

**Assistant Professor of Animal Reproductive Biology

The University of California at Davis is pleased to announce recruitment for a tenure-track faculty position in REPRODUCTIVE BIOLOGY. The successful candidate will join the Department of Animal Science in the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences at the rank of Assistant Professor. Criteria for appointment include: a Ph.D. or equivalent, a strong interest in reproductive physiology of livestock, a record of excellence in scholarly research, and demonstrable potential to establish a competitively-funded research program relevant to the reproductive physiology of agriculturally-important species. The appointee will be expected to participate in the graduate and undergraduate teaching programs of the department and college and be actively involved in undergraduate advising, curricular development and department and university service. The appointee is also expected to guide and mentor graduate students and participate in the extensive outreach programs of the department and college.

The Davis campus of the University of California maintains state-of-the-art research facilities and provides ready access to a diverse array of animal species, including livestock and several unique inbred lines of rodent and avian species. The collegial nature of the faculty encourages and supports collaborative interactions that may cross departmental and/or college boundaries. The department resides within an internationally renowned land-grant institution dedicated to supporting California's diverse multi-billion dollar animal industries. The position is a nine-month tenure track appointment, with an eleven-month term appointment offered and continued contingent upon successful personnel review. Residents of Davis enjoy a high quality of life in a University town setting, situated between the Sierra Nevada mountains and the Napa Valley/San Francisco Bay area.
