#### A. Executive Summary

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) implements Executive Order 13256 by developing programs designed to significantly increase the participation of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) in VA-sponsored programs. The Department's goal is to create a workforce that reflects the diversity of our Nation and its veterans. HBCUs provide VA facilities an opportunity to promote diversity and access a broader base to recruit qualified, trained professionals to serve our veterans.

## During Fiscal Year (FY) 2004, VA will seek to achieve the following goals and measurable objectives:

- 1. To increase the number of students participating in VA's Student Career Experience Program (SCEP) by encouraging more facilities to establish agreements with local or other HBCUs. Through these agreements, Veterans Health Administration (VHA) plans outreach to increase the potential for young minority professionals to choose VA as their employer.
- 2. To continue to contribute significantly to the education and training of more than 40 different health care professions by providing funding support to medical residents, dental residents, specialized physician and dentist fellows, and students in 27 various health care program areas.
- 3. To increase the number of HBCUs that receive awards for VHA's Research Training Initiative for collaborative research projects between faculty scientists of these institutions and VHA scientists.
- 4. To continue to solicit faculty scientists from HBCUs to serve as members of scientific peer review panels. These HBCU faculty scientists will bring expertise in minority health issues, which will facilitate efforts to address health problems prevalent among minority population groups.

- 5. To continue to make education benefit payments to eligible individuals who are enrolled in approved educational institutions or in programs within Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA).
- 6. To increase the number of HBCU students receiving all or part of their clinical training in VA medical centers (VAMCs).
- 7. To continue the 10-week Summer Internship Program administered by the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education (NAFEO) that will allow HBCU students an opportunity to develop their skills in a modern and innovative health care system.
- 8. To automate VA's Recruitment Bulletin for online access by HBCU students and continue to share hard copies with HBCUs. In addition, VA policies on the Student Loan Repayment and the Federal Career Intern programs will be made available to career counselors to promote Federal job opportunities and to enhance VA's recruitment efforts.

#### During FY 2004, VA plans the following HBCU funding:

VA plans to award \$39,153,957 in Legislative Awards and \$11,044,000 in Discretionary Awards.

#### During FY 2004, VA plans to increase funding for HBCUs as follows:

VA plans to award \$50,197,957 to HBCUs, representing a projected increase of \$2,915,682 above the FY 2003 Plan. The increase can be attributed to an expected increase in the number of eligible students that will be enrolled at HBCUs during FY 2004 under the Montgomery GI Bill (Chapter 30) and an increase in the research and development funding allocation toward the total HBCU program.

Please note that due to the reporting cycle, agency discretionary awards to specific HBCUs cannot be identified at this time. All institutions will be identified and reported in the FY 2003 Annual Federal Report on Executive Agency Actions to Assist HBCUs.

#### D. Planned Funding to HBCUs and Narrative Information

#### **Legislative Awards**

Category 6 – Student Tuition, Assistance, Scholarships, and Other Aid: \$39,081,132 – This category represents educational assistance payments to veterans, dependents, reservists, and service members enrolled in Institutions of Higher Education (IHEs) and HBCUs. These payments help recipients defray tuition costs while enrolled at HBCUs and other IHEs.

Category 7 – Direct Institutional Subsidies: \$72,825 – Reporting fees cover institutions' costs for processing reports and certifications required by law in the administration of VA educational assistance programs.

Total amount of projected legislative awards: \$39,153,957

#### **Discretionary Awards**

Category 1 – Research and Development: \$1,500,000 – During FY 2004, VA's Office of Research and Development (OR&D) will continue to support its Research Training Initiative for HBCUs. This initiative provides financial support through two mechanisms: the Collaborative Research Program and the Research Experience Program.

The OR&D plans to solicit faculty scientists from HBCUs to serve as members of scientific peer review panels. These HBCU faculty scientists will bring expertise in minority health issues, which will facilitate efforts to address health problems prevalent among minority population groups.

Category 3 – Training: \$8,000,000 – The Health Professional Education and Training Program provides direct support for students receiving training in VA. Direct support includes the salary and fringe benefits paid directly to medical residents and associated health trainees. Indirect support is the reported cost by VAMCs of VA staff who are instructors for trainees and other administrative costs associated with the program. The Office of Academic Affairs will continue to encourage expansion of affiliation efforts with HBCUs and continue to publicize the positive long-term professional benefits of VA recruitment possibilities for HBCU students.

Category 5 – Fellowships, Internships, Recruitment, and IPAs: \$44,000 – VA will place HBCU students in VHA, NCA, the Office of Diversity Management and Equal Employment Opportunity, and other VA organizations through the SCEP or in a 10-week Summer Internship Program administered by NAFEO. NCA will conduct job recruitment outreach at North Carolina Central State, Coppin State, Wilberforce University, Bowie State University, and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Category 6 – Student Tuition Assistance, Scholarships, and Other Aid: \$1,500,000 – VA's Health Care Staff Development and Retention Office in New Orleans, Louisiana, plans to develop a media plan to specifically promote VA's SCEP that is consistent with overall recruitment advertising efforts to promote VA as an "Employer of Choice." VA will also increase the number of diversity outreach events to publicize HBCU program opportunities by participating at national events that are targeted to minority students and educational institutions, i.e., the National Alliance of Black School Educators, the Student National Medical Association Conference, Blacks In Government, and NAFEO.

Total amount of projected discretionary awards: \$11,044,000.
