During World War II, the Mill was used to make fabric for army uniforms. Until Saturday's fire, the Mill housed the dreams and aspirations of some of Massachusetts' most creative entrepreneurs. Now, these small business owners find their world turned upside-down, and every step needs to be taken to ensure that they receive the help they need to get back on their feet.

We are appreciative of the efforts made by Governor Patrick to certify this tragedy as a physical disaster for the purposes of authorizing federally-administered low interest disaster loans to the victims of the fire. We encourage you to do everything in your power to provide low interest loans through SBA's disaster assistance program, and to do so as quickly as possible. The victims of the Bernat Mill Complex fire deserve nothing less than a swift and effective response from the federal agency responsible for providing disaster assistance to small business owners. We pledge you our support in doing whatever it will take to ensure that the businesses destroyed Saturday morning are given every opportunity to rebuild and thrive.
