ACT OF ASSURANCE

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
STATE OF LOUISIANA
PARISH OF ORLEANS

BE IT KNOWN, that on this 3rd
day of the month of February
of the Year of Our Lord, One
Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-
nine,

BEFORE ME, Cyrus C. Guidry, a Notary Public, duly
commissioned and qualified, in and for the Parish of Orleans, State of
Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and under-
signed,

CAME AND APPEARED the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans,
represented herein by William H. Lewis, its Acting Director,
pursuant to and by virtue of the provisions of a resolution adopted by the
said Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans on the 31st day of
January 1969, a duly certified copy of such resolution being annexed
hereto and made a part hereof, paraphed "Ne Varietur" of this date by me,
Notary, to identify same herewith, who declared that, in accordance with the
said resolution and pursuant thereto, he, the said Acting Director of the Port
of the Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans, has assured and does
hereby assure the Secretary of the Army of the United States that the said
Board of Commissioners of the Port of New Orleans is authorized and empowered
to comply with all the required conditions of local cooperation for the
Mississippi River-Gulf Outlet, Michoud Canal, Louisiana Project, Orleans Par-
ish, Louisiana, and that it will participate in said project to the extent
that it will:

- a. Provide without cost to the United States all lands, easements,
and rights-of-way required for construction and subsequent maintenance
of the project and for aids to navigation upon the request of the Chief
of Engineers, including suitable areas determined by the Chief of
Engineers, to be required in the general public interest for initial
and subsequent disposal of spoil, and also retaining dikes for
disposal of spoil from maintenance dredging, if required;

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b. Accomplish without cost to the United States such utility or other relocations or alterations as necessary for project purposes;

c. Hold and save the United States free from damages due to the construction and subsequent maintenance of the project, including any erosion beyond the rights-of-way furnished; and

d. Provide, maintain, and operate without cost to the United States adequate public wharf facilities on the Michoud Canal open to all on equal terms.

THUS DONE AND PASSED in my office at New Orleans, Louisiana, on the day and date hereinabove set forth, in the presence of Barbara H. St. Hilaire and Catherine Stevenhagen, competent witnesses, who hereunto sign their names, together with appearer and me, said Notary, after due reading of the whole.
