(1) to enter, at reasonable times, any factory, warehouse, or other establishment in which a product or any component thereof subject to the Commission's jurisdiction is manufactured, processed, packaged, tested, or held in connection with its distribution in commerce, or any conveyance being used to transport such product or any component thereof in connection with its distribution in commerce;

(2) to inspect, at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner such conveyance or those areas of such factory, warehouse, or other establishment where such a product or any component thereof is manufactured, processed, packaged, tested, held, or transported and which may relate to the safety of such product or component;

(3) to have access to and copy at all reasonable times: (i) all records, reports, books, documents, papers, or labeling required by the Commission to be established, made, or maintained; (ii) all documents showing or relating to the production, inventory, testing, distribution, sale, transportation, importation, or receipt of any product or component thereof; and (iii) all other appropriate records, reports, books, documents, papers, packages and packaging, and labels and labeling; and

(4) to obtain (i) information, both oral and written, concerning the production, inventory, testing, distribution, sale, transportation, importation, or receipt of any such product or component thereof and the organization, business, conduct, practices, and management of any person or organization being inspected and the person's or organization's relation to any other person or organization; (ii) samples of any such product or component thereof, and have the same analyzed, tested, or examined; and (iii) information, both oral and written, concerning any matter referred to herein.

Upon presenting this notice, along with appropriate credentials, to the person or agent in charge of the firm to be inspected, the Commission officer or employee is authorized for the purposes of enforcing or determining compliance with the Consumer Product Safety Act:

(1) To enter, at reasonable times, any factory, warehouse, or establishment in which consumer products are manufactured or held, in connection with distribution in commerce, or any conveyance being used to transport consumer products in connection with distribution in commerce; and

(4) To obtain: (i) information, both oral and written, concerning the production, inventory, testing, distribution, sale, transportation, importation, or receipt of any consumer product, and the organization, business, conduct, practices, and management of any person or firm being inspected and its relation to any other person or firm; (ii) samples of items, materials, substances, products, containers, packages and packaging, and labels and labeling, or any component at manufacturer's, distributor's or retailer's cost unless voluntarily provided; and (iii) information, both oral and written, concerning any matter referred to in the Act or rules thereunder.

This inspection will be conducted and the information will be provided with the cooperation of the person or firm being inspected.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

Section 5(a) of the Flammable Fabrics Act, (15 U.S.C. 1194(a)):

Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, sections 3, 5, 6 and 8(b) of 15 U.S.C. 1192, 1194, 1195, and 1197(b) of this Act shall be enforced by the Commission* under rules, regulations, and procedures provided for in the Federal Trade Commission Act.

Section 4(a) of the Federal Trade Commission Act, (15 U.S.C. 46(a)):

That the Commission* shall also have power —
(a) To gather and compile information concerning, and to investigate from time to time the organization, business, conduct, practices, and management of any person, partnership, or corporation engaged in or whose business affects commerce, excepting banks and common carriers subject to the Act to regulate commerce, and its relation to other persons, partnerships, and corporations.

Section 9 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, (15 U.S.C. 49):

That for the purposes of this Act, the Commission*, or its duly authorized agent or agents, shall at all reasonable times have access to, for the purpose of examination, and the right to copy any documentary evidence of any person, partnership, or corporation being investigated or proceeded against...

Sections 16(a) and (b) of the Consumer Product Safety Act** (15 U.S.C. 2065(a) and (b)):

(a) For purposes of implementing this Act, or rules or orders prescribed under this Act, officers or employees duly designated by the Commission upon presenting appropriate credentials and a written notice from the Commission to the owner, operator, or agent in charge, are authorized:

(1) to enter, at reasonable times, (A) any factory, warehouse, or establishment in which consumer products are manufactured or held, in connection with distribution in commerce, or (B) any conveyance being used to transport consumer products in connection with distribution in commerce; and (2) to inspect, at reasonable times and in a reasonable manner such conveyance or those areas of such factory, warehouse, or establishment where such products are manufactured, held, or transported and which may relate to the safety of such products. Each such inspection shall be commenced and completed with reasonable promptness.

(b) Every person who is a manufacturer, private labeler, or distributor of a consumer product shall establish and maintain such records, make such reports, and provide such information as the Commission may by rule, reasonably require for the purposes of implementing this Act, or to determine compliance with rules or orders prescribed under this Act. Upon request of an officer or employee duly designated by the Commission, every such manufacturer, private labeler, or distributor shall permit the inspection of appropriate books, records, and papers relevant to determining whether such manufacturer, private labeler, or distributor has acted or is acting in compliance with this Act and rules under this Act.

Section 19(a)(3) of the Consumer Product Safety Act, (15 U.S.C. 2068(a)(3)):

It shall be unlawful for any person to fail or refuse to permit access to or copying of records, or fail or refuse to establish or maintain records, or fail or refuse to make reports or provide information, or fail or refuse to permit entry or inspection, as required under this Act or rule thereunder.

Section 27(f) of the Consumer Product Safety Act**, (15 U.S.C. 2076(f)):

For purposes of carrying out this Act, the Commission may purchase any consumer product and it may require any manufacturer, distributor or retailer of a consumer product to sell the product to the Commission at manufacturer's, distributor's, or retailer's cost.

Section 704(a) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 374(a)), [Authority for inspections in connection with the Poison Prevention Packaging Act of 1970 (15 U.S.C. 1471 et seq.)]***

Sec. 704(a) For purposes of enforcement of this Act, officers or employees duly designated by the Secretary, upon presenting appropriate credentials and a written notice to the owner, operator, or agent in charge, are authorized —

(1) to enter, at reasonable times, any factory, warehouse or establishment in which food, drugs, devices, or cosmetics are manufactured, processed, packed, or held, for introduction into interstate commerce or after such introduction, or to enter any vehicle, being used to transport or hold such food, drugs, devices, or cosmetics in interstate commerce; and

(2) to inspect, at reasonable times and within reasonable limits and in a reasonable manner, such factory, warehouse, establishment, or vehicle and all pertinent equipment, finished and unfinished materials, containers, and labeling therein.

Section 11(b) of the Federal Hazardous Substances Act as Amended (15 U.S.C. 1270(b)),***

Sec. 11(b) For purposes of enforcement of this Act, officers or employees duly designated by the Secretary, upon presenting appropriate credentials and a written notice to the owner, operator, or agent in charge, are authorized —

(1) to enter, at reasonable times, any factory, warehouse, or establishment in which hazardous substances are manufactured, processed, packed or held for introduction into interstate commerce or are held after such introduction, or to enter any vehicle being used to transport or hold such hazardous substances in interstate commerce.

(2) to inspect, at reasonable times and within reasonable limits and in a reasonable manner, such factory, warehouse, establishment, or vehicle, and all pertinent equipment, finished and unfinished materials, and labeling therein; and

(3) to obtain samples of such materials or packages thereof, or of such labeling. A separate notice shall be given for each such inspection, but a notice shall not be required for each entry made during the period covered by the inspection. Each such inspection shall be commenced and completed with reasonable promptness.

*The functions of the Federal Trade Commission in the administration and enforcement of the Flammable Fabrics Act were transferred to the Consumer Product Safety Commission pursuant to Section 30(b) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2070(b)).

The information contained in this report was obtained during a visit with the victim's attorney and an agent for the manufacturer's insurance company. A copy of the agent's report has been requested. If it is received it will be submitted later.

The victim's mother was not available during a visit to Las Vegas.

PRE EVENT

The 15 year old male victim was playing with a flying toy purchased for his 5 year old brother's birthday. The victim is 5 feet 8 inches tall and is right handed.

The victim's school health record indicates that the victim's sight was 20/20 during a vision check prior to the event. See attachment 1.

The victim operated the toy 15 times in 15 minutes prior to the event.

EVENT

The victim was standing on a neighbor's lawn. He was holding the toy in his right hand. His arm was extended. He launched the flying toy by pulling on the launching string with his left hand. The "arms" of the figure spun like the blades of a propeller. The victim heard a snap and one of the "arms" broke off and the hard, unprotected, part hit the victim in the eye.

POST EVENT

The victim's eye was examined by an ophthalmologist. The ophthalmologist determined that the victim had received two lacerations to the surface of his left eye. See attachment 2 for the medical evaluation.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION

The toy involved in the event was manufactured by Tara Toy Corp., Hauppauge, NY. It is called Flying Warriors. It is model number 18500. It has been on the market for 1 1/2 years. Sales of the toy have amounted to 600,000 to 700,000 units. The manufacturer has had the toy tested. The toy is no longer being sold. It has run its course.

The toy is composed of a plastic warrior figure 7 inches long. The figure has "arms" like propellers which are 5 inches long. The "arms" are padded with sponge material for about one half of their length.

Included with the toy is a plastic launcher which is 6 inches by 5

inches. The launcher contains a string 8 1/2 inches long which when pulled causes the figure to spin. As the figure spins it rises.

The launcher also is designed to fire a foam "missile" when a trigger is pulled.

The toy is labeled with the CSPA warning for toys containing small parts. Also a warning is included that the toy should not be launched at people or animals.

The toy is labeled that it conforms to ASTM F963-95.

The toy involved in the event was examined and photographed at the victim's attorney's office. See attached photos. The broken shaft that held the "arm" that struck the victim was measured at 3/16 inch.

SAMPLE COLLECTED

The victim's attorney declined to allow the toy involved in the event to be collected as a sample.

A visit was made to the retailer where the toy was purchased. The retailer was closing out the item and had only two units left. They were collected as sample 97-860-5623.

PRE-ACCIDENT:

The victim and two other children were playing with some donated toys in a church basement. It was the youth room. A boy played with this flying toy by launching it successfully about five times, without a problem. The user puts the toy figure into the hand held launcher, holds it at arms length, pulls the string ring out to wind up the inner spindle, then pulls the trigger and lets the toy fly free in the air. The warrior toy figure is spinning rapidly. Its arm/wings spread out, and it flies like a helicopter. The way a person holds the launcher in relation to the horizon gives it its initial direction. But then the flying toy can strike a wall, person, or other object, and change direction, and still have enough energy to keep in the air.

ACCIDENT:

To use this toy, the boy put the toy figure in the top of the base. He held the base in his left hand and pulled the ring with the cord with his right hand. He then pulled back on the trigger, while holding the entire toy at arms length away from him, just below eye level.

The next time the boy launched this flying figure, it quickly came toward him instead of away from him. One of the arms of the flying warrior toy struck the 14-year-old boy in the face. His left eye was injured.

POST-ACCIDENT:

The boy felt his face was cut near his eye. He lay on the floor awhile. Then, he went to the bathroom to look in the mirror. His eye was swollen and bruised. He went upstairs, to his parents, who were attending a dinner. They saw his injury and took him to a hospital. He required immediate care. He was hospitalized for five days. Later he had an artificial lens implant. He is still undergoing medical treatment. He still has blurred vision in that eye. He will need laser surgery as a final step in the procedure.

The toy was recovered from the room a few days after the incident. The flying warrior's arms came off during this incident. One arm is intact. The other arm broke into pieces. These pieces were not recovered from the scene.

This toy was sent to a testing laboratory. They found that the tips of the whirling arm/wings reach speeds of 51 MPH, as it spins at 1,740 RPM.

The family hired an attorney. He sent a Freedom of Information request to CPSC. Soon afterward he received a phone call from an attorney from Hedstrom Corp. The Hedstrom attorney asked "Is this another eye injury case?" The family attorney said yes. That was the only time he heard anything from Hedstrom. The family is preparing to file suit against Hedstrom. They asked **NOT to be identified to the company in this report.**

The victim was 14 years old, 5'8" tall, weighed 130 lbs., and is right-handed.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION:

This product was new when it was given to the church charity for use by children. It was not known when it was put in this room. It is a "Sky Warrior" toy made in China for the Tara Corp. Hauppauge, NY. It is a red and gray plastic figure, 7 inches long. The figure's arms extend to form 5-inch-long, wing-like parts that let the toy fly. It has a base with the trigger and spinning mechanism. The words "TARA CORP" are on the side of the base. "Made in China" is embossed on the back of the toy figure.

The toy warrior's left shoulder has an open area where a piece is missing. The left arm/wing is missing. The right arm/wing is intact, but separated from the figure.

Their attorney provided me with a copy of another injury report obtained from CPSC. In this ID#980609CCC3200, a blister card Label states, in part": FLYING WARRIORS Soars over 20 feet. CAUTION :Do not launch at people or animals. Be careful not to pull the launch cord too fast or too hard. Conforms to ASTM F963-95. ***" An eye injury resulted when one of the wings detached just after the toy was launched, and struck the victim in the face. This occurred on 5-10-97.

There are no special standards for this product.

The toy had apparently been donated to the church. It appears to have been manufactured by Tara Toy corporation and resembles the recently recalled "Sky Dancer".

Like the Skydancer, it had various parts that spun into the air. One of those parts spun into my son's eye, causing him to be taken immediately to the emergency room and ultimately, to have an artificial lens implant placed in his eye. The full extent of the damage is still not known.

Because the toy did not belong to us, I do not know where it was purchased or the brand name of the product. I have attached copies of pictures that we have of the toy, unfortunately this is all of the information that we have at this time.



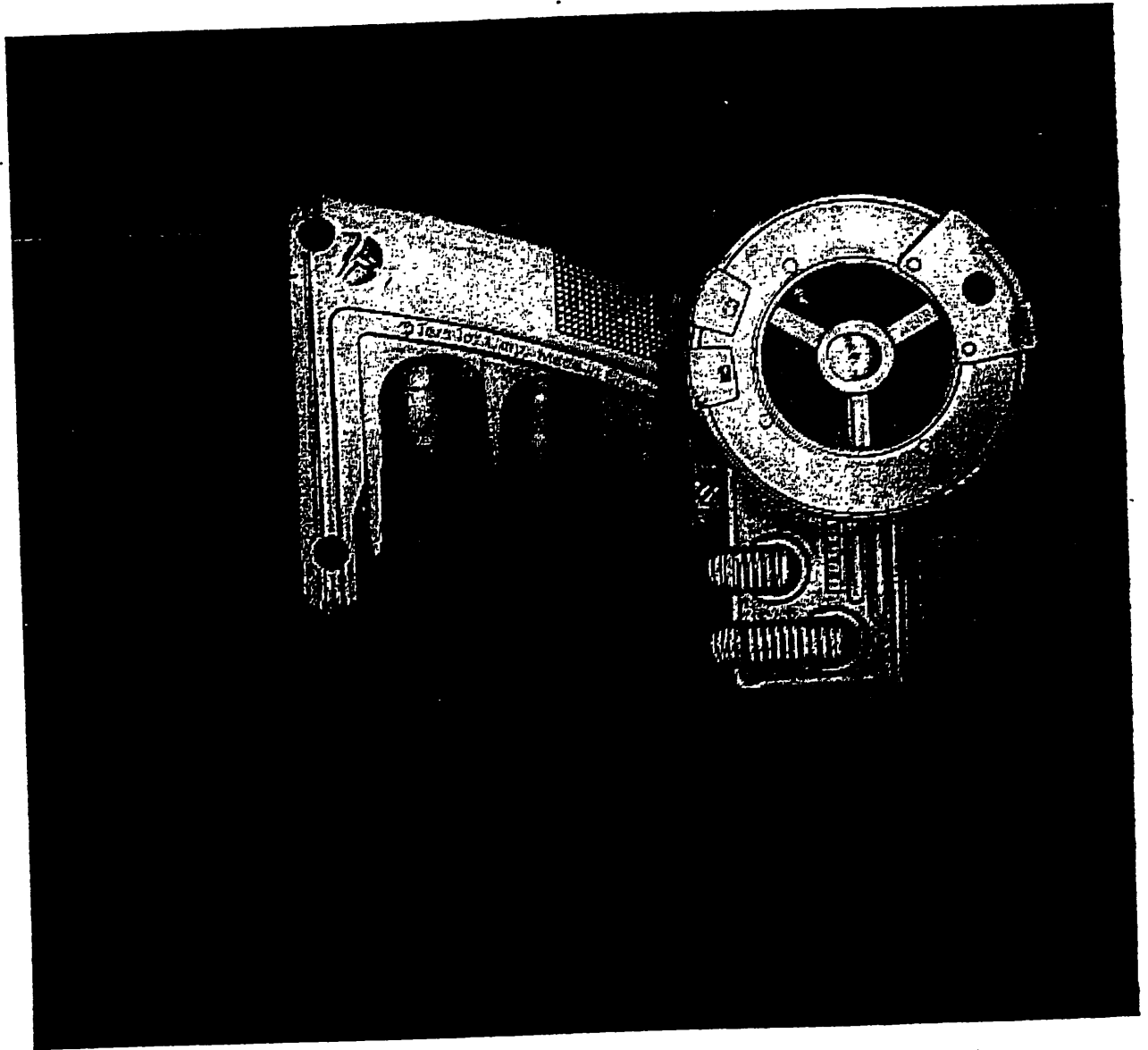

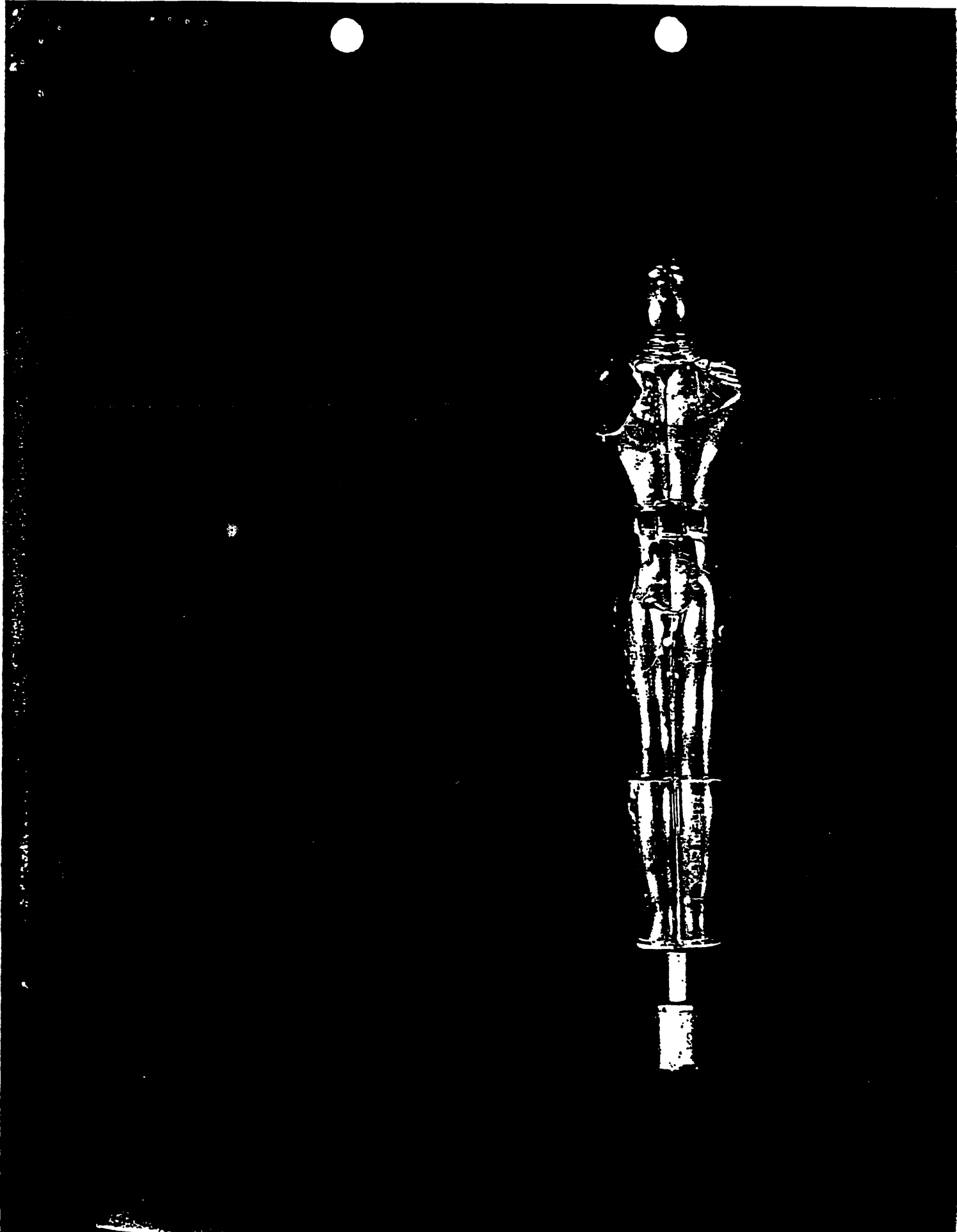
