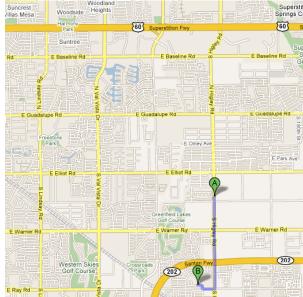
### Arizona Farm Bureau (A) to Agritopia (B)

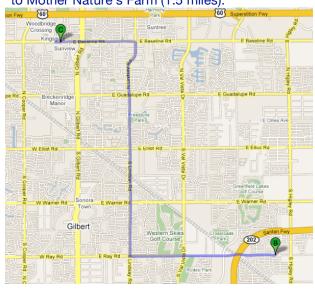
Head south on Higley Rd. (1.6 miles), then right

Julie Murphree is Director of public relations for Arizona Farm Bureau where she oversees two publications, public relations, marketing, and sponsorship duties. She works for the Dept. of Health Services with local agencies, farmers' markets, and growers to help Arizonans eat more fresh fruits and vegetables and support local markets and farmers.
