louie Pain will handle any CO work for these firms.

We have draft press releases into OIPA for Major Import and Le Sa Yang Family, Ltd. We do not know whether OIPA will do one press release for all the eventual importers or separate ones for each firm. We are encouraging the firms to develop eventually a Video News Release. Headquarters has indicated that it was ok for all to pool their resources for one tape. A production cost \$10,000 to \$12,000 each. There probably will not be to many takers.

We are finding that the firms involved with this product may have been both an importer themselves and/or a distributor of lots imported by someone else.
