In 1988, Judge Saddler served as a Senior Staff Attorney for the District Court of Appeals where she supervised staff attorneys and law clerks. From July 1990 through January 1991, she was the Acting Chief Deputy Clerk of the District of Columbia Court Appeals.

From 1991 to 2003 Judge Saddler served as a Magistrate Judge (formerly known as Hearing Commissioner) of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia, where she presided over thousands of matters in the Criminal, Civil and Family Divisions of the Court.

Throughout her professional career, Judge Saddler has been active in many bar associations and numerous professional and community organizations, including: the Washington Bar Association; the Women's Bar Associate; the National Association of Women Judges; the Greater Washington Area Chapter, Women's Lawyers Division, National Bar Association (GWAC) and the Charlotte E. Ray American Inn of Court.
