What are Best Practices?

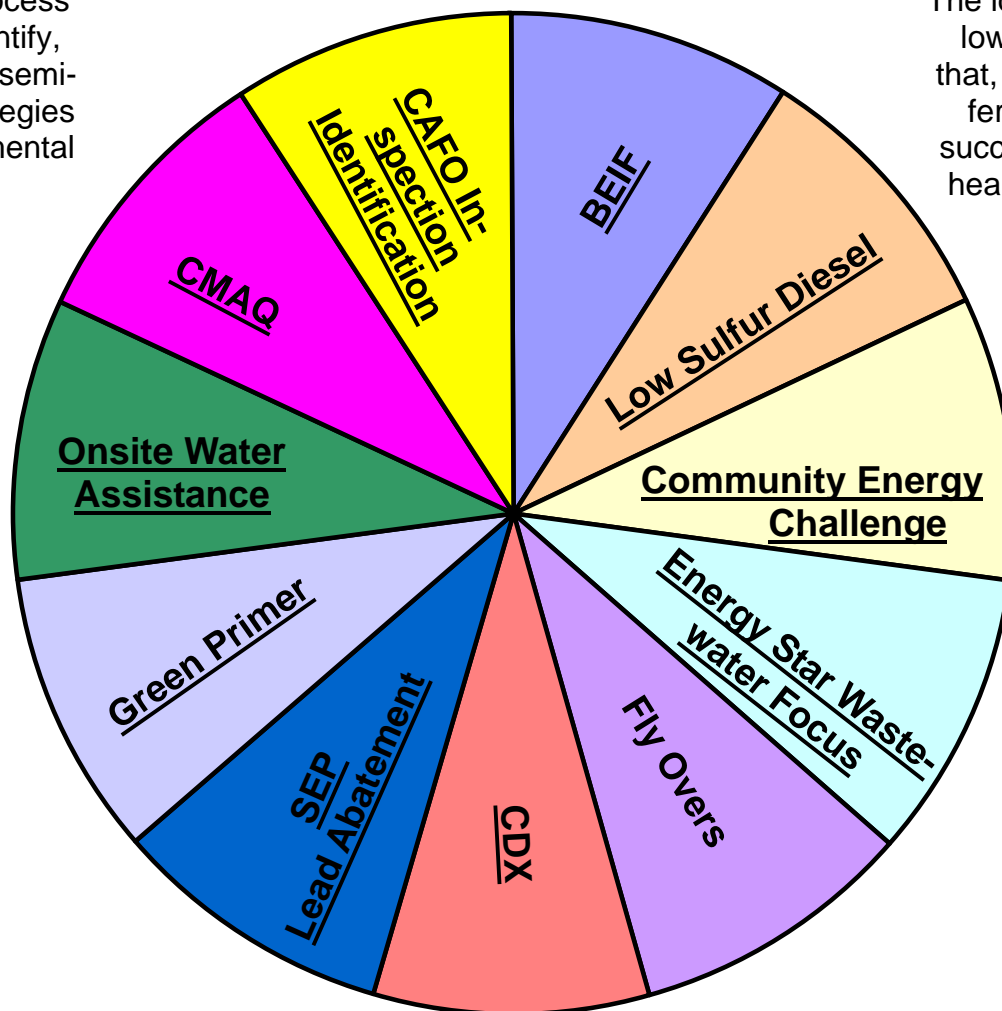
Best Practices refer to a process implemented by EPA to identify, examine, document and disseminate actions, tools and strategies that are producing environmental results.

Best Practices range from internal Agency operations such as timeliness of regulatory development or grant closeouts to program implementation like compliance assistance at dairies. There are no minimum requirements other than an activity that, if shared, may lead to greater success in protecting human health and the environment.

Why are Best Practices Important?

The idea is to identify and follow-up on methods or tools that, if expanded on or transferred, may lead to greater success in protecting human health and the environment.
