Thank you for your letter requesting a list of federally threatened and endangered species under the jurisdiction of the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) that may occur in the referenced project area. You also provided an essential fish habitat (EFH) assessment, pursuant to the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Management and Conservation Act for our comment.

No federally listed threatened or endangered species under NMFS jurisdiciton are known to occur in the project area, therefore Section 7 consultation, pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, is not required. We have reviewed the EFH assessment for the project and agree with your conclusion that the project would have minor, long-term beneficial impacts on the Indian River, including EFH. This conclusion is based on the assumption that clearing of vegetation along the trails will not include the removal of entire plants and their root systems.
