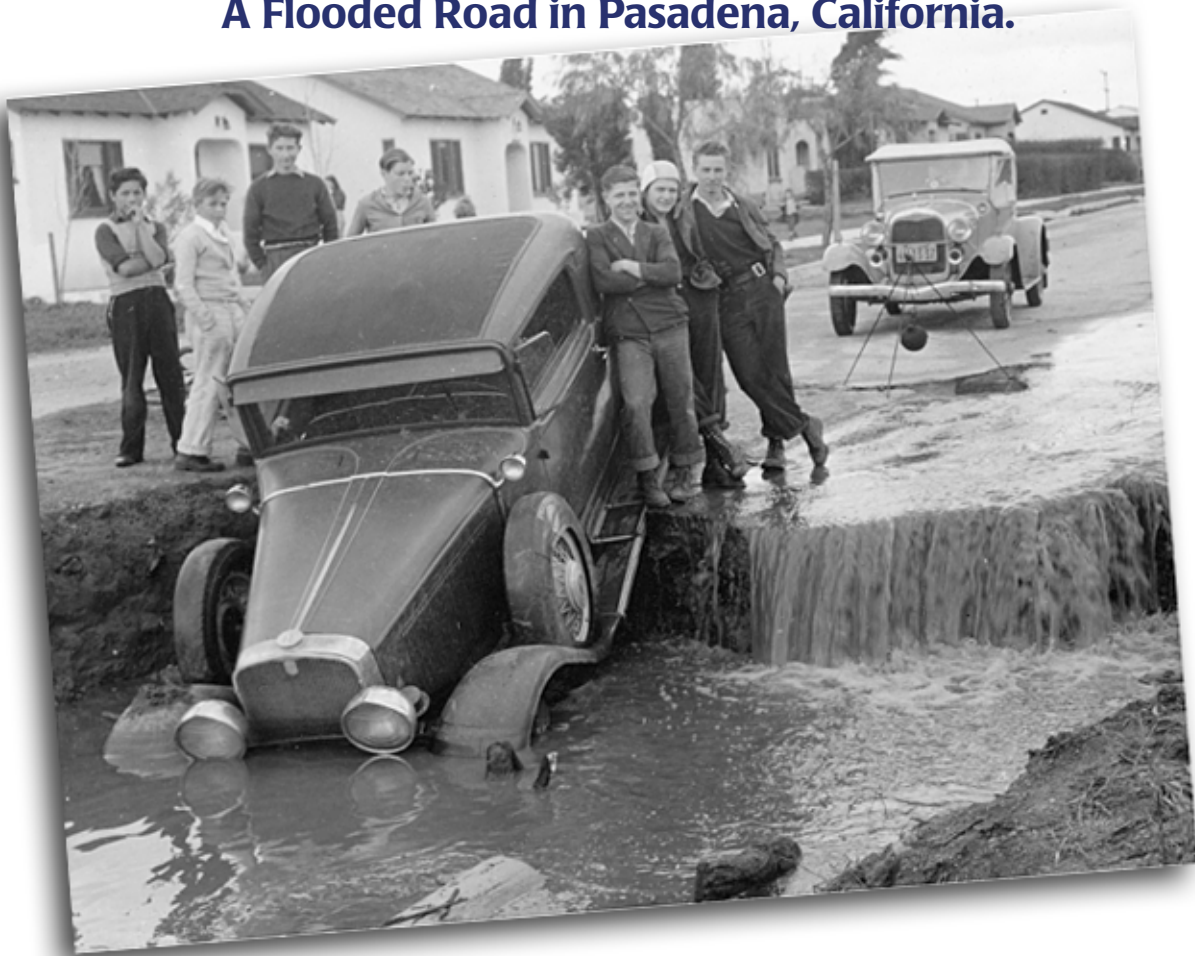

Document of the Month

A Flooded Road in Pasadena, California.



In 1936, the United States Army Corps of Engineers became responsible for all Federal flood control projects. The Los Angeles District was responsible for flood control in southern California, including the Los Angeles and Santa Ana Rivers. The topography of the area made it prone to extremely severe, periodic flooding. The Los Angeles River runs at the same elevation as the Mississippi River, but experiences its entire amount of drop in only 50 miles. The Army Corps of Engineers studied the 1938 Santa Ana River flood very closely, developing from the data a plan to control southern California's wild rivers. Their strategy for containing the rivers was to establish a series of basins to collect mud and debris in the foothills, build flood control basins to regulate downstream

flow and to "rectify and stabilize the natural channels throughout the entire coastal plain for rapid drainage." Thus the rivers were encased in concrete channels.

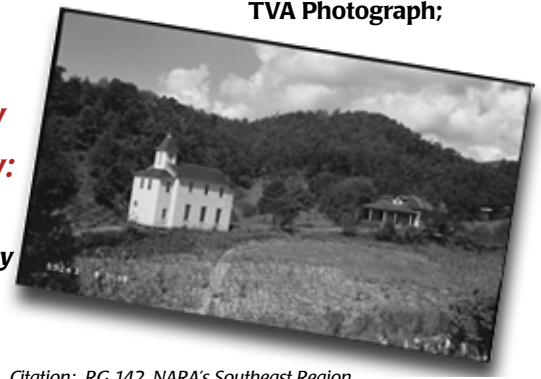
The holdings of the National Archives – Pacific Region (Laguna Niguel) show the efforts of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to obtain funding for Santa Ana River flood control projects. The Army Corps thoroughly documented the 1938 flood in photographs and technical data to justify the creation of the infrastructure necessary to keep the water at bay.

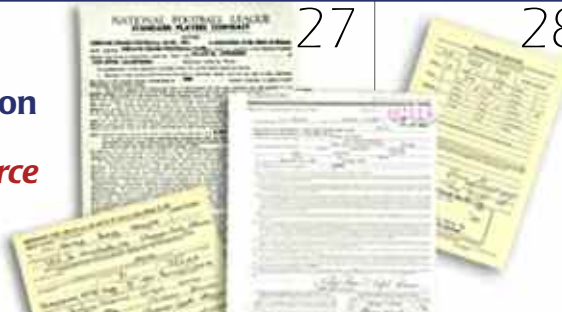

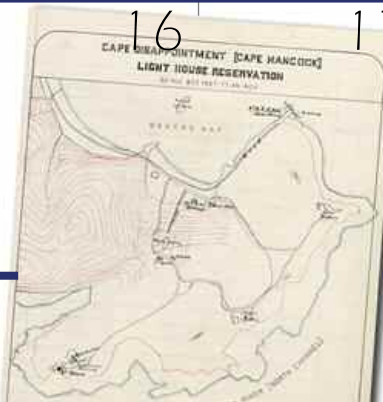
