

**THE HONORABLE GEOFFREY M. ALPRIN
ASSOCIATE JUDGE
SUPERIOR COURT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA**

Judge Geoffrey M. Alprin was appointed to the District of Columbia Superior Court in 1983 by President Ronald Reagan.

Judge Alprin was born in Providence, Rhode Island in 1939. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1961 and his law degree from Georgetown University Law Center in 1964, where he was Managing Editor of the Georgetown Law Journal.

After graduation from law school, Judge Alprin served as a law clerk at-large to the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. In 1965, he was appointed an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Columbia, where he served in the General Sessions, Appellate, Grand Jury and Criminal Divisions. From 1968 to 1970, Judge Alprin was associated with the law firm of Sachs, Greenebaum & Frohlich, representing clients in a wide range of civil and criminal matters. In 1970, he was appointed Deputy General Counsel for the Metropolitan Police Department of the District of Columbia, becoming General Counsel in 1971, a post in which he remained until late 1973. In September 1973, he began service as Assistant Director of the National Institute of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, placing him in charge of the office which handled the Institute's \$21 million extramural research budget. Judge Alprin was then chosen as Deputy Corporation Counsel in charge of the Criminal Division of the Office of the Corporation Counsel for the District of Columbia (now Office of the Attorney General) in April 1977, a position he held until his appointment to the Superior Court.

Judge Alprin became deputy presiding judge of the Family Division (now Family Court) in 1986 and was presiding judge of the Family Division from 1990 to 1993. In addition to his court duties, he is an adjunct professor of law at The George Washington University Law School.

Judge Alprin is married to Linda Ann Alprin. They have four children. His father, the late Honorable Jacob J. Alprin, was a judge of the Family Court of the State of Rhode Island from 1972 to 1982.
