TAMA Indian Industry Survey

In March 1922, Charles H. Burke, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, initiated a program to survey every Native American household and individual living on Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) jurisdictions. The surveys evaluated the physical condition of homes, individual health, housekeeping and child nurturing skills, and, most importantly, how industrious individual Native Americans were as farmers or in another occupation. Most surveys were conducted in 1923. Approximately 100 surveys of distinct Indian communities were made.

The National Archives and Records Administration—Great Lakes Region retains the records of two such surveys: one for the Lac du Flambeau Agency in

northern Wisconsin and the other, shown here, for the Sac and Fox Reservation at Tama, Iowa. These surveys offer a unique record of life on Indian reservations in the early 20th Century. They depict the concerns and effort of the BIA to encourage Native people to assume the values of the larger society and assimilate into it.

This image is part of the Tama survey. It depicts a family standing outside of their small home on the reservation. Photographs with residents standing in front of their dwellings are more prevalent in the Lac du Flambeau survey than the Tama survey. The presence or absence of individuals in photographs can be an indication of how the members of the communities felt about the local BIA administration.


