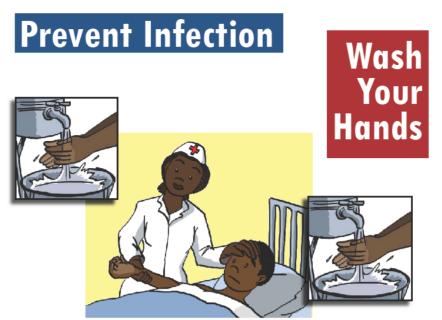

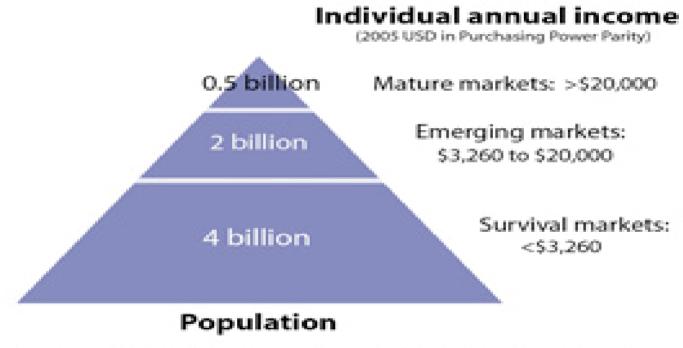

Most companies focus on mature and emerging markets, while the huge market of 4 billion people living on less than \$3,260 a year goes largely untapped.

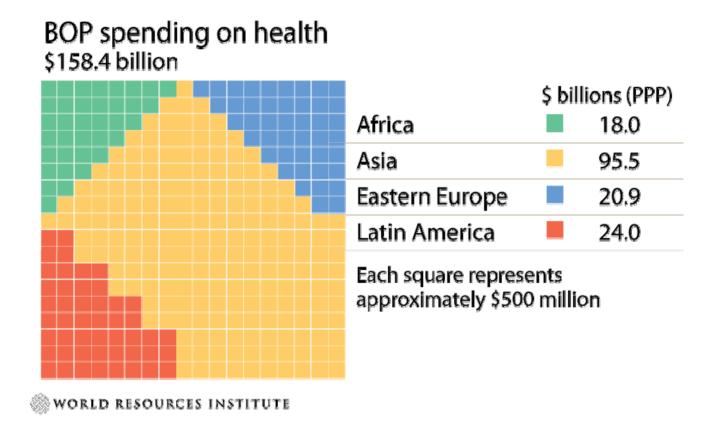

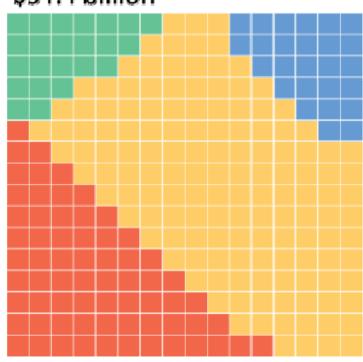

Health messaging with accompanying medical care can save 14 million deaths per year ~Savedoff, William "Prorities in Health"

- 2006: 1.1 B internet and 1.4 B mobile subscribers
 - Five-fold Growth in Five years
- **2009:** 2.6 B internet subscribers
 - •0.58 Billion subscribers in low & middle income countries
- **2010:** 2.4 Billion mobile subscribers
 - •1.92 B in developing countries with fastest growth in Sub-Saharan Africa

Private Partnerships in Practice: Health Dividends from Base of the Market Engagement (ICT Sector: A Natural Partner to Health Marketing)

Voxiva Global: Pyramid Platforms bring ICT for logistics, disease management, patient monitoring, surveillance.

Voxiva Peru: 50% reduction in maternal mortality via 2-way radios for midwives in Amazon

Voxiva Uganda: 25% Reduced surveillance time through PDAs and increased diagnostic quality

Vodacom South Africa: South Africa: Cell phones for infectious disease management TB/HIV (linked to Central Database)

DRISHTEE and SARI: Remote eye exams through 45,000 operational kiosks by 2003 (goal: 500,000 by 2010)

Radio Satellite and BBC Trust: Sudanese virtual community established via radio; health, governance, and women's issues discussed.
