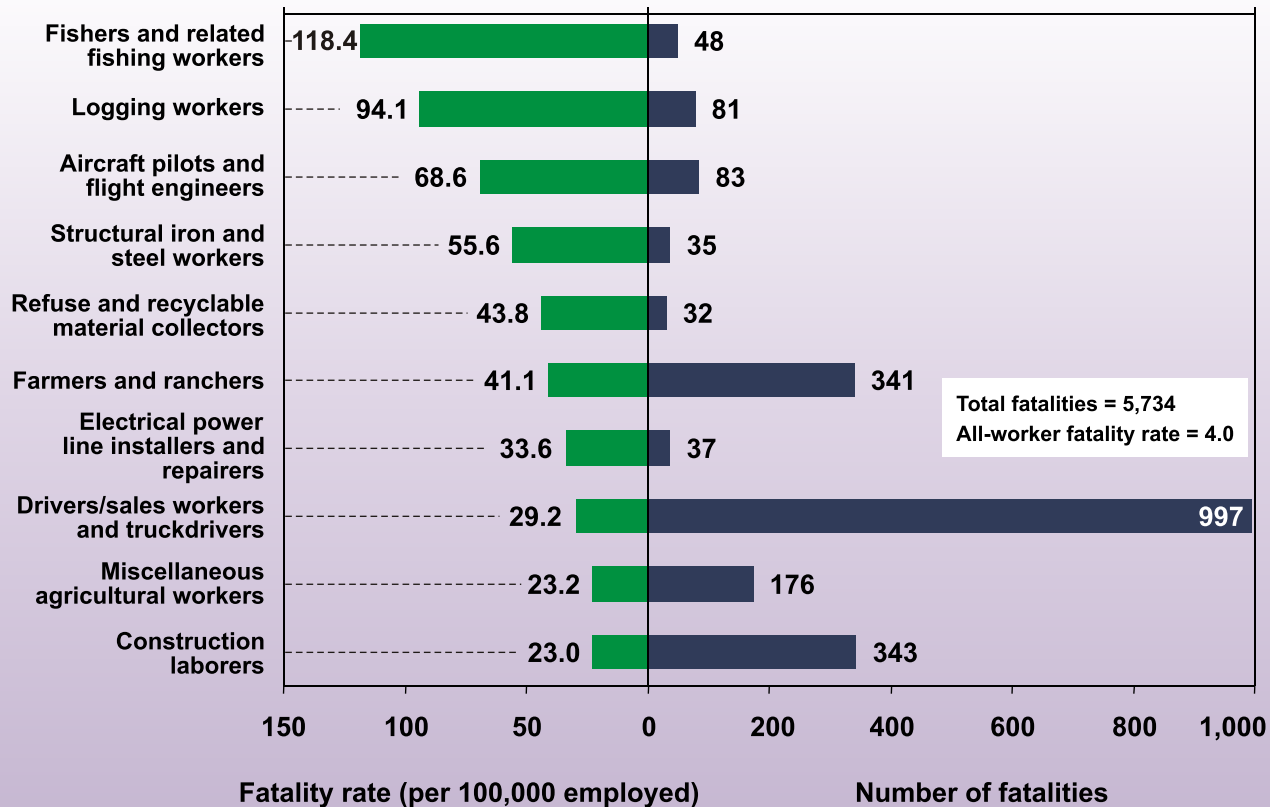
Even though driver/sales workers and truck drivers experienced the most fatalities, the highest fatality rates were recorded for fishers and logging workers. The fatality rate of 118.4 recorded by fishers was nearly 30 times the fatality rate of 4.0 for all workers.

Aircraft pilots and flight engineers and structural iron and steel workers also recorded high fatality rates.
