SEVP and SEVIS

The Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) manages the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). SEVP is a program under the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency within Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

SEVIS came online in 2003 to track and monitor the status and activities of nonimmigrant students and exchange visitors (EVs) who enter the United States. This web-based system collects real-time information on nonimmigrant students, Evs, approved schools, and program sponsors. This information is available to a variety of stakeholders. SEVIS also retains information on Exchange Visitor Program sponsors and visitors that are approved by the Department of State (DoS). This quarterly review is based on information retrieved on April 3, 2007. As SEVIS is a real-time data base, exact numbers within this review were accurate as of the date retrieved. The SEVIS “General Data Quarterly Review” is produced to provide a snap-shot of useful information to SEVP management and a variety of SEVIS stakeholders.

This edition of the review represents a sample of information collected from SEVIS data through April 3, 2007.

Since the program’s inception, the total volume of data in SEVIS continues to grow. As of April 3, 2007 there were **951,654** Active non-immigrant students, exchange visitors, and their dependents in SEVIS. Data on greater than **2.5 million** non-immigrant visa-type F, M, J international students and their dependents, schools and EV Programs can be found in SEVIS.

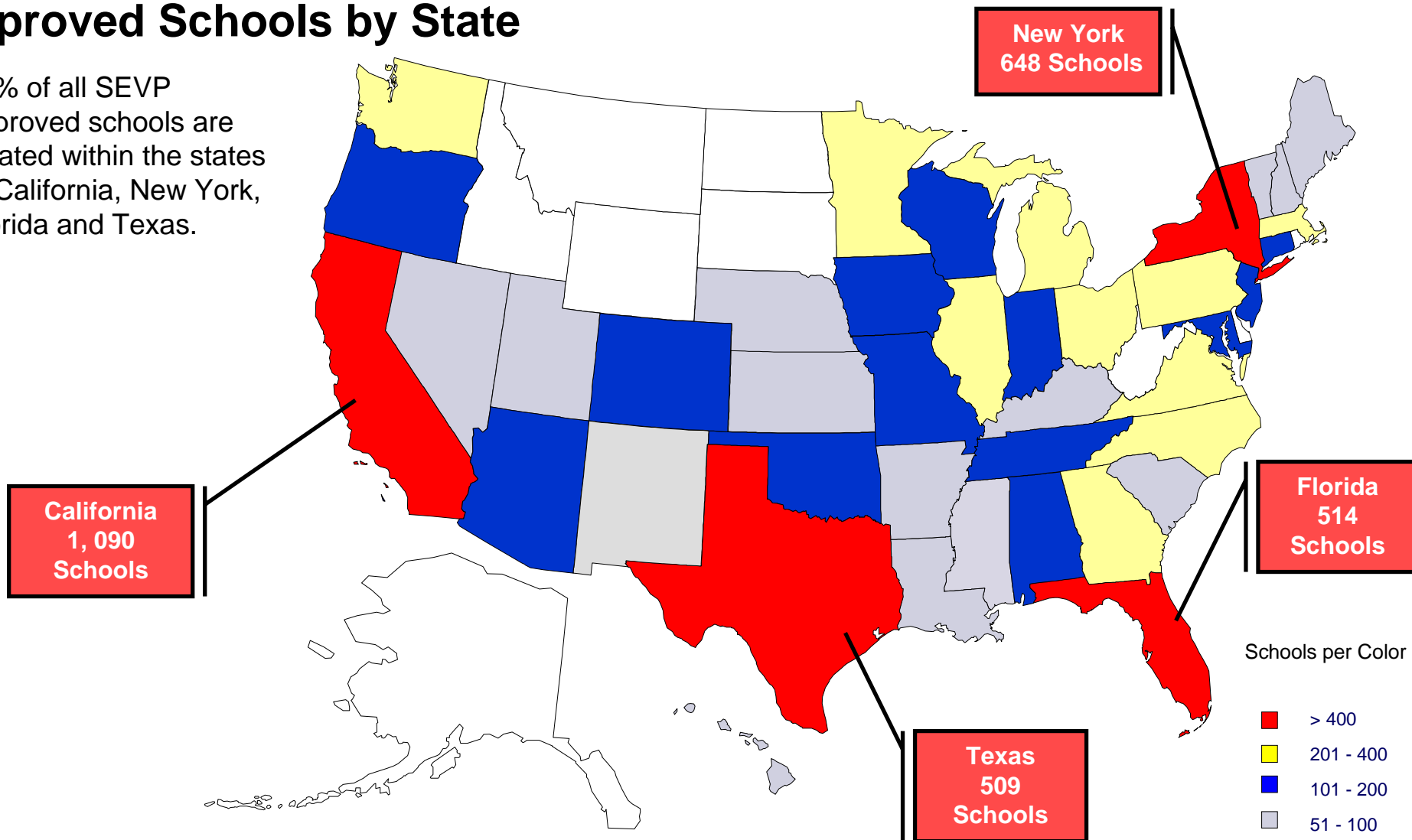

Approved Schools by State

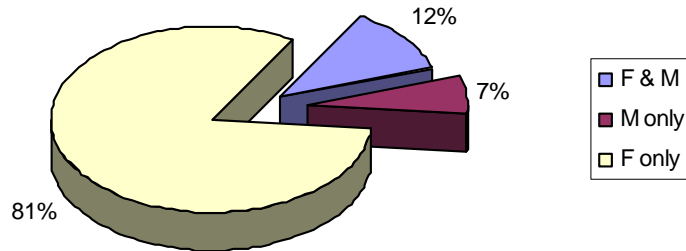
- ▶ 31% of all SEVP approved schools are located within the states of California, New York, Florida and Texas.

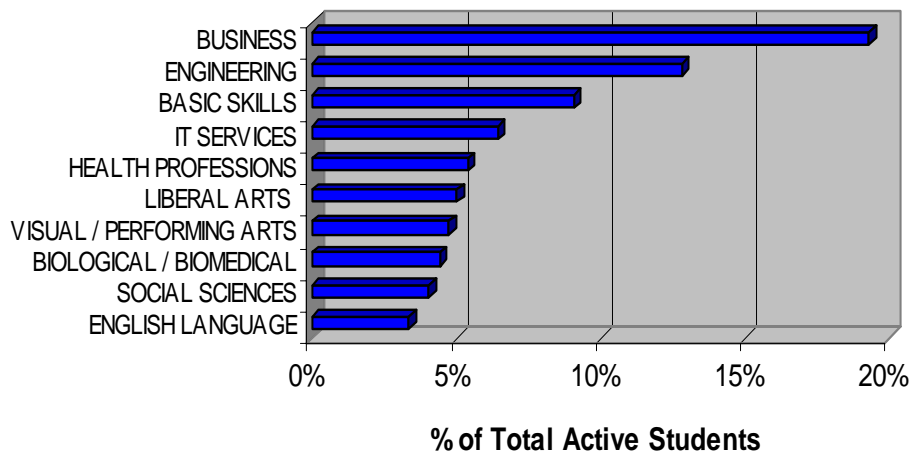

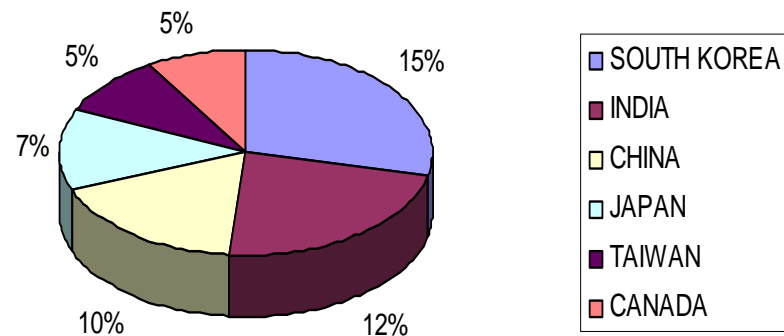
Geographic Region and Major

Top Six "Country of Citizenship" for all Active Students

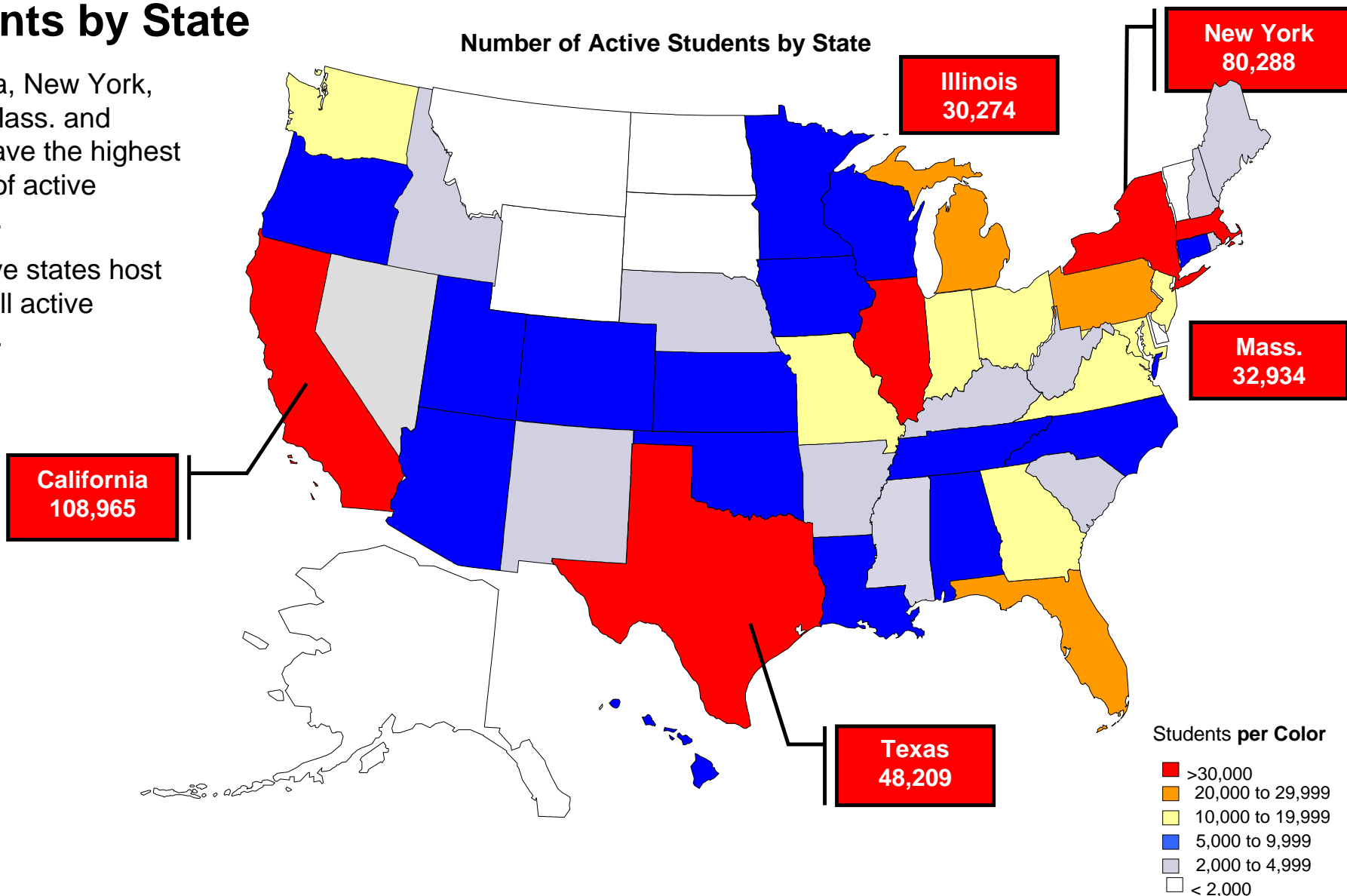


- DHS certified schools may offer multiple curricula but must be approved for each specific curriculum in which they enroll F/M students.
- An approved school may offer several levels of education from pre-school, elementary, high school, to post secondary education level.



Students by State

- ▶ California, New York, Texas, Mass. and Illinois have the highest number of active students.
- ▶ These five states host 46% of all active students.





Level of Education and Course of Study

- ▶ 69% of active students are enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's or Doctoral programs.
