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




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Review of Sources (Issue/Recommendation Mapping Process)

Issues and recommendations arise from four basic questions:

- What are they?
- Why do agencies use them?
- How do agencies use them?
- How should agencies use them?

What are they?

- Interagency Contract Vehicles
 - Schedules
 - Government-wide acquisition contracts
 - Multi-agency contracts
 - Interagency contracting offices
 - —Franchise Funds
 - Related instruments
 - —Blanket purchasing agreements under schedules
- Stakeholders
 - Vehicle owners
 - Agency requirement holders
 - Oversight and management organizations
 - Industry
- Issue: Oversight and management of the landscape

Why do we use them?

- Incentives and benefits from each stakeholders' perspective
 - Ease of use
 - Economies of scale
 - Flexibility
- Private sector perspective
- Issue Do actual and perceived incentives translate into benefits for taxpayer?

How do we use them?

- Acquisition strategies of contracts and orders from each stakeholders' perspective
- Private sector experience
- Issue: Securing taxpayer benefits through more effective planning, management, and accountability

How should we use them?

- Develop recommendations for changes to laws, regulations, and policies to:
 - Establish overarching goals and acquisition planning mechanisms to balance competing mandates.
 - Address systemic issues identified in GAO, IG and other reports.
 - Foster possible restructuring/reorganization/consolidation of programs and vehicles.
 - Import appropriate best practices from private sector experience.
 - Address acquisition workforce issues.
 - Establish reliable and meaningful data collection to allow for effective management and oversight.

Next steps

- Connect identified issues with applicable laws, regulations and policies - June 30.
- Collect and review agency and private sector practices – continuing.
- Draft background and framing sections of report to the panel - July 31.
- Use working group meetings to refine issues and emerging recommendations continuing.
- Begin drafting recommendations for the Panel August.
