Dear Colonel Gallagher:

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has reviewed the Public Notice of Application for Permit (POA-2005-1576) by ConocoPhillips Alaska Inc. to construct a new drill pad (CD-5), associated roads, bridges, and pipelines in the Colville Delta and National Petroleum Reserve-Alaska. The project would require placement of approximately 532,119 cubic yards of gravel fill material into approximately 45.1 acres of waters of the United States including wetlands. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has determined that the described activity within the proposed area may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH), including anadromous fish and federally managed fishery resources.

NMFS participated in the development and review of the Alpine Satellite Development Plan Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) prepared by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and cooperating agencies. NMFS primary concerns were voiced during EIS development and were addressed in the EIS. Although the project has been modified significantly since the EIS was written, NMFS offers no additional Conservation Recommendations. Further EFH consultation is not necessary.
