Parents, are you tired of being home alone while your kids are at school? Well, we have an offer for you! The cafeterias at the Quantico schools have immediate openings for cooks and bakers, as well as food service workers and on call personnel.

The hours are perfect-from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM with a half Hour break and free lunch. There is no weekend and no holiday work, but you receive holiday pay.

One advantage of working in school is that you leave home after your children, and you return home before they do. When your children are out of school, so are you.

The starting salary for cooks and bakers is \$11.53 an hour. The starting salary for food service workers and on call workers is \$8.30 an hour.

HEALTHY CHOICE OF THE MONTH AT RUSSELL

"Choose the Right Portion Size"

This month at Russell we are focusing on helping children choose the right portion size and read labels. Take some time to look at the serving size on food package labels and compare to what you had planned to serve your family. Use common objects to help keep serving sizes consistent:

- 1 cup spaghetti with sauce = size of a baseball = 2 servings (6 servings/day of grains recommended)
- 1 cup mashed potatoes = size of a fist = 1 serving (2-3 servings/day of vegetables recommended)
- 1 small cooked skinless/boneless chicken breast = size of a deck of cards = 3 servings (5 servings/day of meat recommended)
- 1 apple, pear or orange = size of a tennis ball = 1 serving (2 servings/day of fruits recommended)
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ oz cheese = size of 6 dice = 1 serving (3 servings/day of dairy recommended)

1 cup dry cereal = size of a large handful = 1 serving (6 servings/day of grains recommended)

Remember to adjust the servings to slightly smaller for inactive children and slightly more for VERY active children. Try to balance your meals and eat all of the recommended servings of each food group each day.

- Make school a priority.
