Needs

Research Project Issues

- Efficient harvesting of cashmere
- Marketing of value-added cashmere
- Reducing off-farm expenditures for forage and high protein supplements
- Timing of kidding to capture “high-value” seasonal markets
- Reducing and controlling internal parasites

Cashmere Yield (%) by weight

Sheared Fleece 15.6% - 21.4%

Combed Fleece 73.6% - 93.2%
