Steens Mountain Advisory Council Meeting to be held in Frenchglen

BURNS, Oregon – The next Steens Mountain Advisory Council (SMAC) meeting is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, August 24 and 25 beginning at 8:00 a.m. each day. The meeting will be held at the Frenchglen School, Hwy 205 South, in Frenchglen, Oregon.

On Thursday morning, the SMAC will hear updates from the Chair and Designated Federal Official, receive a field manager's report, hear information on the Steens Mountain Cooperative Management and Protection Area (CMPA) Monitoring Plan and discuss options for reorganization of Burns District resource areas, then tour the Wildland Juniper Management Area (WJMA) for the afternoon.

On Friday, the SMAC will review action items and recap the previous day's tour, then discuss public information needs for the CMPA and purposes of the Steens Mountain Cooperative Management and Protection Act of 2000. The SMAC will set the agenda for the October meeting before adjourning around 2:00 p.m.

The public is welcome to attend all portions of the meeting, but must provide their own transportation to and from the Frenchglen School and on the WJMA tour. Public comment periods are scheduled for 11:00 a.m. each day. Those who verbally address the SMAC during the open session are asked to also provide a written statement of their comments or presentation. Unless otherwise approved by the SMAC Chair, the public comment period will last no longer than 30 minutes, and each speaker may address the SMAC for a maximum of 5 minutes. Time for SMAC members to address speakers will be allotted at the end of each public comment period.
