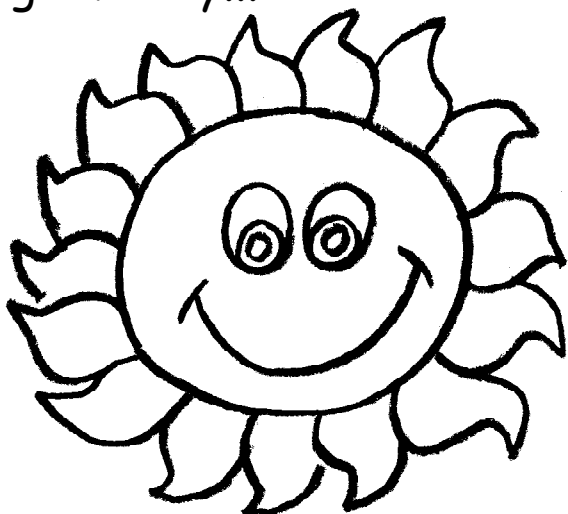

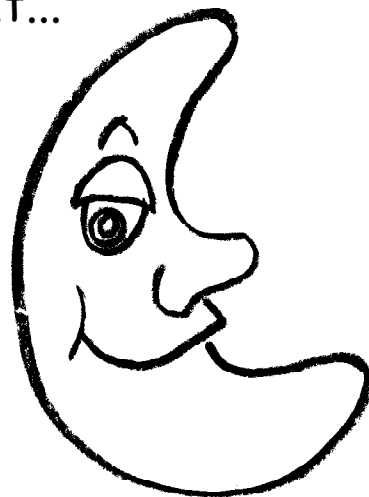
# 9-1-1 is the emergency number.

You should use **9-1-1** when you need **HELP...**

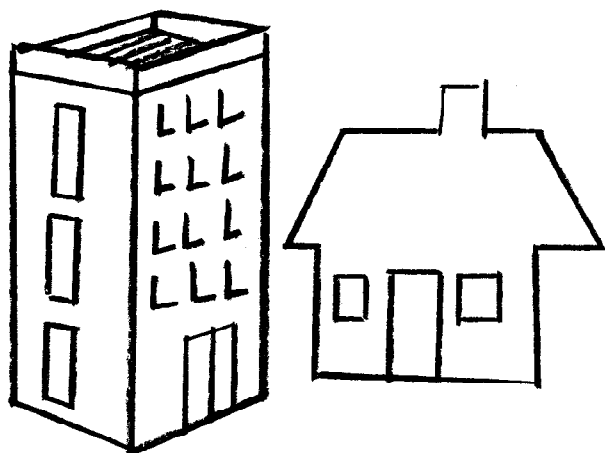
during the day...



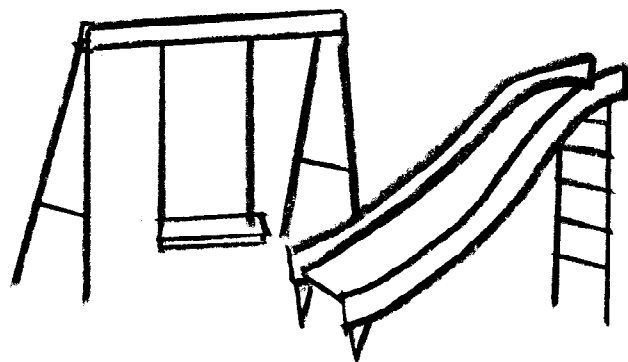

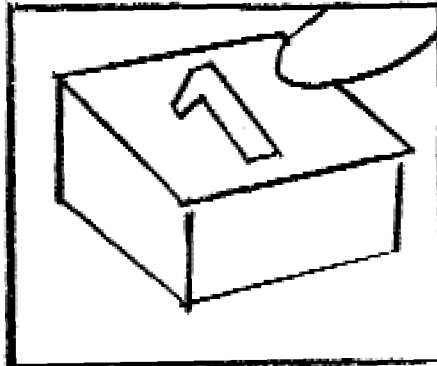
# To Use 9-1-1



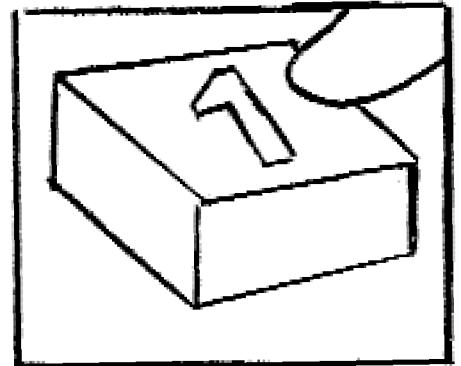
Pick up the phone.



Dial **9**...

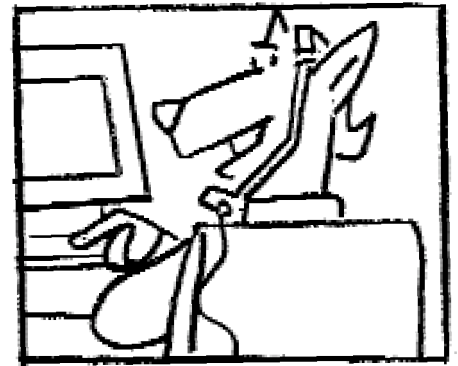


then **1**...



then **1** again.

The 9-1-1 operator will answer.



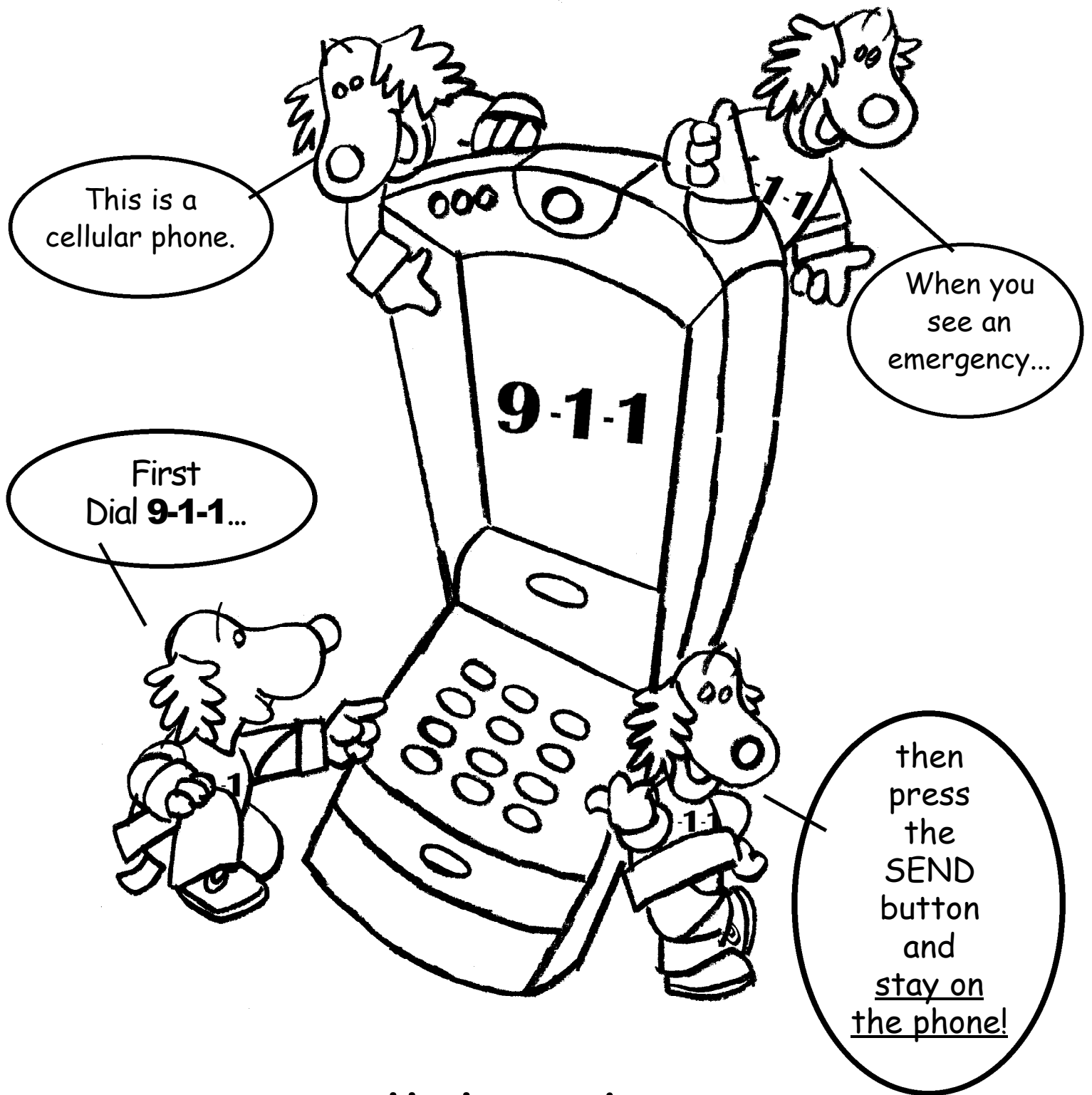
Tell the **9-1-1** operator where you are, what your problem is, and the telephone number you are calling from. **STAY ON THE PHONE.** Answer all of the **9-1-1** operator's questions. If you can, do what the **9-1-1** operator tells you.

When you are not home, you can use **9-1-1** from any **PAY PHONE** to get help or report an emergency.



**YOU DO NOT NEED MONEY!**  
**9-1-1 IS A FREE CALL!**

for help is to use a...



cellular phone.



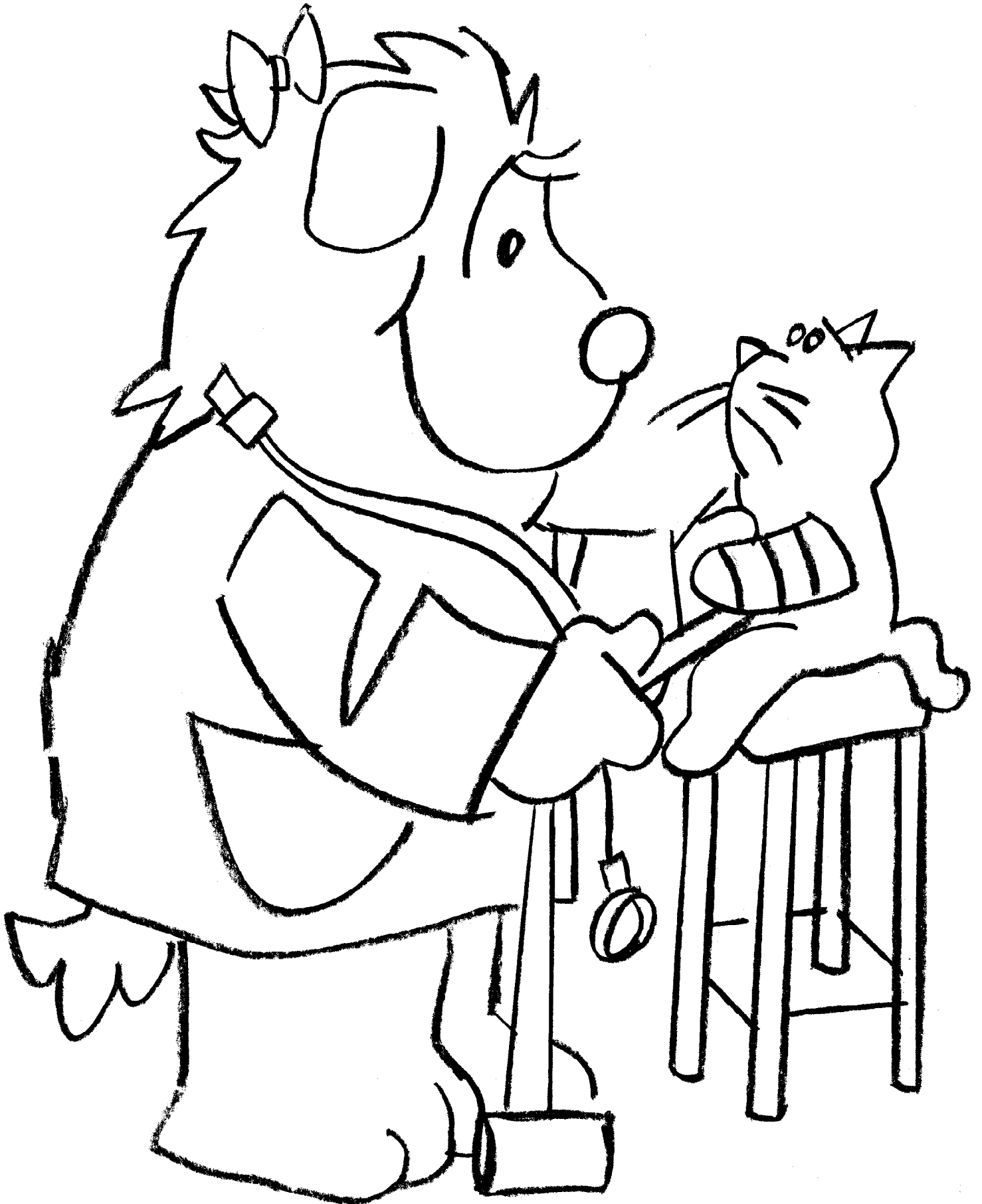

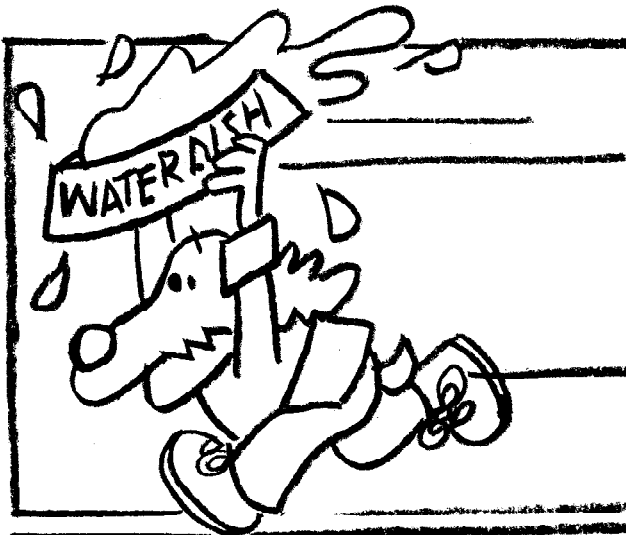

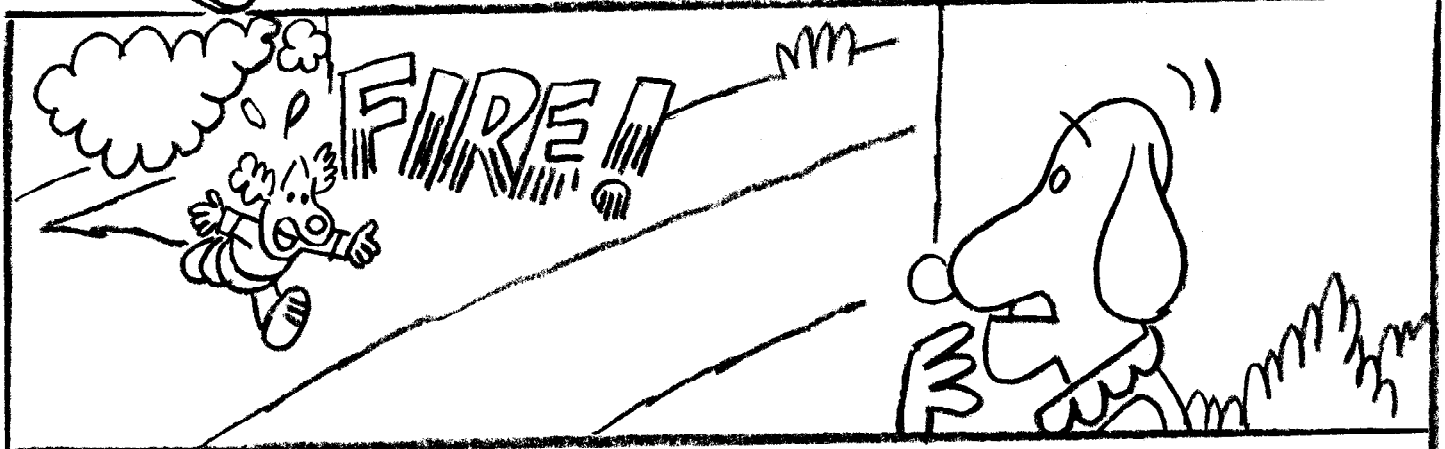
If you smell smoke or see a fire in your home,  
yell "FIRE" and leave the house.

**DO NOT GO BACK IN THE HOUSE!**



Do not attempt to  
put the fire out...

**LEAVE THE HOUSE -  
GO TO A NEIGHBOR.**



Go to a neighbor's house. Tell them there is a fire.  
Ask them to **DIAL 9-1-1**. Remember you can use a pay phone.

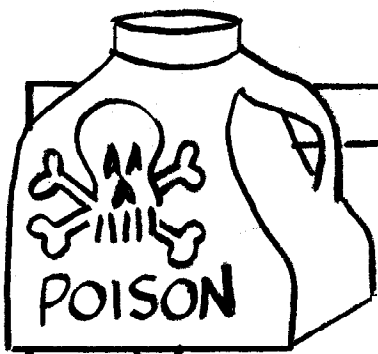

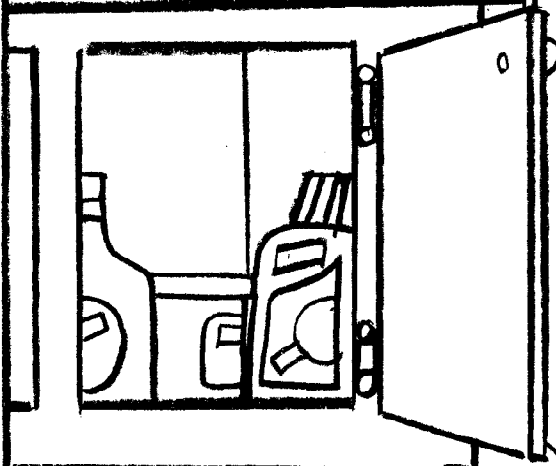


- Answer the **9-1-1** operator's questions and do what the **9-1-1** operator tells you.

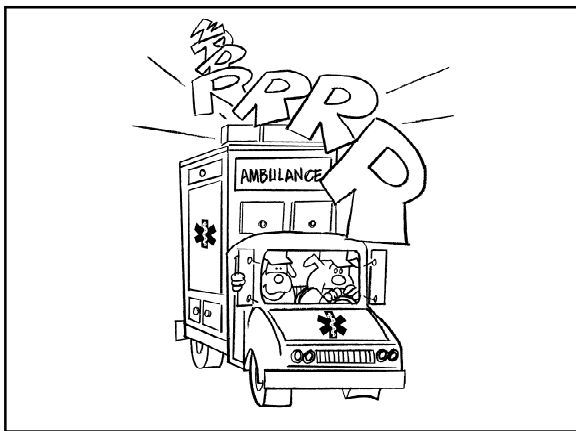


The **9-1-1** operator will tell the police department. The police officers will come to help you.
