Dear Bill,

Per our conversation today, enclosed please find a copy of the guidance memorandum for National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) staff nationwide to clarify the role of mitigation in determining adverse effects for purposes of Essential Fish Habitat (EFH) consultations under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act. I prepared this guidance memorandum in my previous job as the national EFH Coordinator for NMFS, and it remains in effect today.

In summary, avoidance and minimization measures can be used to reduce effects on EFH and even obviate the need for EFH consultation, but any federal agency action that may adversely affect EFH requires consultation with NMFS, regardless of the amount of compensatory mitigation proposed to offset adverse effects.
