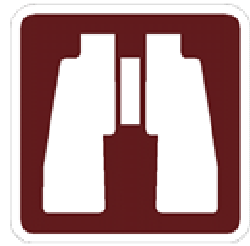

Giant Sequoia National Monument Sequoia National Forest



Giant Sequoia National Monument contains a great abundance and diversity of bird life. The wide range of elevation, from 2,000 feet to over 10,000 feet, creates a variety of habitats including chaparral, oak woodlands, coniferous forests and alpine. Of special interest are the bird species that nest in old growth forests, like California Spotted Owls, Northern Goshawks and Great Gray Owls.

The species list contains 185 bird species known to occur on or near monument and other casual and accidental species. For easy reference the main list is categorized by family.

The potential for sighting various birds may vary within a season, and is dependent upon many factors including species size, color, behavior, habitat preference, and relative abundance. The value assigned to each bird on this list represents the highest value generally occurring within that season.

Seasons

Sp - Spring - March through May
S - Summer - June through August
F - Fall - September through November
W - Winter - December through February

Habitat

H- hardwood forest O- openings or meadows
C- coniferous forest T- above timberline
W- in or near water R- riparian areas
B- brush or scrub D- disturbed sites

Relative Abundance

a - commonly observed, often in abundance, sighting potential good to excellent
c - commonly observed, sighting likelihood good
fc- fairly commonly observed, likelihood of sighting fair
u - uncommonly observed, sighting generally poor to fair
r - rarely observed, possible sightings very poor to poor
