FEDERAL HOUSING FINANCE BOARD SCHEDULES SECOND HEARING ON GOVERNANCE OF FEDERAL HOME LOAN BANKS

The Federal Housing Finance Board will hear from experts on board governance as well as representatives of the Federal Home Loan Banks on Tuesday, February 10th, when it holds the second of two public hearings on governance practices at the Banks.

The hearing, set for 10 a.m., follows a January 23rd public session at which the Finance Board took testimony from trade associations.

"Our first hearing produced a wealth of opinions, observations, ideas, and recommendations about how to achieve the highest standards of governance at these 12 large government-sponsored enterprises," Chairman John T. Korsmo said. "I look forward to hearing now from experts who have studied these issues, as well as Home Loan Bank directors who must deal with them day to day."

The hearings are designed to collect information about possible changes to Finance Board regulations or to the Federal Home Loan Bank Act to help the boards of directors of the Banks to better identify, measure, monitor, and control the risks on the Banks' balance sheet.
