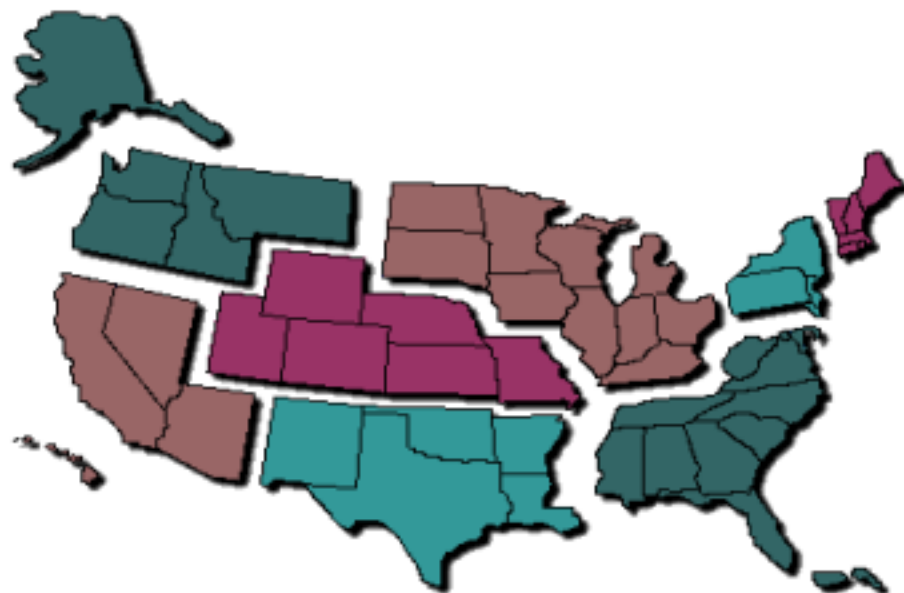

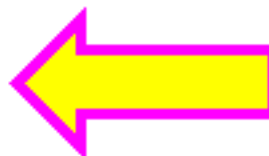

[Website Usability: Making Content Easy to Find](#)

About this Pilot Project



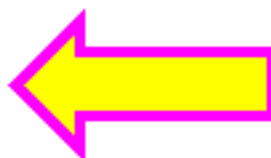

The National Library of Medicine and the Public Health Foundation staff have worked together to develop pre-formulated search strategies for selected [Healthy People 2010](#) focus areas.

These one-click strategies search [PubMed](#), a database of the National Library of Medicine that provides access to over 11 million citations from MEDLINE and additional life science journals. PubMed includes links to many sites providing full text articles and other related resources.
