




Your state "talks" to other CSENetically-capable states

What "language" do we "talk"?




Instead of sentences composed of subject, verb, and object, CSENet uses function, action, and reason code to get the message across.

Function? Action? Reason Code? I'm confused.....



There are 7 "functions" in CSENet and they each address a different area of case processing.

I'm still confused....



7 "Functions"

- · CSI
- LO1
- ENF
- MSC
- EST
- PAT
- COL

OK....but what do they mean?

- ✓ CSI = Case Information
- ✓ LO1 = Quick Locate
- ✓ENF = Enforcement
- ✓ MSC = Managing State Cases
- ✓ EST = Establishment
- ✓ PAT = Paternity
- ✓ COL = Collection



So those are the "functions."
What's an "action"?


"Actions" are what you want done.

There are odifferent "actions" in CSENet.



Explain, please?

You can Request or Provide information, send a reMinder or an Update,
Acknowledge receipt of a CSENet message or Cancel the previous request.

- LO1/R = Quick Locate Request
- ENF/A = Enforcement Acknowledgement
- CSI/P = Case Information Provide
- MSC/U = Managing State Cases Update
- PAT/C = Paternity Cancellation
- EST/M = Establishment Reminder




OK. Now what about the Reason Code part of a CSENet sentence?

There are 100s of CSENet Reason Codes available, allowing the worker to "talk" in specific terms.

The CSENet Advantage

- Speed (Overnight)
- Convenience
- Less Paper
- No Automated-Voice-Response "Misery"
- DOB, SSN and Name Updates
- "Quick" Locate Information
- Unsolicited Case Information

Impediments to CSENet Usage

- Minimal Payment Information
- Bad Case Data
- Poorly Designed State System
- Lack of User Training
