he Library of Congress maintains a number of controlled vocabularies used in various standards. For example, there are a number of code lists (e.g., languages, countries, geographic areas) used in MARC records, controlled

value lists in the PREMIS preservation metadata standard and subject thesauri used in various metadata standards. This presentation outlines the development of a Web service which will make this data available, the vocabularies included, the use of SKOS (Simple Knowledge Organization System) for data encoding and the possible benefits of providing such a service.
