By 66 yeas to 12 nays (Vote No. 1), three-fifths of those Senators duly chosen and sworn, having voted in the affirmative, Senate agreed to the motion to close further debate on the motion to proceed to consideration of the bill. **Page S271**

A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing for further consideration of the motion to proceed to consideration of the bill at approximately 3 p.m., on Monday, January 12, 2009, and that any time during any adjournment or period of morning business count post-cloture. **Page S273**
