

### STRI signs cooperation agreement with IATTC

STRI deputy director Cristián Samper and Vernon P. Scholey, technical representative of the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (IATTC), signed an agreement of scientific collaboration on November X. IATTC, an International Fisheries Commission headquartered in La Jolla, California, has a laboratory in Achotines, Los Santos province, that promotes research and education in tropical biodiversity. Through this agreement, STRI staff, researchers and affiliated students are granted the right to use the IATTC's Achotines Laboratory research facilities. On the other hand, STRI agrees to promote the use of the Field Station by qualified researchers and include the IATTC Laboratory in the STRI general brochure and a link on STRI website. ### STRI- Ministry of Foreign Relations Agreement
