The UNTL Metadata Guidelines: UNTL to MODS Crosswalk

UNTL to MODS Mapping

Mapping among the widely used metadata elements is important in order to facilitate accurate conversions among various metadata element sets. Accordingly, the UNTL to Metadata Object Description Schema (MODS) Crosswalk will enable harvesting of data from MODS-compatible records to populate our UNTL metadata records.

The MODS carries selected data from existing MARC 21 records and enables the creation of original resource description records. It includes a subset of MARC fields and uses language-based tags rather than numeric ones-in some cases regrouping elements from the MARC 21 bibliographic format. MODS uses the XML schema language of the World Wide Web Consortium. The Network Development and MARC Standards Office of the Library of Congress maintains the MODS standard with input from users. Please note that preservation metadata elements listed and defined by UNTL have not been included in the UNTL to MODS crosswalk, because they are not generally found in MODS, DC, and MARC. Moreover, when multiple UNTL elements are equivalent to one MODS, DC, and/or MARC element, some metadata will be lost in conversion.
