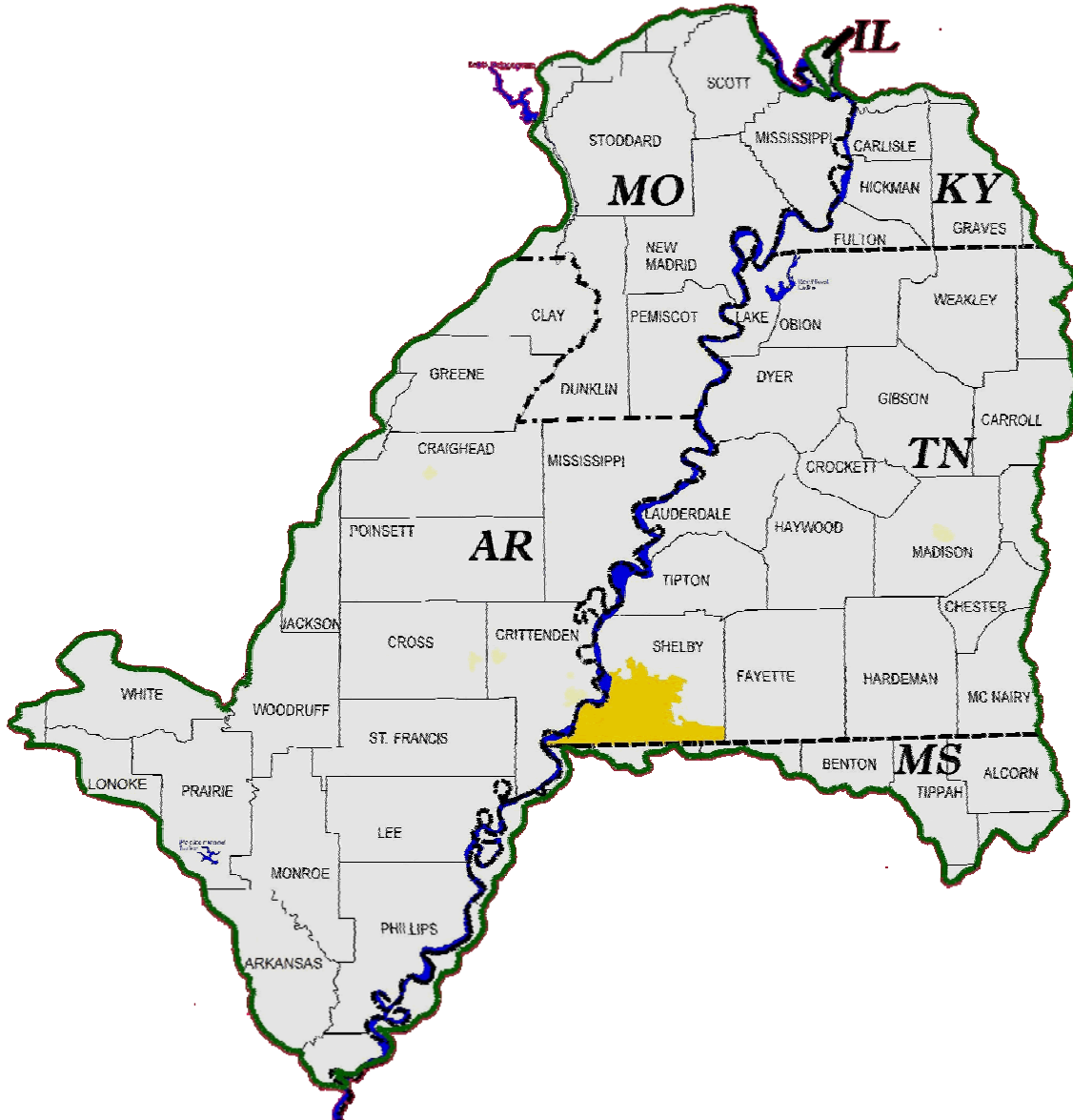

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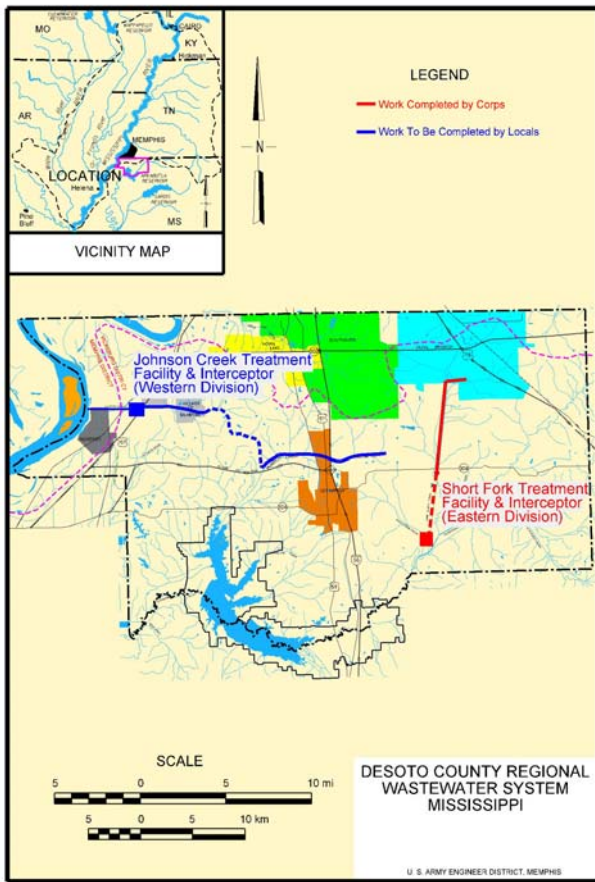
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## Short Fork Wastewater Treatment Plant

**Project Name:** DeSoto County, Mississippi

**Authority:** Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) of 1992, Sec. 219, (authorized the Secretary to provide assistance to non-Federal interests for water-related environmental infrastructure); WRDA 1999, Sec. 502 (amended WRDA 1992 to include \$10,000,000 for DeSoto County, MS); Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2001, Sec. 108 (increased DeSoto County authorization to \$20,000,000); Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War on Terror, and Tsunami, 2005, Sec. 6006 (increased DeSoto County authorization to \$55,000,000 and allows for reimbursement and/or credits to sponsor for costs incurred in excess of required contributions); Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act of 2006, Sec. 123 (allows for Federal share of all remaining work to be in form of grants or reimbursements); Section 501, To amend the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users to make technical corrections, and for other purposes (Public Law 110-244) increased Authorization to \$75,000,000.

**Location and Description:** DeSoto County is located in north Mississippi, just south of Memphis, TN. The county's rapid growth demands expansion of existing sewer systems and the development of new systems into one unified countywide system. DeSoto County Regional Utility Authority (DCRUA) is the local sponsor.

**Status:** The Short Fork Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Camp Creek Interceptor line was completed in 2006 under the supervision of the Memphis District at an approximate total cost of \$42 million. These items are now operated and maintained by the local sponsor. The local sponsor will have primary responsibility for design and construction of future items of work with the Memphis District providing general oversight. Federal assistance will be made available to the local sponsor in the form of reimbursements. The award of the first contract by the local sponsor under the reimbursement agreement occurred in June 2008. This was a \$2,600,000 contract for site preparation work at the proposed Johnson Creek Wastewater Treatment Facility to be located near Walls, MS. The current estimated cost for the countywide system is \$135,000,000 of which \$75,000,000 will be a Federal cost and \$60,000,000 will be the responsibility of the project sponsor. To date, \$50,140,000 has been appropriated for this project.

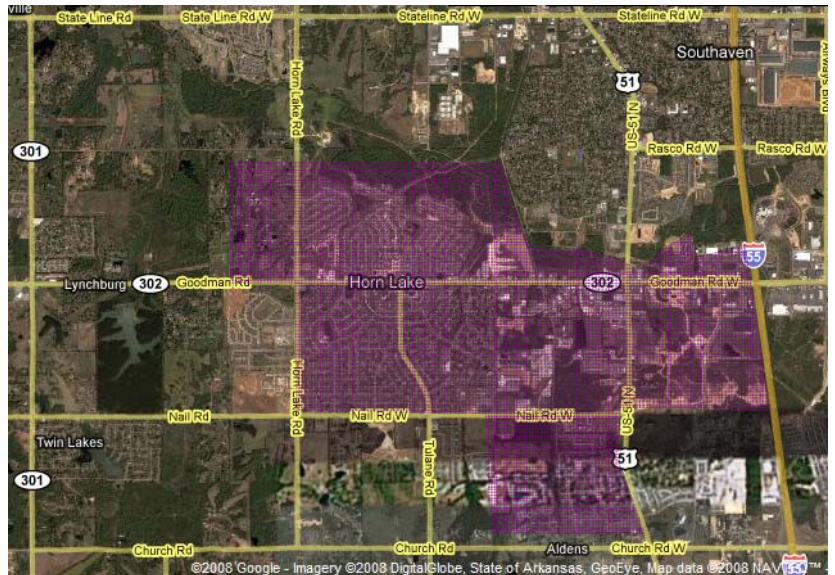
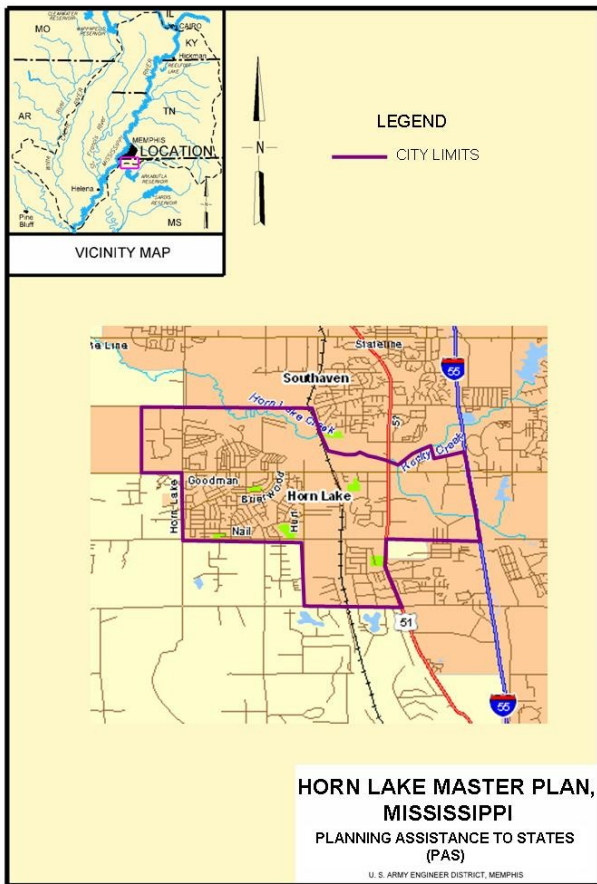

**Study Name:** Horn Lake Master Plan, Mississippi

**Authority:** WRDA 1974, Sec. 22

**Location and Description:** This study is a joint venture with the City of Horn Lake, which is located in northwest DeSoto County, Mississippi. The study consists of development of a master plan for the City's water and sanitary sewer systems. It will focus on infrastructure development for the water and sanitary sewer systems needed to help sustain and facilitate the increasing growth of the city. The City of Horn Lake is the non-Federal sponsor.

**Status:** Funds received in FY 2007 of \$67,000 were used to initiate the master plan study for the City of Horn Lake. The study will consist of addressing the city's water and sanitary sewer needs. FY 2008 funds of \$233,000 will be used to complete the Planning Assistance to States Study. The non-Federal sponsor has indicated financial capacity and their willingness to sign a Planning Assistance to States Agreement.

**Project cost:** The estimated cost of the study is \$600,000 of which \$300,000 is Federal cost and \$300,000 is the responsibility of the non-Federal sponsor.
