The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) submits the following study and information requests for the Cooper Lake Hydroelectric Project in response to the initial consultation package submitted by the Chugach Electric Association, Inc.

The Chugach Electric Association Inc. (CEA) filed a Notice of Intent to relicense the Cooper Lake Hydroelectric Project, FERC No. 2170. CEA distributed the Initial Consultation Package (ICP) in June and conducted a joint meeting on the ICP on July 9-10, 2002. We hereby responds to the ICP, in accordance with 18 C.F.R. 385.214.

NMFS is responsible for protecting and managing a variety of marine animals, including Pacific salmon, groundfish, halibut, and marine mammals and their habitats under the Endangered Species Act (ESA)(16 U.S.C. §§ 1531 et seq.), Federal Power Act (18 CFR § 10(j), the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act) (16 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.), Reorganization Plan Number 4 of 1970, and other laws.
