INTRODUCTION (##)

This manual has been reorganized. Like items have been grouped together: SECTION I - The [funding mechanisms](#)' numbering system; SECTION II – The [Organizational Codes](#) information; and, SECTION III - The [Activity Code](#) information.

The revisions in this manual include new Organizational Codes, the Activity Codes, Activity Code Titles, and Activity Code definitions used now and for the past three fiscal years in the electronic Research Administration (eRA) System. In addition, a full listing of codes and a glossary of relevant terms has been added. Click the term to go directly to the glossary for more explanation on each term.

The [eRA System](#) is the NIH infrastructure that provides secure receipt, review and administration of electronic grants. It integrates the [eRA Commons](#) and [IMPAC II](#) projects. IMPAC II (Information for Management, Planning, Analysis, and Coordination) is a database and the successor to NIH's original IMPAC system. The eRA System is currently used by the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), agencies within the Department and the Veterans' Affairs. The IMPAC and [CRISP \(Computer Retrieval of Information on Scientific Projects\)](#) systems use the codes listed in this document. IMPAC and CRISP are online computer-based information systems for many extramural programs of DHHS. IMPAC contains application and award information on extramural programs. CRISP contains information on funded research only. CRISP derives its administrative data from the IMPAC system. In addition to its IMPAC data, CRISP has project abstracts and indexing terms. The CRISP system also contains summary information on non-IMPAC DHHS intramural research projects.

Extramural research activities are divided into three main funding mechanisms: [grants](#), [contracts](#) and [cooperative agreements](#). A funding mechanism is the type of funded application or transaction used at the NIH. [Programs](#) are areas within the funding mechanisms. Activity Codes identify categories applied to the various funding mechanisms.

CONTRACT IDENTIFICATION NUMBERING SYSTEM¹ (##)

The NIH currently uses the DHHS Departmental Contracts Information System (DCIS) to facilitate NIH Contracts. The contract numbering system that was used in the IMPAC legacy system is no longer used. The new contract numbering system is shown below. Contact your contracting office for more information on or for full listings of elements listed below. All other references to the contract system (except items in Table 4) have been deleted from the *Activity Codes, Organizational Codes and Definitions Used in the Extramural Programs* book.

The contract identification number, known as the PIID, consists of six parts, each having a distinct meaning. Its elements are structured as follows:

Agency – A 3-digit code identifying the Department of Health and Human Services.

OPDIV Code – A 1-digit code identifying the servicing agency within DHHS. In this example N=NIH.

Contract Office Code – A 3-digit code assigned to the administering contracting office by the Office of Acquisition Management.

Fiscal Year – A 4-digit code identifying the fiscal year.

Serial Number – A 5-digit serial number automatically assigned to each contract.

Acquisition Type – A 1-digit code describing the type of action or funding mechanism. (See Contract Type Code listing below.)

GRANT APPLICATION/AWARD IDENTIFICATION NUMBERING SYSTEM¹(###)

The identification number is commonly referred to as the application number or grant number, depending upon its processing status. *Cooperative Agreements* use the same numbering system. The identification number consists of several parts, each having a distinct meaning. The following example shows the parts of an ID number assigned to an amendment (A1) to a supplemental (Type 3) application for a traditional research project (R01) referred to the National Cancer Institute (CA). The number further identifies the application serially as the 12921st new proposal submitted to the NCI, and indicates that this is the first supplemental application (S1) to the fourth year (-04) of support to this project.

Application Type Code - A single-digit code identifying the type of application received and processed. In the example above, the "3" indicates that this is a supplemental request for additional funds. The full list for Application Type code translations and the definition for grant and cooperative agreement funding mechanisms is listed on page 3.

Activity Code (Also referred to as an Instrument Code) - A three-digit code identifying a specific category of extramural activity. All current activity codes, activity code titles and definitions are listed in Table 3.

Organizational Code (Also referred to as an IC Code or Admin PHS Org Code) - A two-letter code identifying the first major-level subdivision. In the example above, "CA" refers to the National Cancer Institute. For certain activities, DHHS organizations having Bureau status may use a Division-level code. An inter-agency agreement awarded by NCI, for instance, may be coded 1Y01CM00999-00, where CM refers to NCI's Division of Cancer Treatment. Organizational codes are translated in Table 1.

Serial Number - A five-digit number generally assigned sequentially to a series within an Institute, Center, or Division. *As grant applications for ICs reach the 99999 five-digit threshold, the ICs will begin using six-digit serial numbers. Currently the National Cancer Institute is the only IC using the six-digit serial number.

Suffixes - A field composed of the following components:

GRANT YEAR - A two-digit number indicates the actual segment or budget period of a project. The grant year number (01, 02, etc.) is preceded by a dash to separate it from the serial number; e.g., AI 12345-02 or CA 00900-04. The grant year number is increased by one for each succeeding renewal year. Thus, the -02 and -04 year suffixes above identify grants in their second and fourth years.

SUPPLEMENT - The letter "S" and related number identify a particular supplemental record; e.g., S1, S2. Supplement designations follow the grant year or the amendment designation, as the case may be; e.g., AI 12345-01S1 and CA 00900-04A1S2.

AMENDMENT (Resubmission = New field name in Grants.gov) - The letter "A" and related number identify each amended application e.g., A1, A2, etc. Amendment designations follow the grant year or the supplement designation, as the case may be; e.g., DE 34567-02A1 and HL 45678-01S1A2.

ALLOWANCE - The letter "X" and related number identify a fellowship's institutional allowance record. Allowance designations also follow the grant year or other designation; e.g., AG 12345-01X1 and HD 12345-02S1X2.

¹ An additional four-digit suffix may appear in a grant identification number recorded in the CRISP system, to identify separate projects.

GRANT AND COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT TYPES (##)

Some of the Type of Application field names have changed.

If changed, both the new (Grants.gov established) and former (NIH established) names are listed below.

1	New (New) - Request for Department of Health and Human Services support of a project that has not yet been funded.
2	Renewal (Competing Continuation) - Request for an additional term of support based on a funded previous project; must compete for available funds.
3	Revision (Supplement) - Request for additional funds for a current award, to cover increased costs (noncompeting) or to expand the scope of work (competing).
4	Extension - Request for additional funds beyond the years previously awarded; limited to certain activities, including MERIT (R37) and certain Fellowship (F) and Career (K) awards. These F and K applications do not compete for funds. R37's do require National Advisory Council review.
5	Noncompeting Continuation - Request to pay next budget increment of a current award; does not compete for available funds.
6	Change of Organization Status (Successor-In-Interest) – Request for support of a funded project at an institution where the legal status of the organization has been changed through an approved Successor-In-Interest action.
7	Change of Grantee or Training Institution - Request for support of a funded project that has been transferred from one grantee or training institution to another.
8	Change of Institute or Division - Noncompeting continuation (cf. Type 5) that has been transferred from one ICD to another.
9	Change of Institute or Division - Competing continuation (cf. Type 2) that has been transferred from one ICD to another.

Block Grants**B 09 Community Mental Health Services Block Grant**

Provides financial assistance to the States and territories, as mandated by Congressional legislation, to support community mental health centers for the provision of services for the chronically/severely mentally ill, identifiable populations that are currently underserved; and for coordination of mental health and health care centers.

Research Construction Programs**C 06 Research Facilities Construction Grants**

To provide matching Federal funds, up to 75%, for construction or major remodeling, to create new research facilities. In addition to basic research laboratories this may include, under certain circumstances, animal facilities and/or limited clinical facilities where they are an integral part of an overall research effort.

Training Projects**D P1 NIH Director's Pioneer Award (NDPA)**

To support individuals who have the potential to make extraordinary contributions to medical research. The NIH Director's Pioneer Award is not renewable.

D P2 NIH Director's New Innovator Awards

To support highly innovative research projects by new investigators in all areas of biomedical and behavioral research.

D 43 International Training Grants in Epidemiology

To improve and expand epidemiologic research and the utilization of epidemiology in clinical trials and prevention research in foreign countries through support of training programs for foreign health professionals, technicians, and other health care workers.

D 71 International Training Program Planning Grant

To plan for the preparation of an application for a D43 international institutional training grant.

Health Professions Programs(##)**E 11 Grants for Public Health Special Projects**

To provide grants to public or nonprofit organizations for planning, development, demonstration, research, training, public information projects for preventive medicine, health promotion and disease prevention to improve the health of targeted populations.

Fellowship Programs**F 05 International Research Fellowships**

To provide collaborative research opportunities for qualified non-immigrant alien scientists who hold a doctoral degree or its equivalent in one of the biomedical or behavioral sciences.

F 30 Individual Predoctoral NRSA for M.D./Ph.D. Fellowships

Individual fellowships for predoctoral training which leads to the combined M.D./Ph.D. degrees.

F 31 Predoctoral Individual National Research Service Award

To provide predoctoral individuals with supervised research training in specified health and health-related areas leading toward the research degree (e.g., Ph.D.).

F 32 Postdoctoral Individual National Research Service Award

To provide postdoctoral research training to individuals to broaden their scientific background and extend their potential for research in specified health-related areas.

F 33 National Research Service Awards for Senior Fellows

To provide opportunities for experienced scientists to make major changes in the direction of research careers, to broaden scientific background, to acquire new research capabilities, to enlarge command of an allied research field, or to take time from regular professional responsibilities for the purpose of increasing capabilities to engage in health-related research.

F 34 MARC (NRSA) Faculty Fellowships

To provide fellowships to selected faculty members from minority institutions to enable them to obtain advanced training in specified health and health-related areas.

F 37 Medical Informatics Fellowship

To provide training to individuals in the synthesis, organization, and management of knowledge. The training should be interdisciplinary - involving medicine, biotechnology, and cognitive sciences, information science, and computer science.

F 38 Applied Medical Informatics Fellowship

To provide opportunities for scientists to make major changes in the direction of research careers for the purpose of engaging in the synthesis, organization, and management of knowledge.

Resource Programs(##)**G 07 Resources Improvement Grant**

A non-renewable grant available to health related organizations to establish, expand or improve Internet connectivity and improve access to digital information resources.

G 08 Resources Project Grant

A grant available to health-related institutions to improve the organization and management of health related information using computers and networks.

G 11 Extramural Associate Research Development Award (EARDA)

To provide funds to institutions eligible to participate in the NIH Extramural Associates Program for establishing or enhancing an office of sponsored research and for other research infrastructure needs.

G 12 Research Centers in Minority Institutions Award

To assist predominantly minority institutions that offer the doctorate in the health professions and/or health-related sciences in strengthening and augmenting their human and physical resources for the conduct of biomedical research.

G 13 Health Sciences Publication Support Awards

To provide short-term assistance for the preparation of book-length manuscripts about important scientific information needed by U.S. health professionals. Grants are awarded for major critical reviews and analyses of historical studies and current developments in informatics, technology, librarianship, and secondary reference materials in the biomedical field. Publication in formats other than print-on-paper (e.g., electronic, film, etc.) are encouraged, as are new and innovative ways of organizing and presenting information. Publication grants do not support journals or other serials and are not suitable for operation of established databases. Work judged to have significant commercial viability will not be supported by these grants.

G 20 Grants for Repair, Renovation and Modernization of Existing Research Facilities

To provide funds for major repair, renovation, and modernization of existing research facilities. These facilities may be the clinical research facilities, animal research facilities, and other related research facilities.

G 94 Administrative Support for Public Health Service Agency Foundations

Provides financial assistance, as specified by legislation or other authority, for administration of an agency foundation which supports and carries out research, educational, health services, or other activities related to the mission of that PHS agency.

Community Services Program**H D4 Drug Use and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Demonstration Grants in the Community Partnership Study Program**

Provides financial assistance to local governments and/or local private non-profit organizations, designated to act on behalf of larger coalitions, to demonstrate models for elimination of alcohol and other drug abuse, especially by development of partnerships to encourage various individuals and groups in a community to more effectively coordinate prevention programs and to develop prevention initiatives; and to demonstrate the effectiveness of such community-based groups in prevention and early intervention. The Community Prevention Coalitions Demonstration (CPCD) program is included in this activity code.

H 13(###) **Conferences**

To support international, national, or regional conferences, symposiums, or workshops dealing with services for the rehabilitation, prevention, and treatment of categorical diseases.

H 25 **Venereal Disease Control**

Provides financial assistance to public agencies for the purpose of planning, developing, implementing, and studying venereal disease control programs to inhibit the spread of venereal disease throughout the country.

H 28 **State and Community-Based Injury Control Programs**

Provides financial assistance to health agencies serving populations of over 1 million for them to develop, expand, or improve injury control programs to reduce morbidity, mortality, severity, disability, and cost from injuries.

H 57 **Indian Health Service Loan Repayment Program**

To provide periodic reimbursement for educational loan payment to IHS professionals who agree to serve an applicable period of time in a Retention/Recruitment Priority Site.

H 62 **Services or Education on AIDS**

Provides financial assistance to public and non-profit private entities for information and education programs on the Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, and for diagnostic, prevention, and control services of AIDS.

H 64 **State and Community-Based Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program**

Provides financial assistance to State agencies and city/country agencies, based on need, to enable them to develop, expand, or improve childhood lead poisoning prevention programs.

H 75 **Health Investigations and Assessments of Control and Prevention Methods**

Provides financial assistance to States or local governments or other health-related organizations, to perform special investigations of communicable diseases and other preventable health conditions, or to research and evaluate methods of preventing disease or controlling health conditions.

H 79 **Mental Health and/or Substance Abuse Services Grants**

To support services and other activities for the prevention and/or treatment of mental illness and/or substance abuse disorders and/or for the promotion of health.

Research Career ProgramsK D1 **Mental Health and/or Substance Abuse KD&A Grants**

To provide support to develop new knowledge about ways to improve the prevention and/or treatment of substance abuse and/or mental illness, and to work with State and local governments as well as providers, families, and consumers to apply that knowledge effectively in everyday practice. Outcome measures are the heart and core of the KD&A program. KD&As do not provide operating funds for service programs, except as required by the knowledge development activity.

K L1 **Linked Research Career Development Award**

For support of a scientist, committed to research, in need of both advanced research training and additional experience. The grant is administratively linked to another project or projects. A KL1 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for a KL1, Linked Research Career Development Award. The KL1 is used in lieu of the K01 for those programs that offer linked awards.

K L2(##) Mentored Career Development Award

To support newly trained clinicians appointed by an institution for activities related to the development of a successful clinical and translational research career. The award is administratively linked to another project or projects. A KL2 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for a KL2, Mentored Career Development Award. The KL2 is used in lieu of the K12 for those programs that offer linked awards.

K 01 Research Scientist Development Award - Research & Training

For support of a scientist, committed to research, in need of both advanced research training and additional experience.

K 02 Research Scientist Development Award - Research

For support of a scientist, committed to research, in need of additional experience.

K 05 Research Scientist Award

For the support of a research scientist qualified to pursue independent research which would extend the research program of the sponsoring institution, or to direct an essential part of this research program.

K 06 Research Career Awards

To enable institutions to finance positions favorable to the intellectual growth and research productivity of established investigators of high competence for the duration of their careers.

K 07 Academic/Teacher Award (ATA)

To create and encourage a stimulating approach to disease curricula that will attract high quality students, foster academic career development of promising young teacher-investigators, develop and implement excellent multidisciplinary curricula through interchange of ideas and enable the grantee institution to strengthen its existing teaching program.

K 08 Clinical Investigator Award (CIA)

To provide the opportunity for promising medical scientists with demonstrated aptitude to develop into independent investigators, or for faculty members to pursue research aspects of categorical areas applicable to the awarding unit, and aid in filling the academic faculty gap in these shortage areas within health profession's institutions of the country.

K 12 Physician Scientist Award (Program) (PSA)

For support to a newly trained clinician appointed by an institution for development of independent research skills and experience in a fundamental science within the framework of an interdisciplinary research and development program.

K 14 Minority School Faculty Development Awards

To encourage the development of faculty investigators at minority schools and to enhance their research capabilities in specified health and health related areas.

K 18 The Career Enhancement Award

Provides either full-time or part-time support for experienced scientists who wish to broaden their scientific capabilities or to make changes in their research careers by acquiring new research skills or knowledge. Career enhancement experiences supported by this award should usually last no more than one year.

K 22(##) Career Transition Award

To provide support to outstanding newly trained basic or clinical investigators to develop their independent research skills through a two phase program; an initial period involving and intramural appointment at the NIH and a final period of support at an extramural institution. The award is intended to facilitate the establishment of a record of independent research by the investigator in order to sustain or promote a successful research career.

K 23 Mentored Patient-Oriented Research Career Development Award

To provide support for the career development of investigators who have made a commitment to focus their research endeavors on patient-oriented research. This mechanism provides support for a 3 year minimum up to 5 year period of supervised study and research for clinically trained professionals who have the potential to develop into productive, clinical investigators.

K 24 Midcareer Investigator Award in Patient-Oriented Research

To provide support for the clinicians to allow them protected time to devote to patient-oriented research and to act as mentors for beginning clinical investigators.

K 25 Mentored Quantitative Research Career Development Award

To engender and foster such activities by supporting the career development of investigators with quantitative scientific and engineering backgrounds outside of biology or medicine who have made a commitment to focus their research endeavors on behavioral and biomedical research (basic or clinical). This mechanism is aimed at research-oriented scientists with experience at the level of junior faculty (e.g., early to mid-levels of assistant professor or research assistant professor ranks). This award provides support for a period of mentored study and research for professionals with such backgrounds who have the potential to integrate their expertise with biomedicine and develop into productive investigators.

Examples of quantitative scientific and technical backgrounds outside of biology or medicine considered appropriate for this award include, but are not limited to: mathematics, statistics, computer science, informatics, physics, chemistry, and engineering.

K 26 Midcareer Investigator Award in Biomedical and Behavioral Research

The purpose of the Midcareer Investigator Award in Biomedical and Behavioral Research is to provide grant support for biomedical and behavioral scientists to allow them protected time to devote to their research and mentoring.

K 30 Clinical Research Curriculum Award (CRCA)

The CRCA is an award to institutions and is intended to stimulate the inclusion of high-quality, multi-disciplinary didactic training as part of the career development of clinical investigators. This award is intended to support the development of new didactic programs in clinical research at institutions that do not currently offer such programs or, in institutions with existing didactic programs in clinical research to support or expand their programs or to improve the quality of instruction.

K 99 Career Transition Award

To support the initial phase of a Career/Research Transition award program that provides 1-2 years of mentored support for highly motivated, advanced postdoctoral research scientists.

Loans and Scholarships(##)**L 30 Loan Repayment Program for Clinical Researchers**

To provide for the repayment of the educational loan debt of qualified health professionals involved in clinical research. Qualified health professionals who contractually agree to conduct qualified clinical research are eligible to apply for this program.

L 32 Loan Repayment Program for Clinical Researchers from Disadvantaged Backgrounds

To provide for the repayment of the educational loan debt of qualified health professionals from disadvantaged backgrounds involved in clinical research. Qualified health professionals from disadvantaged backgrounds who contractually agree to conduct qualified clinical research are eligible to apply for this program.

L 40 Loan Repayment Program for Pediatric Research

To provide for the repayment of the educational loan debt of qualified health professionals involved in research directly related to diseases, disorders, and other conditions in children. Qualified health professionals who contractually agree to conduct qualified pediatric research are eligible to apply for this program.

L 50 Loan Repayment Program for Contraception and Infertility Research

To provide for the repayment of the educational loan debt of qualified health professionals (including graduate students) who contractually agree to commit to conduct qualified contraception and/or infertility research.

L 60 Loan Repayment Program for Health Disparities Research

To provide for the repayment of the educational loan debt of qualified health professionals involved in minority health and health disparities research, for the purposes of improving minority health and reducing health disparities. Qualified health professionals who contractually agree to conduct qualified minority health disparities research or other health disparities research eligible to apply for this program.

Program Projects and Centers**M 01 General Clinical Research Centers Program**

An award made to an institution solely for the support of a General Clinical Research Center where scientists conduct studies on a wide range of human diseases using the full spectrum of the biomedical sciences. Costs underwritten by these grants include those for renovation, for operational expenses such as staff salaries, equipment, and supplies, and for hospitalization. A General Clinical Research Center is a discrete unit of research beds separated from the general care wards.

Research Program Projects and Centers**P L1 Linked Center Core Grant**

To support shared resources and facilities for categorical research by a number of investigators from different disciplines who provide a multidisciplinary approach to a joint research effort or from the same discipline who focus on a common research problem. The core grant is integrated with the center's component projects or program projects, though funded independently from them. This support, by providing more accessible resources, is expected to assure a greater productivity than from the separate projects and program projects. The Linked Center Core Grant is administratively linked to another project or projects. A PL1 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for a PL1, Linked Center Core Grant. The PL1 is used in lieu of the P30 for those programs that offer linked awards.

P N1(##) Concept Development Award

To support the planning and research activities required to assemble multidisciplinary research teams in order to generate an extensive plan that describes the scientific areas, organization, and operation of a research center. Concept Development Awards are not renewable.

P N2 Research Development Center

To support any part of the full range of research and development from very basic to clinical as well as any educational, administrative, or other activities required in the center. The spectrum of research activities comprises a multidisciplinary approach to promote research primarily in a new or emerging biomedical scientific area. These centers are expected to operate as a network of centers to promote interactions and resource sharing. Only recipients of the PN1 are eligible to apply for the PN2.

P 01 Research Program Projects

For the support of a broadly based, multidisciplinary, often long-term research program which has a specific major objective or a basic theme. A program project generally involves the organized efforts of relatively large groups, members of which are conducting research projects designed to elucidate the various aspects or components of this objective. Each research project is usually under the leadership of an established investigator. The grant can provide support for certain basic resources used by these groups in the program, including clinical components, the sharing of which facilitates the total research effort. A program project is directed toward a range of problems having a central research focus, in contrast to the usually narrower thrust of the traditional research project. Each project supported through this mechanism should contribute or be directly related to the common theme of the total research effort. These scientifically meritorious projects should demonstrate an essential element of unity and interdependence, i.e., a system of research activities and projects directed toward a well-defined research program goal.

P 20 Exploratory Grants

To support planning for new programs, expansion or modification of existing resources, and feasibility studies to explore various approaches to the development of interdisciplinary programs that offer potential solutions to problems of special significance to the mission of the NIH. These exploratory studies may lead to specialized or comprehensive centers.

P 30 Center Core Grants

To support shared resources and facilities for categorical research by a number of investigators from different disciplines who provide a multidisciplinary approach to a joint research effort or from the same discipline who focus on a common research problem. The core grant is integrated with the center's component projects or program projects, though funded independently from them. This support, by providing more accessible resources, is expected to assure a greater productivity than from the separate projects and program projects.

P 40 Animal (Mammalian and Nonmammalian) Model, and Animal and Biological Material Resource Grants

To develop and support animal (mammalian and nonmammalian) models, or animal or biological materials resources available to all qualified investigators without regard to the scientific disciplines or disease orientations of their research activities or specifically directed to a categorical program. Nonmammalian resources include nonmammalian vertebrates, invertebrates, cell systems, and nonbiological systems.

P 41 Biotechnology Resource Grants

To support biotechnology resources available to all qualified investigators without regard to the scientific disciplines or disease orientations of their research activities or specifically directed to a categorical program area.

P 42(###) Hazardous Substances Basic Research Grants Program

To support basic research directed towards understanding and attenuating the public health effects resulting from exposure to hazardous substances, including 1) advanced techniques for detection, assessment and evaluation of the effects on human health of hazardous substances; 2) methods to assess risks to human health presented by hazardous substances; 3) methods and technologies to detect hazardous substances in the environment and 4) basic biological, chemical, and physical methods to reduce the amount and toxicity of hazardous substances. This special program, authorized under Superfund legislation, is for a broadly based, multi-disciplinary research effort which must include biomedical research components and which may include research components related to engineering, hydrogeology, ecology and epidemiology so long as they are linked to basic biomedical science. Each research project is generally under the leadership of an established investigator. The grant can provide support for certain basic resources used by the groups in the program (cores), including an administrative structure for effective coordination.

P 50 Specialized Center

To support any part of the full range of research and development from very basic to clinical; may involve ancillary supportive activities such as protracted patient care necessary to the primary research or R&D effort. The spectrum of activities comprises a multidisciplinary attack on a specific disease entity or biomedical problem area. These grants differ from program project grants in that they are usually developed in response to an announcement of the programmatic needs of an Institute or Division and subsequently receive continuous attention from its staff. Centers may also serve as regional or national resources for special research purposes.

P 51 Primate Research Center Grants

To support centers which include a multidisciplinary and multi-categorical core research program using primate animals and to maintain a large and varied primate colony which is available to affiliated, collaborative, and visiting investigators for basic and applied biomedical research and training.

P 60 Comprehensive Center

To support a multipurpose unit designed to bring together into a common focus divergent but related facilities within a given community. It may be based in a university or may involve other locally available resources, such as hospitals, computer facilities, regional centers, and primate colonies. It may include specialized centers, program projects and projects as integral components. Regardless of the facilities available to a program, it usually includes the following objectives: to foster biomedical research and development at both the fundamental and clinical levels; to initiate and expand community education, screening, and counseling programs; and to educate medical and allied health professionals concerning the problems of diagnosis and treatment of a specific disease.

P 76 Projects to Design and Implement Health Exhibits/Materials for Public Education

Provides financial assistance to eligible organizations to plan, design and implement displays and/or instructional materials related to diseases, disorders and conditions that affect various populations, and how such populations can reduce the impact on their lives.

Research Projects**R L1 Linked Research Project Grant**

To support a discrete, specified, circumscribed project that is administratively linked to another project or projects, and to be performed by the named investigator(s) in an area representing his specific interest and competencies. An RL1 award may only be disaggregated from U54 application and organizations may not apply for an RL1, Linked Research Project Grant. The RL1 Activity Code is used in Lieu of the R01 for those programs that offer linked awards.

R L2(##) Linked Exploratory/Development Grant

To encourage the development of new research activities in categorical program areas. (Support generally is restricted in level of support and in time). The grant is administratively linked to another project or projects. An RL2 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for an RL2, Linked Exploratory/Development Grant. The RL2 Activity Code is used in lieu of the R21 for those programs that offer linked awards.

R L5 Linked Education Project

For support to develop and/or implement a program as it relates to a category in one or more of the areas of education, information, training, technical assistance, coordination, or evaluation. The grant is administratively linked to another project or projects. A RL5 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for an RL5, Linked Education Project. The RL5 is used in lieu of the R25 for those programs that offer linked awards.

R L9 Linked Research Training Award

To support comprehensive interdisciplinary research training programs at the undergraduate, pre-doctoral and/or postdoctoral levels, by capitalizing on the infrastructure of existing multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research programs. The RL9 is for trainees who do not meet the qualifications for NRSA authority. The training program is administratively linked to another project or projects. An RL9 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for an RL9, Linked Research Training Award. The RL9 is used in lieu of the R90 for those programs that offer linked awards.

R S1 Programs to Prevent the Emergence and Spread of Antimicrobial Resistance in the United States

Develop, implement, and evaluate an antimicrobial project to prevent and control the emergence, prevalence, and spread of antimicrobial resistance in rural areas, and microbiologic mechanisms of dissemination of antimicrobial resistance genes and the relationship to antimicrobial drug use.

R 00 Research Transition Award

To support the second phase of a Career/Research Transition award program that provides 1 -3 years of independent research support (R00) contingent on securing an independent research position. Award recipients will be expected to compete successfully for independent R01 support from the NIH during the R00 research transition award period.

R 01 Research Project

To support a discrete, specified, circumscribed project to be performed by the named investigator(s) in an area representing his specific interest and competencies.

R 03 Small Research Grants

To provide research support specifically limited in time and amount for studies in categorical program areas. Small grants provide flexibility for initiating studies which are generally for preliminary short-term projects and are non-renewable.

R 04 Anthrop. Fellow Res. Support (old)

Provides financial assistance to qualified recipients to conduct studies of the causal relationship between primary and secondary disabilities to 1) determine the prevalence of specified secondary conditions; 2) define the range of the disabling process; 3) determine risk factors associated with specified secondary conditions; or 4) evaluate the effectiveness of public health interventions aimed at reduction of specified secondary conditions.

R 06(##)	Translations	Provides financial assistance to eligible organizations to support research activities for the prevention of disease or for the promotion of health.
R 13	Conference	To support recipient sponsored and directed international, national or regional meetings, conferences and workshops.
R 15	Academic Research Enhancement Awards (AREA)	To support small scale research projects conducted by faculty in primarily baccalaureate degree-granting domestic institutions. Awards are for up to \$75,000 for direct costs (plus applicable indirect costs) for periods not to exceed 36 months.
R 18	Research Demonstration and Dissemination Projects	To provide support designed to develop, test, and evaluate health service activities, and to foster the application of existing knowledge for the control of categorical diseases.
R 21	Exploratory/Developmental Grants	To encourage the development of new research activities in categorical program areas. (Support generally is restricted in level of support and in time.)
R 24	Resource-Related Research Projects	To support research projects that will enhance the capability of resources to serve biomedical research.
R 25	Education Projects	For support to develop and/or implement a program as it relates to a category in one or more of the areas of education, information, training, technical assistance, coordination, or evaluation.
R 33	Exploratory/Developmental Grants Phase II	The R33 award is to provide a second phase for the support for innovative exploratory and development research activities initiated under the R21 mechanism. Although only R21 awardees are generally eligible to apply for R33 support, specific program initiatives may establish eligibility criteria under which applications could be accepted from applicants demonstrating progress equivalent to that expected under R33.
R 34	Clinical Trial Planning Grant	To provide support for the initial development of a clinical trial, including the establishment of the research team; the development of tools for data management and oversight of the research; the development of a trial design and other essential elements of the study, such as the protocol, recruitment strategies, and procedure manuals; and to collect feasibility data.
R 36	Dissertation Award	To support dissertation research costs of students in accredited research doctoral programs in the United States (including Puerto Rico and other U.S. territories or possessions). Dissertation awards are not renewable.

R 37(##) Method to Extend Research in Time (MERIT) Award

To provide long-term grant support to investigators whose research competence and productivity are distinctly superior and who are highly likely to continue to perform in an outstanding manner. Investigators may not apply for a MERIT award. Program staff and/or members of the cognizant National Advisory Council/Board will identify candidates for the MERIT award during the course of review of competing research grant applications prepared and submitted in accordance with regular PHS requirements.

R 41 Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Grants - Phase I

To support cooperative R&D projects between small business concerns and research institutions, limited in time and amount, to establish the technical merit and feasibility of ideas that have potential for commercialization. Awards are made to small business concerns only.

R 42 Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Grants - Phase II

To support in-depth development of cooperative R&D projects between small business concerns and research institutions, limited in time and amount, whose feasibility has been established in Phase I and that have potential for commercialization. Awards are made to small business concerns only.

R 43 Small Business Innovation Research Grants (SBIR) - Phase I

To support projects, limited in time and amount, to establish the technical merit and feasibility of R&D ideas which may ultimately lead to a commercial product(s) or service(s).

R 44 Small Business Innovation Research Grants (SBIR) - Phase II

To support in-depth development of R&D ideas whose feasibility has been established in Phase I and which are likely to result in commercial products or services. SBIR Phase II are considered “Fast-Track” and do not require National Council Review.

R 49 Injury Control Research and Demonstration Projects and Injury Prevention Research Centers

Provides financial assistance to non-profit and for-profit organizations to conduct research and demonstration projects as well as training programs to develop a comprehensive and integrated approach to injury control. These projects will integrate aspects of the disciplines of engineering, public health, behavioral sciences, medicine, and others in order to prevent and control injuries.

R 55 James A. Shannon Director's Award

To provide a limited award to investigators to further develop, test, and refine research techniques; perform secondary analysis of available data sets; test the feasibility of innovative and creative approaches; and conduct other discrete projects that can demonstrate their research capabilities and lend additional weight to their already meritorious applications.

R 56 High Priority, Short Term Project Award

To provide limited interim research support based on the merit of a pending R01 application while applicant gathers additional data to revise a new or competing renewal application. This grant will underwrite highly meritorious applications that if given the opportunity to revise their application could meet IC recommended standards and would be missed opportunities if not funded. Interim funded ends when the applicant succeeds in obtaining an R01 or other competing award built on the R56 grant. These awards are not renewable.

R 90(##) Interdisciplinary Regular Research Training Award

To support comprehensive interdisciplinary research training programs at the undergraduate, predoctoral and/or postdoctoral levels, by capitalizing on the infrastructure of existing multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research programs. This Activity Code is for trainees who do not meet the qualifications for NRSA authority.

Research-Related Programs**S C1 Research Enhancement Award**

Individual investigator-initiated research projects aimed at developing researchers at minority-serving institutions (MSIs) to a stage where they can transition successfully to other extramural support (R01 or equivalent).

S C2 Pilot Research Project

Individual investigator-initiated pilot research projects for faculty at MSIs to generate preliminary data for a more ambitious research project.

S C3 Research Continuance Award

Individual investigator-initiated research projects for faculty at MSIs to conduct research of limited scope in environments with limited research infrastructure/facilities.

S 06 Minority Biomedical Research Support (MBRS)

To strengthen the biomedical research and research training capability of ethnic minority institutions, and thus establish a more favorable milieu for increasing the involvement of minority faculty and students in biomedical research.

S 10 Biomedical Research Support Shared Instrumentation Grants

To make available to institutions with a high concentration of NIH extramural research awards, research instruments which will be used on a shared basis.

S 11 Minority Biomedical Research Support Thematic Project Grants

To promote increased faculty and interdepartmental collaboration through programs that focus on specific research themes or scientific disciplines at developing minority institutions. These grants are intended to strengthen the biomedical research capability in defined areas and to attract other competent biomedical scientists through an improved research environment.

S 21 Research and Institutional Resources Health Disparities Endowment Grants - Capacity Building

To strengthen the research and training infrastructure of the institution, while addressing current and emerging needs in minority health and other health disparities research.

S 22 Research and Student Resources Health Disparities Endowment Grants - Educational Programs

To increase the investment in student-centered programs: to improve the academic success of underrepresented minorities and socio-economically disadvantaged individuals in biomedical and bio-behavioral fields of study.

Training Programs(##)**T L1 Linked Training Award**

To support research training experiences for pre-doctoral trainees who are interested in pursuing research careers in multi-disciplinary clinical and translational science. The training award is administratively linked to another project or projects. A TL1 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for a TL1, Linked Training Award. The TL1 is used in lieu of the T32 for those programs that offer linked awards.

T U2 Institutional National Research Service Award with Involvement of NIH Intramural Faculty

The cooperative agreement counterpart to the T32, this award enables institutions to provide research-training experiences for graduate students and postdoctoral scientists in specified shortage areas. In addition, these awards involve identified NIH Intramural Staff who serve as a part of the training faculty and participate in the operation of the training program.

T 01 Graduate Training Programs

To assist and extend training of individuals preparing for research and academic careers in fundamental, preclinical, clinical, public health, and other disciplines related to the area of interest of the awarding Institute/Division.

T 02 Undergraduate Training Programs

To assist qualified institutions to improve and expand the training of undergraduate students in disciplines related to an area of interest of the awarding Institute/Division.

T 09 Scientific Evaluation

To provide the chairman of the training committee funds for operation of the review group.

T 14 Conferences

For support of international and national meetings, conferences and workshops.

T 15 Continuing Education Training Grants

To assist professional schools and other public and nonprofit institutions to establish, expand, or improve programs of continuing professional education, especially for programs of extensive continuation, extension, or refresher education dealing with new developments in the science of technology of the profession.

T 32 Institutional National Research Service Award

To enable institutions to make National Research Service Awards to individuals selected by them for predoctoral and postdoctoral research training in specified shortage areas.

T 34 MARC Undergraduate NRSA Institutional Grants

To enable minority institutions to make National Research Service Awards to individuals selected by them for undergraduate research training in the biomedical and behavioral sciences.

T 35 NRSA Short-Term Research Training

To provide individuals with research training during off-quarters or summer periods to encourage research careers and/or research in areas of national need.

T 36(##) MARC Ancillary Training Activities (Grant)

To increase the number of well-trained minority scientists in biomedical disciplines and to strengthen the research and teaching capabilities of minority institutions through a variety of training mechanisms such as visits by experienced scientists to minority institutions or workshops/conferences designed to enhance the research training experience of students/faculty from minority institutions.

T 37 Minority International Research Training Grants

Institutional training grants awarded to domestic institutions supporting opportunities for biomedical and behavioral research training for minority students and faculty members at foreign sites.

T 42 Educational Resource Center Training Grants

To provide assistance to regional centers in developing specialized personnel in the occupational safety and health field with academic training, research training, and continuing education and outreach in industrial hygiene, occupational health nursing, occupational medicine, and occupational safety.

T 90 Interdisciplinary Research Training Award

To support comprehensive interdisciplinary research training programs at the undergraduate, predoctoral and/or postdoctoral levels, by capitalizing on the infrastructure of existing multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary research programs.

Cooperative Agreements**U A1 AIDS Research Project Cooperative Agreement**

In cooperation with a named investigator, to support a discrete, specified, circumscribed project on Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome in an area representing the investigator's specific interest and competencies.

U C1 NIH Challenge Grants and Partnerships Program - Phase II Cooperative Agreements

To promote the implementation of joint ventures between the NIH and both domestic and global entities to facilitate rapid implementation of R&D in biomedical or biotechnology projects for infectious diseases that benefit public health and have a commercial potential that otherwise could not have been attained without matching funds.

Essential elements of grantee responsibility would include: 1) interim research and development of target goals upon whose achievement funds would be incrementally released to the awardee; 2) a single principle investigator who would be scientifically and administratively responsible for the project's research and development, and 3) a single applicant organization that would be legally and financially responsible for the funds awarded.

U C6 Construction Cooperative Agreement

To provide financial support, substantial programmatic involvement and technical assistance for designing, constructing and commissioning of laboratories to be used as extramural facilities for bio-defense and emerging infectious diseases research.

U C7 National Biocontainment Laboratory Operation Cooperative Agreement

To support core and shared resources for national biocontainment laboratories enabling them to develop and maintain the research resources and facilities needed to meet national, regional and local biodefense and emerging infectious diseases research needs. This support, by providing more accessible resources, is expected to assure greater productivity at the national biocontainment laboratories.

U D1(##) Mental Health and/or Substance Abuse KD&A Cooperative Agreements

To provide support to develop new knowledge about ways to improve the prevention and/or treatment of substance abuse and/or mental illness, and to work with State and local governments as well as providers, families, and consumers to apply that knowledge effectively in everyday practice. Outcome measures are the heart and core of the KD&As, do not provide operating funds for service programs, except as required by the knowledge development activity.

U H1 HBCU Research Scientist Award

To assist HBCUs in strengthening and augmenting their human resources by recruiting an established research scientist; to enhance the career of the recruited research scientist; and to strengthen other HBCU resources for the conduct of biomedical and/or behavioral research. The recruited research scientist must have received competitive and independent research support.

U L1 Linked Specialized Center Cooperative Agreement

To support clinical and translational research. The UL1 is administratively linked to another project or projects. A UL1 award may only be disaggregated from a U54 application and organizations may not apply for a UL1, Linked Specialized Center Cooperative Agreement. The UL1 Activity Code is used in lieu of the U54 for those programs that offer linked awards.

U R3 School Health: Findings from Evaluated Programs Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with eligible organizations, to review existing research and evaluations of a broad range of school health programs, and summarize and synthesize the results in order to draw conclusions about what is and is not effective and where more research is needed.

U R6 Prevention Intervention Research on Substance Abuse in Children Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with public and private nonprofit and for-profit organizations, to support research to determine the most effective interventions to change the developmental course of early predictor markers for substance abuse in children at several defined developmental stages.

U R8 Applied Research in Emerging Infections (including Tick-borne Diseases) Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with eligible organizations, to research emerging infections, such as tick borne diseases, through epidemiological studies and development and evaluation of diagnostic tests. Associated grant program under Activity Code RR8.

U S3 Hantaviral Reservoir Studies Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with eligible organizations, to study the behavior, movement, reproductive biology, population structure, and relative infection status of rodents such as Deer Mice in order to assess the risk to people of viral infection in peridomestic settings.

U S4 Community-Based Primary Prevention Programs: Intimate Partner Violence Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with non-profit community-based organizations, to develop, implement, expand the capacity of, and evaluate the process and outcomes of, programs for preventing intimate partner violence.

U T1(##) Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Cooperative Agreements – Phase I

To support cooperative research and development projects between small business concerns and research institutions, limited in time and amount, to establish the technical merit and feasibility of ideas that have potential for commercialization. Substantial NIH programmatic involvement is planned to assist the recipient. Awards are made to small business concerns only.

U T2 Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) Cooperative Agreements - Phase II

To support in-depth development of cooperative research and development projects between small business concerns and research institutions, limited in time and amount, whose feasibility has been established in Phase 1 and have potential for commercialization. Substantial NIH programmatic involvement is planned to assist the recipient. Awards are made to small business concerns only.

U 01 Research Project Cooperative Agreements

To support a discrete, specified, circumscribed project to be performed by the named investigator(s) in an area representing his specific interest and competencies.

U 09 Scientific Review and Evaluation Cooperative Agreements

To provide the chairman of an initial review group funds for operation of the review group.

U 10 Cooperative Clinical Research Cooperative Agreements

To support clinical evaluation of various methods of therapy and/or prevention in specific disease areas. These represent cooperative programs between sponsoring institutions and participating principal investigators, and are usually conducted under established protocols.

U 11 Study (in China) of Periconceptional Vitamin Supplements to Prevent Spina Bifida and Anencephaly Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with the Beijing Medical University (BMU) of the People's Republic of China, to support a project undertaken by BMU to conduct a randomized controlled trial in china to determine whether vitamins, taken before pregnancy begins and through the first trimester, prevent spina bifida and anencephaly. The project will consist of an initial preparation stage and a 1-2 year pilot study which will document the potential for a full-scale randomized controlled trial.

U 13 Conference Cooperative Agreements

To support international, national or regional meetings, conferences and workshops where substantial programmatic involvement is planned to assist the recipient.

U 17 Applied Methods in Violence-Related or Accidental Injury Surveillance Cooperative Agreements

Provides financial assistance to State and territorial health agencies to develop, implement, and/or evaluate new or existing methods and techniques used in accidental-injury and violence-related injury surveillance and /or prevention. Such injuries include violence against women; alcohol or firearm-related injury; bicycle or automobile-occupant injury; fire-related burns; head and spinal cord injury, and others. These methods and techniques are applicable to statewide injury surveillance systems and are replicable in other public health jurisdictions.

U 18 Research Demonstration Cooperative Agreements

To provide support for testing, by means of a research design, the effectiveness of the transfer and application of techniques or interventions derived from a research base for the control of diseases or disorders or for the promotion of health. The project should be capable of making conclusions which are generalizable to other sites. These are usually cooperative programs between participating principal investigators, institutions, and the sponsoring Institute(s).

U 19(###) Research Program Cooperative Agreements

To support a research program of multiple projects directed toward a specific major objective, basic theme or program goal, requiring a broadly based, multidisciplinary and often long-term approach. A cooperative agreement research program generally involves the organized efforts of large groups, members of which are conducting research projects designed to elucidate the various aspects of a specific objective. Substantial Federal programmatic staff involvement is intended to assist investigators during performance of the research activities, as defined in the terms and conditions of award. The investigators have primary authorities and responsibilities to define research objectives and approaches, and to plan, conduct, analyze, and publish results, interpretations and conclusions of their studies. Each research project is usually under the leadership of an established investigator in an area representing his/her special interest and competencies. Each project supported through this mechanism should contribute to or be directly related to the common theme of the total research effort. The award can provide support for certain basic shared resources, including clinical components, which facilitate the total research effort. These scientifically meritorious projects should demonstrate an essential element of unity and interdependence.

U 1A Capacity Building for Core Components of Tobacco Prevention and Control Programs Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with State health agencies, to 1) supplement existing tobacco control efforts and provide assistance in the development of the essential components of a comprehensive public health tobacco control program, or 2) develop the infrastructure in preparation for carrying out a tobacco control program.

U 1Q Emergency Disaster Relief Relating to CDC Programs Cooperative Agreement

In cooperation with eligible State health departments, to provide assistance to States impacted by designated natural disasters to assess the health threats and address health issues associated with the disaster, and to restore CDC-related public health programs that were impacted by the disaster.

U 1V Electronic Networking: Prevention of Violence Against Women Cooperative Agreement

In cooperation with State Domestic Violence Coalitions (SDVCs) currently funded by the Administration on Children and Families, DHHS, under the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act, to develop a pilot project to determine the feasibility and effectiveness of an electronic network with three main functions: file exchange and storage; electronic mail; and message areas for group discussion.

U 23 Tuberculosis Prevention and Control Services for Racial and Ethnic Minorities Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with national and regional racial and ethnic minority nonprofit organizations, to strengthen and increase the effectiveness of tuberculosis prevention and treatment services for racial and ethnic minority populations (especially the 25-44 years old age group); to improve organizational capabilities, programmatic efforts, and coordination of tuberculosis awareness; and to promote tuberculosis prevention and control, information dissemination, and training and education.

U 24 Resource-Related Research Projects Cooperative Agreements

To support research projects contributing to improvement of the capability of resources to serve biomedical research.

U 27 Surveillance of Complications of Hemophilia Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with State public health agencies, to characterize the epidemiology of hemophilia and its complications by using surveillance methodologies such as data collection, interviews, and progress reports. The data collected through this program can assist hemophilia treatment providers and States in developing, implementing, and evaluating education and prevention programs designed to reduce the morbidity, mortality, and costs of hemophilia and its complications.

U 2G(##) Global HIV/AIDS Non-Research Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with other countries, international organizations, and other partners to conduct HIV/AIDS prevention, care and treatment of non-research activities in international countries most heavily affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

U 2R International Training Cooperative Agreement

In cooperation with public and private nonprofit organizations, to improve and strengthen epidemiology, clinical, operational, and health services research capacity in foreign countries through support of training programs.

U 30 Preventive Health Services: Venereal Disease Research, Demonstration, and Public Information and Education Projects

Cooperative Agreements to provide assistance to programs designed for the conduct of research, demonstration, and public information and education for the prevention and control of venereal disease.

U 32 State-based Diabetes Control Programs

In cooperation with State health agencies: To reduce the effect of preventable problems in service delivery to diabetics (such as excess days of hospitalization, high amputation rates, and the effect of insurance policy on securing care), to define the preventable service delivery problems, and to demonstrate improved service delivery to diabetics.

U 36 Program Improvements for Schools of Public Health

In cooperation with the Associated Schools of Public Health, to stimulate improvements in the educational programs of schools of public health.

U 38 Uniform National Health Program Reporting System

In cooperation with the States to operate a uniform national health program reporting system, which is to provide data for analytical purposes to assist health planners and health program managers in their decision-making processes.

U 41 Biotechnology Resource Cooperative Agreements

To support biotechnology resources available to all qualified investigators without regard to the scientific disciplines or disease orientations of their research activities or specifically directed to a categorical program area.

U 42 Animal (Mammalian and Nonmammalian) Model, and Animal and Biological Materials Resource Cooperative Agreements

To develop and support animal (mammalian and nonmammalian) model, or animal or biological materials resources available to all qualified investigators without regard to the scientific disciplines or disease orientations of their research activities or specifically directed to a categorical program. Nonmammalian resources include nonmammalian vertebrates, invertebrates, cell systems, and nonbiological systems.

U 43 Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Cooperative Agreements - Phase I

To support projects, limited in time and amount, to establish the technical merit and feasibility of R&D ideas that may ultimately lead to commercial products or services.

U 44 Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) Cooperative Agreements - Phase II

To support in-depth development of R&D ideas whose feasibility has been established in Phase I and that are likely to result in commercial products or services.

U 45(##) Hazardous Waste Worker Health and Safety Training Cooperative Agreements

To develop, implement, and evaluate programs to train workers who are or may be engaged in activities related to hazardous waste removal, containment, or emergency response.

U 47 Laboratory/Other Diagnostic Medical Quality Improvement Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with public or private health-related organizations, to establish data collection networks or other methods to increase the effectiveness of primary care physicians in determining the level and impact of problems in laboratory testing, or in other services for diagnosis of health problems, by determining what problems exist; how often problems occur; what impact these problems have on patient care, and what interventions can be developed to improve the disease testing or control process.

U 48 Health Promotion and Disease Prevention Research Centers

In cooperation with schools of public health, medicine, or osteopathy, to establish and maintain interdisciplinary academic centers focused on health issues or themes of national importance and to promote translation of the results of the school's research into improved public health practice.

U 49 Cooperative Agreements for Injury Control Research and Demonstration Projects and Injury Prevention Research Centers

In cooperation with public and private nonprofit and for-profit organizations to conduct research and demonstration projects as well as training programs to develop a comprehensive and integrated approach to injury control. This is to include those directed toward violence toward women, intimate partners, and youth. These projects will integrate aspects of the disciplines of engineering, public health, behavioral sciences, medicine, and others in order to prevent and control injuries.

U 50 Special Cooperative Investigations and Assessments of Control and Prevention Methods

In cooperation with State or local government or other health-related organization, to perform special investigations of communicable diseases and other preventable health conditions, or to evaluate special methods of preventing disease or controlling health conditions.

U 51 Health Planning Strategies/National Academy of Sciences Activities

Financial support for activities of interest to the Public Health Service, primarily, support for a series of Boards to oversee a variety of health and health administration topics.

U 52 Cooperative Agreement for Tuberculosis Control

In cooperation with State and local health departments, to reduce the number of tuberculosis cases by case finding and follow-up of patient compliance with treatment.

U 53 Capacity Building in Occupational Safety and Community Environmental Health

In cooperation with State and local health departments to expand State capacities in the area of occupational safety and community environmental public health.

U 54(###) Specialized Center Cooperative Agreements

To support any part of the full range of research and development from very basic to clinical; may involve ancillary supportive activities such as protracted patient care necessary to the primary research or R&D effort. The spectrum of activities comprises a multidisciplinary attack on a specific disease entity or biomedical problem area. These differ from program project in that they are usually developed in response to an announcement of the programmatic needs of an Institute or Division and subsequently receive continuous attention from its staff. Centers may also serve as regional or national resources for special research purposes, with funding component staff helping to identify appropriate priority needs.

U 56 Exploratory Grants Cooperative Agreements

To support planning for new programs, expansion or modification of existing resources, and feasibility studies to explore various approaches to the development of interdisciplinary programs that offer potential solutions to problems of special significance to the mission of the NIH. These exploratory studies may lead to specialized or comprehensive centers. Substantial Federal programmatic staff involvement is intended to assist investigators during performance of the research activities, as defined in the terms and conditions of award.

U 57 State-Based Comprehensive Breast/Cervical Cancer Control Program Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with State and territorial health agencies, to develop comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control programs, increasing screening and follow-up among all groups of women in the State or territory, with special efforts to reach women who are of low income, uninsured, underinsured, minority, or Native American.

U 58 Chronic Disease Control Cooperative Agreement

In cooperation with State and local public health agencies and other public or private organizations to assist in controlling and preventing chronic diseases. Efforts are directed at the integrated application of surveillance; applied epidemiology; laboratory sciences; evaluation; health education; dynamic and productive relationships; training; and extensive applied management of effective disease control programs.

U 59 Disabilities Prevention Cooperative Agreement Program

In cooperation with State and local agencies or private organizations, to conduct and evaluate interventions to prevent disabilities and to support demonstration and epidemiology programs for States in building capacity to coordinate disability prevention activities.

U 60 Cooperative Agreements in Occupational Safety and Health Research, Demonstrations, Evaluation and Education

In cooperation with universities or other eligible recipients, to investigate the underlying characteristics and causes of occupational safety and health problems; to eliminate or control factors in the work environment which are harmful to the health and/or safety of workers, or to demonstrate effective solutions for occupational safety and health problems.

U 61 Preventive Health Activities Regarding Hazardous Substances

In cooperation with State and local health authorities, to provide programs and activities designed to protect the public from exposure to hazardous substances, and to protect the worker from hazards associated with hazardous waste removal or other remedial response actions.

U 62 Prevention/Surveillance Activities/Studies of AIDS

In cooperation with the State and local public health authorities and other non-profit organizations, to assist in detecting and preventing the further spread of AIDS through active surveillance and epidemiologic investigation, sero-prevalence surveys, laboratory services, public information campaigns, health education and risk reduction activities, and counseling, testing and partner notification.

- U 65(###) **Minority/Other Community-Based Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Prevention Project Cooperative Agreements**
- In cooperation with non-profit organizations based in communities most heavily affected by the HIV epidemic, to assist in achieving a reduction of the risk of HIV transmission through education programs.
- U 66 **Immunization Demonstration Projects Cooperative Agreements**
- Provides financial assistance to State and local health agencies and other public and non-profit entities for (1) assessment of projects to develop methods/strategies to effectively assess preschool-age immunization protection at the State or county level and/or (2) intervention projects to develop innovative ways to successfully identify and vaccinate preschool-age children living in inner-city, high-disease morbidity areas.
- U 75 **National Program of Cancer Registries Cooperative Agreements**
- In cooperation with State health agencies or eligible academic or other nonprofit organizations, to establish a national program of cancer registries by supporting and enhancing existing State cancer registries so that they are statewide and population-based, and by planning, implementing, and supporting statewide population-based cancer registries where State registries do not currently exist.
- U 79 **Mental Health and/or Substance Abuse Services Cooperative Agreements**
- To support the provision of mental health and/or substance abuse prevention and treatment services. These are cooperative programs between participating principal investigators. Organizations and sponsoring Centers and where substantial programmatic involvement is planned to assist the recipient.
- U 81 **Injury Community Demonstration Projects for the Evaluation of Youth Violence Prevention Programs Cooperative Agreements**
- In cooperation with qualified recipients to design, implement, and determine the effectiveness of multifaceted, community-based youth violence prevention programs in reducing the incidence of interpersonal violent behavior and associated injuries and deaths.
- U 82 **Enhancement of State and Local Capacity to Assess the Progress toward Healthy People 2010 Objectives**<Title/Definition Revised>
- In cooperation with State and local health agencies and Federally-recognized Indian Tribes, to increase the assessment capacity of State and local health agencies and to develop new surveillance models to measure currently under assessed conditions or populations.
- U 83 **Research to Advance the Understanding of the Health of Racial and Ethnic Populations or Subpopulations Cooperative Agreements**
- In cooperation with public and private non-profit organizations, to advance the understanding of the health of racial and ethnic populations or subpopulations through 1) special studies and analyses to improve existing knowledge, and 2) improvements in existing research methodological techniques used to gather information on these groups.
- U 84 **Cooperative Agreements for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Prevention Research Programs**
- In cooperation with qualified recipients, to develop methods for identifying women at high risk for having children with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome or other adverse alcohol effects, to design primary prevention strategies for these women, and to rigorously evaluate the effectiveness of these strategies.

U 87(##) State Demonstration Projects: Comprehensive School Health Programs to Prevent Sexual Behaviors that Result in HIV Infection and to Improve Educational Outcomes Cooperative Agreements

In cooperation with State education agencies of the States with specified high total mortality rates, to strengthen the capacity of those States to plan, implement, and evaluate effective comprehensive school health programs to prevent sexual behaviors that result in HIV infection. This program is a companion to U86.

U 90 Cooperative Agreements for Special Projects of National Significance (SPNS)

In cooperation with State and local public health agencies and other public or private nonprofit entities, to conduct HIV service-related projects which meet the criteria for funding and target one of the specified priority areas. The primary purpose of the SPNS program is to contribute to the advancement of knowledge and skill in the delivery of health and support services to persons with HIV disease.

V Programs**V F1 Rape Prevention and Education Grants**

Provides financial assistance to States for rape prevention and education programs conducted by rape crisis centers, State sexual assault coalitions, and other public and private nonprofit entities for: educational seminars, operation of hotlines, training for professionals, preparation of informational material; education and training for college and university students and personnel to reduce sexual assault; and awareness programs. The awards are based on a formula.

Formula Grants**X 01 Resource Access Award**

In cooperation with public and private nonprofit organizations, for-profit organizations and Federal laboratories, to invite investigators to seek access for their high throughput screening assays to the Molecular Libraries Screening Centers Network.

X 02 Pre-application

In cooperation with public and private nonprofit organizations, for-profit organizations and Federal laboratories, to invite investigators to submit pre-applications (also known as “white papers” or “présis”) for those funding opportunities that employ a pre-application as a part of the peer review process.

GLOSSARY(##)

- Activity – A broad group or category applied to various funding mechanisms for the purpose of monitoring, special reporting, and accountability; for example, the “R” category covers several types of research projects (e.g., R01, R29, R37, etc.), whereas the “F” activity category covers various types of fellowship grants (e.g. F32, F35, etc.), and the “U” activity category covers various types of cooperative agreements.
- Activity Code – (Also called Instrument Code) A 3-character code used to identify areas of extramural research activity applied to various funding mechanisms. Activity codes, titles and definitions are found in Table 3 of this handbook.
- Administering Code – (Also called Administering Organization Code, Awarding Organization Code, Admin Code, Admin PHS Org Code, IC Code, Organizational Code, Org Code.) A code that identifies the organization that supports a grant, contract, or inter-agency agreement. The support may be financial or administrative. See Table 1 of this handbook.
- Administrative Code – (obsolete) - Together the awarding organization code and the activity code for a particular award is sometimes called its “administrative code” and is used as a broad reference to the purpose of a grant. Part or all of this code appears in the grant number. i.e. **AI**R01 – “Awarding Organization Code - **AI**: National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases Extramural Activities” “Activity Code - **R01**: Research Project”.
- Awarding Organization Code - (Also called Administering Organization Code, Admin Code, Admin PHS Org Code, IC Code, Organizational Code, Org Code.) A code that identifies the organization that supports a grant, contract, or inter-agency agreement. The support may be financial or administrative. See Table 1 of this handbook.
- Contracts - An award of financial assistance used to acquire property or services for the federal government’s direct benefit Research and development (R&D) contracts are awarded to academic institutions and other non-profit and commercial organizations to procure specific activities for scientific inquiries, in particular areas of research and development needed by the NIH. Contract performance is monitored closely by the NIH staff to ensure accomplishment of the research goals.
- Cooperative Agreements – A support mechanism used when there will be substantial Federal scientific or programmatic involvement. Substantial involvement means that, after award, scientific or program staff will assist, guide, coordinate, or participate in project activities.
- [CRISP \(Computer Retrieval of Information on Scientific Projects\)](#) is a biomedical database system containing information on research projects and programs supported by the Department of Health and Human Services. Most of the research falls within the broad category of extramural projects, grants, contracts, and cooperative agreements conducted primarily by universities, hospitals, and other research institutions; and funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and other government agencies.
- eRA - The **e**lectronic **R**esearch **A**dministration (eRA) is the NIH infrastructure that provides for the secure receipt, review and administration of electronic grants. eRA provides full grant life-cycle systems: from initiative management, through receipt, referral to proper reviewers, electronically assisted review, flexible award processing, post award program management and oversight, fiscal administration, reporting and closeout.
- [eRA Commons](#) - The Commons is a Web interface hosted by NIH where agencies using the eRA System and the grantee community are able conduct their extramural research administration business electronically.
- eRA System - The integrated system comprised of two main interfaces: the internal system, [IMPAC II](#), used by DHHS/NIH staff; and the external system, the [eRA Commons](#), accessed by the grantee community through the Internet. eRA also supports electronic submission of grant applications through [Grants.gov](#)
- Funding mechanisms: grants, contracts, and cooperative agreements.

- Grant - Financial assistance funding mechanism providing money, property, or both to an eligible entity to carry out an approved project or activity. A grant is used whenever an Agency anticipates no substantial programmatic involvement with the recipient during performance of the financially assisted activities.
- Human Subject - as it pertains to research is a living individual about whom an investigator conducting research obtains 1) data through [intervention](#) or interaction with the individual, or 2) identifiable private information.
- IC CODE – (Also called Administering Organization Code, Administering Code, Admin Code, Admin PHS Org Code, Awarding Organization Code, Organizational Code, Org Code.) – An NIH term for Institute, Center Code. Formally ICD Code: Institute, Centers, and Divisions Code. A code that identifies the organization that supports a grant, contract, or inter-agency agreement. The support may be financial or administrative. See Table 1 of this handbook.
- [IMPAC II](#) - IMPAC II (**I**nformation for **M**anagement, **P**lanning, **A**nalysis, and **C**oordination) is the successor to NIH's original IMPAC information management system.
- Instrument Code – (obsolete) – Another name for Activity Code.
- Inter-agency Agreement - A written arrangement between one or more NIH components and one or more government entities outside of the NIH, all of which must have the statutory authority to engage in the arrangement. Such agreements may include, but are not limited to, arrangements to receive and/or provide services, supplies, advice and counsel, involving the exchange of funds.
- Intra-agency Agreement - A written arrangement between/among NIH components, all of which must have the statutory authority to engage in the arrangement.
- Organizational Code – (Also called Organization Code, Org Code, Administering Organization Code, Administering Code, Admin Code, Admin PHS Org Code, Awarding Organization Code, and IC code) A code that identifies the organization that supports a grant, contract, or inter-agency agreement. The support may be financial or administrative. See Table 1 of this handbook.
- Programs - Areas within the funding mechanisms for example research, training, fellowships, and cooperative agreements. Program listing is found on Table 2 of this handbook.
- Vertebrate Animal Research - Any live, vertebrate animal used or intended for use in research, research training, experimentation, or biological testing or for related purposes.
