


Incident Description: Our 8 year old son was playing with a toy he had received for Christmas when a piece of the toy flew off and struck him in the mouth breaking off his two front teeth at the roots. The toy is called "Flying Warriors" and is made of plastic. It consists of a plastic launcher and a plastic figure that is mounted on top of the launcher. The figure has two arms/wings that hang down at the figure's sides until it is launched. Then the wings spread as the figure is launched into the air. The figure then glides back down to the ground. While playing with the toy it apparently became cracked where the two halves of the figure are glued together. This caused one of the arm/wings to pull out of its socket after it was launched and strike our son in the mouth. Our son is seeing a dentist to have his front teeth reconstructed. Any info or help in this matter would be greatly appreciated. Thank you. Eric and Barbara

PRE-ACCIDENT:

The victim and two other children were playing with some donated toys in a church basement. It was the youth room. A boy played with this flying toy by launching it successfully about five times, without a problem. The user puts the toy figure into the hand held launcher, holds it at arms length, pulls the string ring out to wind up the inner spindle,then pulls the trigger and lets the toy fly free in the air. The warrior toy figure is spinning rapidly. Its arm/wings spread out, and it flies like a helicopter. The way a person holds the launcher in relation to the horizon gives it its initial direction. But then the flying toy can strike a wall, person, or other object, and change direction, and still have enough energy to keep in the air.

ACCIDENT:

To use this toy, the boy put the toy figure in the top of the base. He held the base in his left hand and pulled the ring with the cord with his right hand. He then pulled back on the trigger, while holding the entire toy at arms length away from him, just below eye level.

The next time the boy launched this flying figure, it quickly came toward him instead of away from him. One of the arms of the flying warrior toy struck the 14-year-old boy in the face. His left eye was injured.

POST-ACCIDENT:

The boy felt his face was cut near his eye. He lay on the floor awhile. Then, he went to the bathroom to look in the mirror. His eye was swollen and bruised. He went upstairs, to his parents, who were attending a dinner. They saw his injury and took him to a hospital. He required immediate care. He was hospitalized for five days. Later he had an artificial lens implant. He is still undergoing medical treatment. He still has blurred vision in that eye. He will need laser surgery as a final step in the procedure.

The toy was recovered from the room a few days after the incident. The flying warrior's arms came off during this incident. One arm is intact. The other arm broke into pieces. These pieces were not recovered from the scene.

This toy was sent to a testing laboratory. They found that the tips of the whirling arm/wings reach speeds of 51 MPH, as it spins at 1,740 RPM.

The family hired an attorney. He sent a Freedom of Information request to CPSC. Soon afterward he received a phone call from an attorney from Hedstrom Corp. The Hedstrom attorney asked "Is this another eye injury case?" The family attorney said yes. That was the only time he heard anything from Hedstrom. The family is preparing to file suit against Hedstrom. They asked NOT to be identified to the company in this report.

The victim was 14 years old, 5'8" tall, weighed 130 lbs., and is right-handed.

PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION:

This product was new when it was given to the church charity for use by children. It was not known when it was put in this room. It is a "Sky Warrior" toy made in China for the Tara Corp. Hauppage, NY. It is a red and gray plastic figure, 7 inches long. The figure's arms extend to form 5-inch-long, wing-like parts that let the toy fly. It has a base with the trigger and spinning mechanism. The words"TARA CORP" are on the side of the base. "Made in China" is embossed on the back of the toy figure.

The toy warrior's left shoulder has an open area where a piece is missing. The left arm/wing is missing. The right arm/wing is intact, but separated from the figure.

Their attorney provided me with a copy of another injury report obtained from CPSC. In this IDI #980609CCC3200, a blister card

Label states, in part": FLYING WARRIORS Soars over 20 feet. CAUTION: Do not launch at people or animals. Be careful not to pull the launch cord too fast or too hard. Conforms to ASTM F963-95. ***." An eye injury resulted when one of the wings detached just after the toy was launched, and struck the victim in the face. This occurred on 5-10-97.

STANDARDS:

There are no special standards for this product.

Description: The Fly Warrior toy is designed to be launched by the child at approximately eye level. A failure or seperation of the wings can direct parts, at a speed of 51mph, directly at the child's facial area. Gun/Launcher: Launcher is intact and in good condition. Missle is propelled with air generated by squeezing trigger. Missle is missing. Fly Warrior is launched by placing it in the recepticle in the top of the launcher and pulling the 14" string which spins the internal gear, thereby spinning the Fly Warrior, extending its wings(arms) and flying in similar action to that of a helicoptor. The Fly Warrior spins 14.5 revolutions per pull of the 14.5" string which requires about .5 seconds. This results in the figure spinning at approximately 1,740 rpm with a wing tip speed of 51mph! 



I am writing to register a complaint about a toy that recently injured my fourteen year old son, Matthew Lukasick. My son was injured by this toy while playing with friends in a church basement. The toy had apparently been donated to the church. It appears to have been manufactured by Tara Toy corporation and resembles the recently recalled "Sky Dancer".

resembles the recently recalled "Sky Dancer".

Like the Skydancer, it had various parts that spun into the air. One of those parts spun into my son's eye, causing him to be taken immediately to the emergency room and ultimately, to have an artificial lens implant placed in his eye. The full extent of the damage is still not known.

Because the toy did not belong to us, I do not know where it was purchased or the brand name of the product: I have attached copies of pictures that we have of the toy, unfortunately this is all of the information that we have at this time.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has received information concerning incidents of serious eye injuries to children and adults who were using flying toy doll figures. Enclosed are two incidents reported to CPSC that involved a Flying Warrior doll imported from China by Tara Toy Corporation. Also enclosed is the press release issued jointly by CPSC and Placo for the recall of Placo Star Wonders dolls because of several serious eye injuries.

Enclosed for your information are the Consumer Product Safety Act and the Commission's regulation, "Substantial Product Hazard Reports," 16 C.F.R. Part 1115. These documents explain the Commission's authority and policy regarding products that may present substantial product hazards and also explain the firm's rights and obligations under the Act.

One of the responsibilities of the Compliance staff is to determine preliminarily whether a defect is present in a product and, if so, whether that defect rises to the level of a substantial product hazard as defined by section 15(a) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (CPSA), 15 U.S.C. § 2064(a).

Information Requested

For the staff to assess accurately the potential safety hazard, if any, associated with the subject product, it needs certain information from the manufacturer or importer. While the staff recognizes that your firm is not filing a report pursuant to Section 15(b) regarding a possible defect with this product, the type of information requested for a full report is generally the information needed by the staff. Please follow 16 C.F.R. § 1115.13(d) (1-14) and provide the specified information, to the extent applicable to the product and problem described above. In your response, please reference each question number (1-14).

In addition to providing the information requested above, please also submit the following information:

Regarding question 6, include copies of all consumer or dealer complaints, warranty claims, and reports of injury related to the product being investigated. Include copies of all court complaints and related documents for lawsuits involving the product and the resolution of those lawsuits.

If copies of consumer complaints and other documents requested above are unavailable, indicate the reason they are unavailable and provide a summary containing the names, addresses and telephone numbers of the consumers or of the plaintiffs' attorneys.

- 15(b) Copies of all test reports, analyses, evaluations, and premarket tests related to the subject product and problem.
- 15(c) Copies of all engineering drawings, engineering change notices and material specifications related to the subject problem.
- 15(d) Please provide UPC codes for all models involved.
- 15(e) Provide eight (8) samples of each model involved, including the retail packaging and all instructions. If the product has been redesigned since the production of the product described in

paragraph 1, please also provide a sample incorporating the new design.

Information Disclosure

Section 6(b)(5) of the CPSA, 15 U.S.C. § 2055(b)(5), prohibits the release of information submitted under section 15(b) of the CPSA unless a remedial action plan has been accepted in writing, a complaint has been issued, or a firm consents to such release.

If the firm submits any information that it considers to be a trade secret, or confidential commercial or financial information, it must mark it "confidential" in accordance with section 6(a)(3) of the CPSA, as amended, 15 U.S.C. § 2055(a)(3). The Commission may not disclose to the public trade secret information or proprietary commercial or financial data. If the firm does not request confidential treatment at the time of its submission, or within ten days thereafter, the staff will assume that it does not consider information in the submission to be a trade secret or otherwise exempt from disclosure under section 6(a) of the CPSA and the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4).

Thank you very much for allowing me to see David this morning. He is a very pleasant 15-year-old boy who was hit with a flying toy in his left eye in May 10, 1997. David complains of decreased vision and pain in the left eye since that time.

PAST OCULAR HISTORY:

Unremarkable.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY:

Unremarkable.

PAST SURGICAL HISTORY:

None.

MEDICATIONS:

Pred Forte 1% left eye Q one hourly

and Ocufen left eye QID.

ALLERGIES:

Patient denies any drug allergies.

PERSONAL HISTORY:

Unremarkable.

On evaluation vision in right eye is best corrected for distance is 20/20. Vision left eye is hand motion.

External examination shows mild chemosis in the left eye. Motility examination shows full range of ductions and versions. Pupils are 8 mm, pharmacologically cyclopeged at the time of examination.

SLIT LAMP EXAMINATION:

Slit lamp examination of the right eye is unremarkable.

Slit lamp examination left eye shows mild conjunctival injection. Cornea is clear. Anterior chamber shows fiber and a small hyphema. Iridodialysis is noted extending from 1:00 to 4:00 hours. Lens appears cataractous. Intraccular pressure is 16 mmHg in the right eye and 9 mmHg in the left eye.
