## Message in a Bottle A. Richard Sadon's Tragic Last Words

INTER-DEPARTMENTAL CONNEGPONDENCE

"The ship is making water fast. We have turned around

and headed for

Milwaukee.
Pumps are working but sea gate is bent in and can't keep the water out.
Flicker is flooded.
Seas are tremendous. Things look bad. Crew roll is about the same as last payday."

Purser A. Richard Sadon's final written words hauntingly describe the tragic

end to the Lake Michigan railroad car ferry *Milwaukee*. On the night of October 22, 1929, shortly after the 350-foot car ferry *Milwaukee* departed its namesake city with a load of railroad cars bound for Grand Haven on Michigan's western shoreline, the ship sank in a storm. Captain Robert iHeavy Weatherî McKay, Sadon, and the crew of approximately 46, all died either from drowning or exposure in the frigid waters.

Captain McKay, Sadon, and the *Milwaukee's* crew routinely crossed Lake Michigan's treacherous waters. Car ferries daily hauled loaded railroad cars back and forth across the lake to avoid the long roundabout rail trip along its southern shoreline. This night, however, turned disastrous as a series of events, alluded to in Sadon's handwritten note, spelled catastrophe for the ship and its crew.

Sadon, the Milwaukee's 38-year-old purser, placed the note in a water-tight message case shortly before the ship plunged beneath the heavy waves. The message said that the Milwaukee was taking on water at an alarming rate through the vessel's bent sea gate. The sea gate was a single gate on the ship's stern that while in port, could be raised or lowered to allow railroad cars to roll onto, and off of, the ferry. The gate was closed during runs across the lake, and while not water tight, prevented waves from breaking over the ship's car deck. Sadon's note also mentions that the flicker, or the crew quarters below deck, was flooded.

The damaged and battered case washed ashore several days later and was discovered on October 27, near Saugatuck,

Michigan, by a crew member from a nearby U. S. Coast Guard Station. The tragic note subsequently became an exhibit in an admiralty court case heard in the U. S. District Court in Milwaukee regarding liability for the ship's loss. The records, from Record Group 21, Records of District Courts of the United States, are available for review at the National Archives and Records Administration-Great Lakes Region, Chicago.
