Correa elected president for Herbaria network

STRI staff scientist Mireya Correa (also with the University of Panama), was elected president of the Mesoamerican and Caribbean Herbaria Network for the period of 2002-2004, during the 8th Latin American Congress of Botany, held from October 13-18, in Cartagena, Colombia. Previously, Correa served as president of the network from 1996-2000. STRI research assistant María Staff working with Correa, was elected treasurer of the network. Also at the Congress, Nayda Flores, former student of staff scientist Noris Salazar-Allen and with the ICBG project, received the first prize for the best poster session in Bryology , that features her bachelor's thesis research on mosses communities at Cerro Hoya National Park.

Mireya Correa, científica de STRI y profesora en la Universidad de Panamá fue elegida presidenta de la Red de Herbarios de Mesoamérica y el Caribe para el período de 2002-2004, durante el 8vo. Congreso Latinoamericano de Botánica, llevado a cabo del 13 al 18 de octubre, en Cartagena, Colombia. Anteriormente, Correa había servido como presidenta de esta red para el período de 1996-2000. La asistente de investigación de STRI, María Staff, quien trabaja con Correa, fue elegida tesorera de la Red. También, durante el Congreso, la botánica Nayda Flores, antigua alumna de la científica Noris Salazar-Allen, y actualmente con el Proyecto ICBG de STRI, ganó el primer lugar por el mejor cartel en la sección de Briología, que describe su trabajo de investigación para tesis de licenciatura, sobre Comunidades de Musgos Corticícolas del Parque Nacional Cerro Hoya.

Series of talks on STRI research

In collaboration with SI National Zoological Park (NZP) and STRI, the Science Outreach Programs in Tropical Biology at NZP initiated a series of lectures about STRI's tropical biology research and researchers. The first lecture, in March 2002, was given by Elizabeth Royte, author of *The tapir's morning bath*, a book about BCI researchers. Staff scientist Stanley Heckadon-Moreno inaugurated the fall season of talks with the presentation "The Chagres: Panama's River of Interoceanic Communication". He also participated in the Zoo's informal science program for youth at Columbia Heights in Mt. Pleasant, where he gave a talk to Latino children on the mangroves of the Galeta Marine Laboratory. In addition, Heckadon was invited to participate in the NMNH's Baird Film and Lecture Series and to present a final report to the SI Women's Committee on projects at Galeta that have received financial support from the Committee. Other speakers will include scientists Richard Cooke, Bill Laurance, and Jacqueline Giacalone.

También participó en el programa informal del Zoológico para jóvenes en la Secundaria de Columbia, en Mt. Pleasant, donde ofreció una charla a niños latinos sobre los manglares del Laboratorio Marino de Galeta. Además, Heckadon fue invitado a participar en la serie de charlas y películas Baird de Museo Nacional de Historia Natural de SI, y a presentar un reporte final al Comité de Mujeres del Smithsonian, sobre proyectos en Galeta que han recibido apoyo financiero del Comité. Otros conferencistas incluirán a los científicos Richard Cooke, Bill Laurance, y Jacqueline Giacalone, que tratará sobre el proyecto de ocelotes en BCI.

Marine Ecology Course by STRI and OTS

STRI and OTS will offer a joint five-week course from June 16 to July 18, 2003, on *Tropical Marine Ecology*, designed to provide opportunities for in-depth study of tropical marine ecosystems. The course is ideally suited to students pursuing graduate studies in marine ecology in the tropics

and will be led by two full time scientists with assistance from at least ten guest scientists who will join the course for periods ranging from one day to two weeks. Applicants must be enrolled in, or accepted for, a graduate degree program. The course is taught in English and will be conducted largely at STRI's Marine Field Station in Bocas del Toro, Panama. This venue offers a well-equipped field station set within an extensive pristine environment, providing unique and convenient access to diverse coastal ecosystems. In addition, the course includes a 5-day field trip to mangrove and coral reef ecosystems on Panama's Pacific coast. The coordinators of the course are STRI staff scientist Penelope Barnes, and Candy Feller, with the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center (SERC), in Washington DC.
