A brief summary of the contents for each section is listed below for the convenience of the reader. A complete table of contents is shown at the beginning of each section and is identified by a narrow black edge which can be located easily by fanning the pages. Each section is paged independently, using the section number as the identifying prefix.

Section 1. Natality—Characteristics

Detailed frequency tabulations for each State, each metropolitan area, and other geographic areas of the United States. Data are shown by color, sex, nativity of white mother, month, age of mother and of father, birth order, attendant, birth weight, plurality, period of gestation, and legitimacy.

Section 2. Natality—Local Area Statistics

Frequency tabulations for each State, county, and city with a population of 10,000 or more by color and attendant and for urban and rural and metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas within each State by color, attendant, and birth weight.

Section 3. Natality—Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands

Trend of the crude birth rate. Frequency tabulations by various characteristics including sex, month of birth, age of mother and of father, birth order, attendant, birth weight, period of gestation, and legitimacy.

Section 4. Appendix

Text discussion of factors affecting the collection, classification, and interpretation of the natality statistics published in this volume. Includes population tables for computing vital rates.





Section 3. Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands (U.S.)

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NOTES

Occurrence and residence allocation

In contrast with the method of allocating births to place of residence for each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia, residence data for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico include only those births occurring in Puerto Rico. Births to non-residents of the Commonwealth are included in the total, but births to residents of Puerto Rico occurring elsewhere are excluded. The same qualification applies to resident live births in the Virgin Islands.

Data are shown by both place of occurrence and place of residence in Puerto Rico for the primary geographic subdivision, "municipio," and in the Virgin Islands for St. Croix Island and St. John and St. Thomas Islands (the latter two combined). Births by place of residence are not shown for urban places having a population of 10,000 or more in Puerto Rico, but they are shown for Charlotte Amalie in the Virgin Islands.

Race and color

For 1962, births are not shown by color for Puerto Rico; they are classified as white and nonwhite for the Virgin Islands.

Attendant at birth

In the United States, virtually all in-hospital births are attended by physicians; in Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, a large proportion of hospital births are attended by other than physicians.

Completeness of registration

Data for Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands refer to registered births; no adjustment has been made for possible underreporting. Tests of birth registration completeness were made for these areas in 1950, and the results are given in chapter 6 of Volume I, *Vital Statistics of the United States, 1950*.

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SECTION 4. TECHNICAL APPENDIX

SOURCES OF DATA

With the exceptions noted in the next paragraph, the natality tabulations for 1962 are based on information obtained from microfilm copies of the original certificates. These copies were received from the registration offices of all States, certain cities, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. The statistical information on these records was edited, classified, placed on punchcards, and tabulated in the National Vital Statistics Division (NVSD).

The 1962 birth statistics for California were produced by a somewhat different procedure. The vital statistics office of this State coded the information on its certificates according to the rules followed in NVSD. From punchcards prepared for its own use, the California Bureau of Vital Statistics reproduced the information required for national tabulations on uniform punchcard forms. The reproduced cards were verified and tabulated with the cards for the other areas.

The United States vital statistics system covers the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. However, in the statistical tabulations, *United States* refers only to the aggregate of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. Tabulations for Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands are shown separately in Section 3.

Birth data for the United States are confined to events registered within the United States and include events occurring to nonresident aliens. The data do not cover any vital events for U.S. citizens occurring outside the United States. Similarly, the data for Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands are confined to events registered in these areas.

Standard certificate

The Standard Certificate of Live Birth, issued by the National Vital Statistics Division, has served for many years as the principal means of attaining uniformity in the content of the documents used to collect information on this event. It has been modified in each State to the extent necessitated by the particular needs of the State or by special provisions of the State vital statistics law. However, the certificates of most States conform closely in content and arrangement to the standard certificate.

The first issue of the standard certificate of birth appeared shortly before the formation of the registration area. Since then it has been revised periodically by the national vital statistics agency through consultation with

State health officers and registrars; Federal agencies concerned with vital statistics; national, State, and county medical societies; and others working in the fields of public health, social welfare, demography, and insurance. This revision procedure has assured careful evaluation of each item in terms of its current and future usefulness for registration, identification, legal, medical, and research purposes. New items have been added when necessary, and old items have been modified to ensure better reporting or in some cases have been dropped when their usefulness appeared to be limited.

The most recent revision of the Standard Certificate of Live Birth occurred in 1955. It was made in close collaboration with the Public Health Conference on Records and Statistics and was recommended to the States for adoption as of January 1, 1956 (figure 4-A).

With a few exceptions, only minor changes in content and format were made in the 1956 revision of the standard certificate. In an effort to obtain a more accurate designation for place of residence, the question "Is residence inside city limits?" was added. Studies conducted in a few States had indicated that this question helped to correctly locate the residence of persons living near but outside the corporate limits of cities.

Table 4-1 indicates the States that did and those that did not include the checkbox item on residence within city limits on all or part of the certificate forms which they used during 1962.

HISTORY

The first birth statistics published by the Federal Government concerned events in 1850 and were for the entire United States. These statistics were based on information collected during the decennial census of that year. Similar decennial collections were made by census enumerators at each census up to and including the census of 1900, but because of the time interval between the occurrence of a birth and the census enumeration, these reports were inaccurate and incomplete.

The national birth-registration area was not established until 1915, and no birth statistics were published by the Bureau of the Census from 1900 to 1914. The original birth-registration area of 1915 consisted of 10 States and the District of Columbia. The growth of this area is indicated in table 4-2.

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Table 4-2 also presents for each year through 1932 the estimated midyear population of the United States and those States included in the registration system. From 1933 through 1958 the birth and death statistics for the United States included 48 States and the District of Columbia. Alaska was added in 1959 and Hawaii in 1960.

Because of the growth of the area for which data have

been collected and tabulated, a national series of geographically comparable data prior to 1933 can be obtained only by estimation. Annual estimates of births have been prepared by P. K. Whelpton for the period 1909-34 (table 1-2 in Section 1). These estimates include an adjustment for underregistration and for States not in the birth-registration area prior to 1933.

CLASSIFICATION OF DATA

The principal value of vital statistics data is obtained through the presentation of such data in the form of rates, which are computed by relating the vital events of a class to the population of a similarly defined class. Vital statistics and population statistics must therefore be classified ac-

ording to similarly defined systems and tabulated in comparable groups. Even when the variables common to both—such as geographic area, age, race, and sex—have been similarly classified and tabulated, differences between the enumeration method of obtaining population data and the registration method of obtaining vital statistics data may result in significant discrepancies.

The classification of certain important items is discussed below.¹

Classification by occurrence and residence

Beginning with 1960 statistics by place of occurrence, events were classified according to the county in which the vital event took place but were not classified to any smaller geographic unit. In the vital statistics for years prior to 1960, place of occurrence was classified by smaller units within the county in the same detail as are statistics by place of residence.

Place of residence in birth statistics refers to the geographic area which constituted the mother's usual residence at the time of the birth. The data by place of residence are classified to units within a county as follows: (1) each incorporated place of 10,000 inhabitants or more, (2) each unincorporated place of 10,000 inhabitants or more classified as urban under special rule, (3) the aggregate of incorporated places of 2,500 to 10,000 inhabitants and unincorporated places of this size defined as urban under special rule, and (4) the residual part of the county. For vital statistics purposes, the residual part of the county is referred to as rural.

For residence statistics, all events occurring within the United States, that is, the 50 States and the District of Columbia, are allocated to a place of residence within the United States. For nonresident aliens, the place of residence is considered to be the same as the place of occurrence. The events occurring within Puerto Rico are allocated to a residence in Puerto Rico and similarly for the Virgin Islands.

Residence error.—Tests made in 1950 indicate that for the country as a whole, errors in residence reporting result in a significant overstatement of births to residents of urban places and a corresponding understatement in the number to residents of areas classified as rural. The extent of bias varies from State to State and from city to city in the same State. Residence errors occur largely because of the major growth in population areas close to cities. Frequently, parts of these surrounding areas have city mailing addresses, and unless special care is taken in asking for residence information, they could be identified as being inside the cities. This situation has assumed special importance because of a concomitant development—the increased utilization of hospitals in cities by residents of nearby places. Misstatements of residence are more likely to remain undetected in such cases than when the birth occurs in the place of residence.

Item 2 on the Standard Certificate of Live Birth is "Usual residence of mother." In addition to asking for State, county, city, town, or location and street address, the standard certificate form includes the question "Is residence inside city limits?" Table 4-1 shows the States which include this item on their certificates. There is some evidence that use of this question has improved the accuracy of residence

reporting, but the degree of improvement is not known. For a variety of reasons, the information entered in item 2 does not always permit an accurate decision as to the proper allocation of residence.

In some cases, the place named in item 2c (city, town, or location) is actually a subdivision of a city. If the place named does not appear in the geographic code manual as a separate place, allocation is made to the "balance of county" unless there is some other information available to the coder. In some cases, the additional information consists of a residence code entered by the local registrar or by the State vital statistics office. In other cases, lists of place names which are actually inclusions of listed cities are furnished by the State offices. It is probable, however, that a number of certificates filled out in this manner are incorrectly coded for residence, either because additional information is not available or because information on hand is outdated. City boundaries might change, for example, without either the State vital statistics office or the National Vital Statistics Division being notified.

Many people receive their mail in a geographic subdivision other than that in which they live, and when asked for their place of residence, they give their correct mailing address. Thus proper use of the checkbox in item 2e (Is residence inside city limits?) will prevent allocation to the city named in 2c but does not necessarily assure correct allocation.

Geographic classification²

Standard metropolitan statistical areas.—The standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) used in this report are the same as those established by the Bureau of the Budget and used by the Bureau of the Census, except in the New England States.

In the other 44 States, an SMSA is a county or a group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000 in the 1960 census. In addition, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to specified criteria, they are (a) essentially metropolitan in character and (b) socially and economically integrated with the central city or cities.³

In the New England States, the Bureau of the Budget uses towns and cities rather than counties as geographic components of the SMSA. The National Vital Statistics Division cannot use the SMSA classification for these States because its data are not coded to identify all towns. Instead, the metropolitan State economic area (MSEA) established by the

Bureau of the Census, which is made up of county units, is used.⁴

Standard consolidated areas.—For the metropolitan complexes around New York and Chicago, several contiguous SMSA's and additional counties that do not appear to meet the formal integration criteria for SMSA's but do have strong interrelationships of other kinds have been combined into the New York-Northeastern New Jersey and the Chicago-Northwestern Indiana Standard Consolidated Areas.⁵

Metropolitan and nonmetropolitan counties.—Counties which are included in SMSA's or MSEA's (in New England) are called metropolitan counties; all other counties are classified as nonmetropolitan.

Urban and rural areas.—Vital statistics data for 1962 are classified as urban or rural according to the population of the area enumerated in the 1960 census.

The urban population consists of inhabitants residing in the following places:

1. Each incorporated city, borough, village, and town of 2,500 inhabitants or more (except towns in New England, New York, and Wisconsin).
2. Each town in New England and each township in New Jersey and Pennsylvania that has no incorporated municipality as a subdivision and has either 25,000 inhabitants or more or a population of 2,500 to 25,000 and a density of 1,500 persons or more per square mile.⁶
3. Each county in States other than the New England States, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania that has no incorporated municipality within its boundary and has a density of 1,500 persons or more per square mile.⁷

The rural population consists of inhabitants residing in all other areas.

This classification of urban population differs from the 1960 census definition. The latter definition includes, in addition, persons living in (a) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more not included in the above definition of "urban" and (b) incorporated and unincorporated places of less than 2,500 inhabitants located within urban fringes of urbanized areas.

It was not feasible to use the 1960 census definitions of urban and rural for classifying vital statistics data since (a) boundary delineations for many urban unincorporated places were made by the Bureau of the Census for enumeration purposes only; many unincorporated places do not conform to political units and their boundaries change with population growth; in most instances the residence information on vital records is insufficient to allocate residence to arbitrary delimitations of unincorporated areas; (b) vital statistics were not tabulated separately for places of less

than 2,500 inhabitants. The difference in the percent distribution of the population in 1960 according to NVSD and the Bureau of the Census is as follows:

Age of mother and birth order

The birth certificate asks for "Age (at time of this birth)." Some sources of minor errors in the age data are apparent. A small number of records are filed with age not reported, and some births are not registered. In previous reports, the small number of "not stated" ages were shown separately. In this report, not stated ages of mother have been distributed. However, the number of not stated ages of father is relatively large because information on the father is usually not stated for illegitimate births. Therefore these are shown separately and are not distributed. Measures of variation of completeness of registration with age of mother are available from tests of completeness in 1950 and 1940. They show that registration completeness is approximately the same for all ages, except for the oldest age group, where it is lower.⁹

The 1950 test of registration completeness indicated that registration completeness decreased slightly with each higher birth order. Whereas first births were 99 percent registered, eighth and higher order births were only 93 percent registered.¹⁰

The matched birth certificates and census records obtained in the same tests also provide information on the consistency of age reporting in these two sources. An analysis of the 1950 data indicates a high degree of consistency, particularly when the ages are combined in the usual 5-year age groups.¹¹

Differences in reported birth order are considerably greater, particularly for the higher orders. For each birth order, the order stated on the census record tends to be lower than that given on the birth certificate. It is probable, but not definitely known, that birth order is reported more accurately on the birth certificate than on the census record.

A small percentage of birth records in all States omit information on birth order. Prior to and including 1962, birth order was not coded or tabulated for births occurring in Massachusetts. Partial reporting of the item "Total number of children born alive previous to this birth" on the Massachusetts live birth certificate began in 1961; in 1962, the reporting of this item was judged to be insufficient to

code and tabulate birth order for live births occurring in this State. To obtain birth-order and parity-specific rates for the entire United States, estimates were included for Massachusetts.

Race and color

Births in the United States in 1962 are classified for vital statistics into white, Negro, American Indian, Chinese, Japanese, Aleut, Eskimo, Hawaiian and Part-Hawaiian combined, and "other nonwhite."

The category "white" includes, in addition to persons reported as "white," those reported as Mexican or Puerto Rican. With one exception, a reported mixture of Negro with any other race is included in the Negro group; other mixed parentage is classified according to the race of the nonwhite parent and mixtures of nonwhite races to the race of the father. The exception refers to a mixture of Hawaiian and any other race, which is classified as Part-Hawaiian. In most tables a less detailed classification of "white" and "nonwhite" is used.

Completeness of birth registration in 1962 for "white" births is estimated to be 99.3 percent and for "nonwhite" births 96.6 percent. The most recent figures for other groups are from the 1950 test which indicated registration completeness at that time to be 85.1 percent for American Indians and 97.4 percent for "other races," chiefly Chinese and Japanese. Both figures are probably higher for 1962, but more precise estimates are not available.

A comparison of the race designation in matched sets of birth certificates and census records from the 1950 registration completeness test indicates very high agreement for white persons and Negroes. There were, however, substantially fewer American Indians recorded on birth records than on census records.^{1,2}

New Jersey.—The State of New Jersey omitted the item on "color or race" from its certificate of live birth in 1962. Therefore it was necessary to make certain changes in processing and publishing the statistics.

In all tables giving data for individual States or their geographic subdivisions, the "color or race" classification is not shown for New Jersey.

In tables by place of residence all events for residents of States other than New Jersey have been classified by color or race. In the relatively infrequent cases where the event occurred in New Jersey to a resident of another State it was arbitrarily classified as "white." This was done to eliminate the "not stated" category in the many tables by place of residence.

In tables by place of occurrence the figures for "white" and "nonwhite" do not add to the total for some areas. This results from a decision to classify all residents of New Jersey as "color or race not stated," including cases in which the birth occurred in another State.

All statistics for the United States as a whole by color or race are affected by the lack of this information for New Jersey residents. As stated previously, all events to residents of New Jersey were classified as "color or race

not stated." In the annual volume tables this "not stated" category is not shown in the interest of space conservation; however, the frequencies of events classified as "color or race not stated" can be obtained in each table by subtracting from the totals for all races the sum of the events classified by color or race. For example, in table 1-1 in Section 1 the total number of live births for the United States is 4,167,362, of which 4,035,648 are classified by color—3,394,068 as white and 641,580 as nonwhite. The difference between the sum of the events classified by color and the total events—131,714—represents the live births to residents of New Jersey, events which were classified as "color or race not stated."

The absence of color or race information for New Jersey live births affects all birth rates classified by color or race for the total United States. This results from the fact that it was not possible to obtain denominators by color to correspond to the natality data with New Jersey excluded because intercensal population estimates by age, color, and sex are not available for individual States. Therefore, in order to prepare birth rates by color for the United States it was necessary to make estimates of the United States population by age, color, and sex excluding New Jersey. The procedure used to make these estimates rests on the assumption that the ratio of the population of the United States excluding New Jersey in 1962 classified by age, color, and sex to the total population of the United States in 1962 classified by age, color, and sex can be represented by a ratio based on corresponding data from the 1960 Census of Population.

Ratios derived in this manner were applied to the 1962 United States population in each specific age, sex, and color group to obtain the population denominators which exclude New Jersey. The estimated 1962 populations used to compute birth rates for each color group are shown in table 4-4. Consideration of the relatively small proportion of the United States population contributed by New Jersey and the maximum probable degree of error in the estimation procedure justified the conclusion that the rates approximate closely those that would have been obtained if natality data by color had been available for New Jersey.

Illegitimate births

The following 16 States did not report legitimacy statistics on the birth record in 1962: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Idaho, Maryland, Massachusetts, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York, Oklahoma, and Vermont.

Figures for the United States as a whole were derived by adding an estimate of the number of illegitimate live births in States for which legitimacy data were not available to the number of illegitimate live births tabulated for the reporting States. No adjustments were included for misstatements of legitimacy status on the birth records or for failure to register illegitimate births because quantitative information is not available. The figures are based on a 50-percent sample of illegitimate live births in the reporting States.

For illegitimate births reported as second or higher birth orders, it is not known whether previous deliveries to the mother occurred out of wedlock since the marital status

of the mother at the time of these earlier pregnancies is not available from the birth record.¹³

Attendant at birth

The term "attended by physician" as used in this publication includes births attended by physicians out of hospitals and all births in hospitals or institutions. Births are classified as occurring "in hospital or institution" on the basis of entries on the birth certificate. The classification is unrelated to American Hospital Association (AHA) registered hospital listings. In comparing data from the National Vital Statistics Division with those published by the AHA, it should also be noted that the surveys on which the AHA figures are based cover a reporting period from October 1 to September 30 whereas the data in this volume are for the calendar year.

Birth weight

In practically all areas, birth weight is reported in terms of pounds and ounces rather than in grams. However, the metric system has been used in tabulating and presenting the statistics to facilitate comparison with data published by other groups in the United States. The equivalents in pounds and ounces of the gram intervals are given in each table containing weight data.

For purposes of classification, the term "immature" is defined as referring to infants weighing 2,500 grams or less at birth. This definition was recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics in 1935 and later adopted in the Sixth Revision of the International Lists of Diseases and Causes of Death (1948). "Premature," although containing the concept of duration of pregnancy, has also been used for many years in connection with the birth weight criterion. It is possible, however, that basic differences in physical development between different groups—for example, white and nonwhite infants—might make the weight criterion for immaturity too high or too low for a particular group.

The birth weights of infants born at home may not be measured as accurately as those of infants born in hospitals. Many of the attendants who weigh infants born at home use scales calibrated by quarter pounds. In addition, it is not known in such cases whether proper allowance is made for the diaper, blanket, or other material in which the infant is wrapped. Underregistration of small infants who die shortly after birth or misreporting of them as fetal deaths also affects birth weight statistics, and these factors are likely to be more important among infants born at home.

Median weights were, in effect, computed from data classified by pounds and ounces, then converted to grams, and rounded for publication. To establish the continuity of class intervals needed to compute medians, the end points of these intervals were assumed to be ½ ounce less at the lower end and ½ ounce more at the upper end. For example, "2 lb. 4 oz. to 3 lb. 4 oz." is interpreted as 2 lb. 3½ oz. to 3 lb. 4½ oz.

Period of gestation

An examination of the reported information on period of gestation suggests a substantial heaping at the interval "40 weeks and over." This bias probably results from the fact that the gestation period is not carefully observed and that the newborn infant of normal size is generally assumed to have had a gestation period of 40 weeks. Such errors in reporting are minimized in areas where the gestation period item on the birth certificate requests the "first day of the last normal menstrual period." Areas using this wording of the item are California, the city of Baltimore, the District of Columbia, and New York City.

The following comparison of the percentage distributions of births in 1962 by length of gestation and color for the United States as a whole and for California and the District of Columbia combined suggests the magnitude of the distortion:

The very large bias in reporting gestation at 40 weeks results in great understatement of the adjacent intervals below and above 40 weeks.

In former years there was also some heaping at the 36-week interval, and for this reason the class intervals of periods of gestation were established to show the 36-week period separately. The 1950 data for the United States show that 7.0 percent of the white and 11.5 percent of the nonwhite infants were reported at this period of gestation; in 1962 the percentages were 2.7 and 5.0, respectively. The latter figures agree closely with the proportions in the 36-week interval shown above for California and the District of Columbia.

In terms of length of gestation, "premature" relates to pregnancies of less than 37 completed weeks. The method of reporting length of gestation is probably of considerable importance in the relative number of prematures shown by these data. Evidence to this effect is observed in comparing the rates for California and the District of Columbia combined, with the rate for the United States. In 1962 for the country as a whole, there were 6.1 percent of the white infants and 11.3 percent of the nonwhite infants who had gestation periods of less than 37 weeks; the corresponding figures for California and the District of Columbia were higher—8.4 and 16.4.

Quality control procedures

The coding and punching of birth data were performed simultaneously directly from microfilm images or transcripts of the original certificates. Nearly 90 percent of all cards punched were verified by repeating the coding and punching for a 10-percent systematic sample. The expected result from this system of sampling inspection is that on the average 2.25 percent of the cards will contain one or more errors. The rest of the cards were verified completely and the errors remaining are presumably very few.

Both systems of verification involve controlling two types of error (coding and punching) at the same time, and the error rates are a combined measure of both types. While it may be assumed that punching errors are randomly distributed across all items on the card, this assumption cannot be made as readily for coding errors. It is possible for systematic errors in coding rare events to escape detection during sample verification. This is partially controlled by complete reverification of randomly selected lots from each operator's work. Errors detected by any method of verification are reviewed to determine coding bias.

After the completion of coding and punching, card counts are balanced against checklists for each registration area giving county totals for each month. Impossible codes, including missing items, are selected out during the card-to-tape conversion on the computer. Most of these are adjusted by arbitrary code assignments. All subsequent operations involved in tabulating and table preparation are verified either by the computer or by statistical clerks.

INTERPRETATION OF DATA

While vital statistics data are useful for a variety of administrative and scientific purposes, they cannot be correctly interpreted unless various qualifying factors, in addition to methods of classification, are taken into account. The factors to be considered depend upon the specific purposes for which the data are to be used. It is not feasible to discuss all of the pertinent factors in the use of vital statistics tabulations, but some of the more important ones should be mentioned.

Most of the factors limiting the use of the data arise from imperfections in the original records or from the impracticability of tabulating these data in very detailed categories. These defects should not be ignored, but their existence does not vitiate the value of the data for most general purposes. Analysis of small differences or exact evaluation of vital statistics requires careful study of many related elements. However, the major trends and differences will not usually be changed materially by finer analysis.

Sampling of birth records

Final birth data for 1951-54 and 1956-62 have been derived from 50-percent samples which consist of only even-numbered birth records.¹⁴ Statistics for these years were obtained by multiplying the sample figures by 2. Prior

to 1951 and for 1955, annual birth statistics were based on the total file of birth records.

The sample data represent estimates which differ somewhat from figures that would have been derived by processing all the records. However, the manner in which records are numbered greatly reduces the sampling variability of totals for geographic areas. With few exceptions, records are numbered in the State offices of vital statistics as they are received from the local offices. The assignment of the last digit in the number is not selective, and the systematic sample of even-numbered records may be assumed to be unbiased. Furthermore, because the records are almost always in geographic order before numbering, twice the sample count of births occurring in the great majority of counties in table 2-1 in Section 2 is virtually the same as the corresponding figure based on all records.

The extent to which residence figures for urban places, counties, and States derived from the sample differ from the totals that would have resulted from a complete count depends on the amount of nonresident interchange. (This assumes virtually no error in the figures on a place-of-occurrence basis.) Since there is relatively little nonresident interchange of births among the States and between "metropolitan" and "nonmetropolitan" groups of counties in any State, the sampling errors for these geographic units are negligible.

The nonresident interchange factor is more important for many individual urban places and counties. During 1962, 17 percent of the births occurred in a county which was not the mother's place of residence. Figures are not shown in this volume on the amount of nonresident interchange in individual counties, but the net situation for a county can be determined by comparing the figures by place of occurrence and by place of residence in table 2-1. The percent error due to sampling in a county resident total varies between zero and the value obtained from the table described below. The amount of the error depends on the extent of nonresident interchange as judged from this comparison.

The table shown below presents approximate percent errors in the 1951-54 and 1956-62 figures for variates which are randomly distributed. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that the percent difference due to sampling variability between such a figure and the result that would be obtained by a complete count is less than the percent error. The chances are about 19 out of 20 that the percent difference is less than twice the percent error.



Completeness of registration

Although every State has adopted a law requiring the registration of births, these laws are not uniformly observed. In most areas practically all births are registered. For some areas, however, there is enough underregistration to affect the use of the statistics for certain purposes.

Nationwide tests of completeness of birth registration were made in both 1940 and 1950. For the United States as a whole, these tests indicated that birth registration was, respectively, 92.5 and 97.9 percent complete. A detailed discussion of the results of these tests was given in chapter 6 in Volume I of *Vital Statistics of the United States, 1950*. On the basis of results of the 1950 tests, it is estimated that in 1962 birth registration completeness was 98.9 percent for the country as a whole—99.3 for the white group and 96.6 for the nonwhite (figure 4-B in this section and table 1-16 in Section 1).

Discontinuation of adjustment for underregistration

Several factors were taken into consideration in making the decision to discontinue adjustments for the underregistration of births in the published data beginning in 1960.

In the computation of birth rates, the numerator and the denominator of the rates are based upon data from two independent sources, each subject to different kinds of

errors. The numerator is the number of registered births, and the denominator is the population based on a census. The computed rate is subject to bias to the extent that there are differences between the two sets of data with regard to the completeness of overall counts and the accuracy of reporting pertinent items such as age, which is utilized in the calculation of age-specific rates. A method for assessing this bias in the rates involves the measurement of error in both the numerator and the denominator and correcting for this error before the rates are computed. A rate based on the corrected figures, regarded as a "true" rate, could then be compared with published "uncorrected" figures in order to judge the net effect of errors in the two sources of the data.

This approach was used in preparing the figures below. Estimates of 1950 population data prepared by Dr. Ansley

Coale show population figures corrected for bias in both age reporting and census undercounts.¹⁵ These were used as the denominators for the "true" rates. The numerators were based upon the number of births in 1950 corrected for underregistration. The rates computed from the two sets of corrected data are shown in the first column of the table below. The rates in the second column are those that were routinely published by this office in which the number of births are adjusted and the population is unadjusted. The rates in the third column are computed entirely from unadjusted figures. It is obvious that the entirely uncorrected figures provide a closer approximation to the "true" rates than the routinely published rates, which are partially adjusted. This suggests that biases of approximately the same magnitude and direction exist in both the 1950 census figures and the 1950 birth data of the National Vital Statistics Division.

It is probable that a very similar relationship exists between the birth and population data for at least the entire 1950-60 period. As birth registration becomes more nearly complete, the effect of adjustment becomes smaller and smaller. In 1962 the estimated registration completeness was 99.3 percent for the white group and 96.6 percent for the nonwhite.

Pertinent to the question of continuing the adjusted series is the fact that about 10 years have elapsed since the last test of birth registration completeness in 1950. The results of this test form the basis for all adjustments in the subsequent years. These adjustments are generally made by assuming that registration completeness by occurrence of events in and not-in-hospital, by color and by State is the same for the year in question as in 1950. In effect, the estimated change in registration comes about from the increasing utilization of hospital facilities for obstetrical services. The difficulty is that the underlying assumptions become more tenuous as we move further away from the benchmark year. It is not known to what extent the basic coefficients of registration completeness have changed over time.

A practical difficulty is encountered in presenting an analysis of the data when they are in the form of adjusted numbers and rates through 1959 and registered thereafter. This change results in a discontinuity—not always trivial—of the time series. In the case of the nonwhite group, underregistration is still estimated at 3.4 percent. When making comparisons of the birth rates for nonwhite persons over the past decade, a more accurate indication of change might be obtained by using all figures adjusted or all figures unadjusted. The situation is similar for a number of States where registration completeness is relatively low. (See table 1-28 in Section 1, which shows the 1959 adjusted and unadjusted birth rates by State.)

Also, when numbers of births rather than birth rates are being used, as in making population projections or net migration estimates, it would be preferable to use adjusted data, particularly for geographic areas where a significant number of births are unregistered.

Population bases

In table 1-10 in Section 1 the rates for 1920-39 are based on population estimates made by P. K. Whelpton; the rates for 1941-49 are based on population estimates made by the National Vital Statistics Division. All other population data used in this report were prepared by the U.S. Bureau of the Census.

Except as noted, birth rates shown in this report for the United States and the individual States are based on the populations present in the respective areas. These populations exclude the Armed Forces overseas and persons living abroad but include the Armed Forces stationed in each area.

The estimates of the total population of the United States by age, color, and sex in 1962 are published in *Current Population Reports*, Series P-25, No. 265, by the Bureau of the Census and are shown in table 4-3. These figures are based on data from the 1960 census, final counts of births and deaths for 1960 and preliminary counts through June 1962, statistics on the number of immigrant aliens admitted to the United States as reported by the Immigration and Naturalization Service, and data on the size and distribution of the Armed Forces.

Estimates of the total resident population in each State for 1962 are shown in table 4-5. These estimates are consistent with the 1960 census counts, with the revised estimates of these areas for July 1, 1961, and with the national estimates in P-25, No. 265.

Population estimates for 1962 excluding New Jersey.—As indicated in the section on race and color, the birth records of the State of New Jersey did not contain the race item in 1962. Therefore, this office estimated a comparable population base by color which excluded New Jersey. These estimates are shown in table 4-4. The procedure used to make these estimates rests on the assumption that the ratio of the population of the United States excluding New Jersey in 1962 classified by age, color, and sex to the total population of the United States in 1962 classified by age, color, and sex can be represented by a ratio based on corresponding data from the 1960 Census of Population. Ratios derived in this manner were applied to the 1962 U.S. population in each specific age, sex, and color group¹⁶ to obtain the population denominators which exclude New Jersey.

Revised rates for 1961.—Birth rates for 1961 in this report differ from those shown in *Vital Statistics of the United States, 1961*, Volume I, because the 1961 rates in this report are based on revised populations. Although the differences in the U.S. total and the differences by age between the provisional series (P-25, No. 246) used in the 1961 annual report and the revised series (P-25, No. 265) are negligible, changes in a few State estimates are about 5 percent. The revised State estimates appear in Nos. 259 and 267, P-25, and the provisional figures used for computing rates in the 1961 report appear in No. 239, P-25.

Computation of seasonal index

The seasonal indexes for 1950-62 are based largely on computations prepared by the Bureau of the Census, using an adaptation of the standard ratio to moving average method.¹⁷ This procedure assumes that ratios of the original observations to a 12-month moving average include the seasonal and erratic components of a series but not the trend and cyclical components and that averages of the ratios for each of the 12 months measure the seasonal component alone.

Computation of gross and net reproduction rates

In computing the gross reproduction rates for this report, the age-specific birth rates for the 5-year age groups of women were multiplied by 5, summed, and the total multiplied by the proportion of all births which were female.

The net reproduction rate was derived by multiplying the age-specific birth rates for the 5-year age groups of women by 5 and by the probability (as determined from the life table for the year) of women surviving to that age group (${}_5L_x$). The sum of these products was multiplied by the proportion of all births which were female. For both the gross and the net reproduction rates, the 5-year age groups of women used were from 10-14 years to 45-49 years; births to women 50 years old and over were attributed to women aged 45-49 years.

Computation of intrinsic vital rates

The computation of intrinsic vital rates is based upon a discussion by Dublin and Lotka,¹⁸ who showed that the value of the intrinsic rate of natural increase, r , determined by specified conditions of fertility and mortality, is given by the real root of the equation

$$1 = \int_0^{\infty} e^{-ra} p(a) m(a) da, \quad (1)$$

where r is the increase per head per year; $p(a)$ is the probability, at birth, that a girl will reach a specified age, a ; and $m(a)$ is the age-specific fertility rate for women of age a .

A close approximation to the real root of equation (1) is given by the quadratic equation

$$\frac{1}{2}\beta r^2 + \alpha r - \log_e R_0 = 0, \quad (2)$$

where R_0 is the net reproduction rate determined by the specified conditions of fertility and mortality and where

$$\alpha = \frac{R_1}{R_0}, \quad (3)$$

R_1 and R_2 being the first and second moments of the curve representing the age schedule of net reproductivity.

Solving the quadratic equation (2) we have

$$r = \frac{\alpha - \sqrt{\alpha^2 + 2\beta \log_e R_0}}{-\beta} \quad (5)$$

or, using the quantities R_0 , R_1 , and R_2 ,

The intrinsic birth rate has the value

$$b = \frac{1}{\int_0^{\infty} e^{-ra} p(a) da}, \quad (7)$$

which may be approximated by

$$b = \frac{1}{\sum_0^{\infty} e^{-r(a+\frac{1}{2})} \frac{L_a}{I_0}}, \quad (8)$$

where L_a is the female life-table population in a given year, and I_0 is the radix of the life table. The intrinsic death rate has a value

$$d = b - r. \quad (9)$$

As with the calculation of the gross and net reproduction rates, the quinquennial method is used instead of the single-year method for simplicity of computation. Thus $e^{-r(a+\frac{1}{2})}$ becomes $e^{-r(a+2\frac{1}{2})}$, and L_a becomes ${}_5L_a$.

Intrinsic vital rates for the United States and other countries have appeared annually in the April issue of

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Population Index. These values are usually prepared by an abbreviated method which yields slightly different results from the longer method used by the National Vital Statistics Division.¹⁹
