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ACTIVITY: THEORY OF CHANGE LOGIC MODEL

Suggestions for presenters:

- 1. Divide the participants into small groups, with five to seven members each. If possible, divide the group by State or partnership teams. Have each group choose someone to report back to the larger group.
- 2. Distribute the Five Steps to Creating a Theory of Change Logic Model and Tips for Using the Five Steps Tool and Logic Model Diagram handouts.
- 3. Ask each group to consider steps 1 and 2 and discuss:
 - What is the partnership's long-term goal/outcome (5 years...)?
 - What is the partnership's Theory of Change (TOC)?
 - Can they articulate their partnership's TOC?
 - Does the TOC align with the partnership's goals and services?
- 4. Wrap up the exercise by asking the reporter from each group to summarize the group's "take-away" ideas.
