

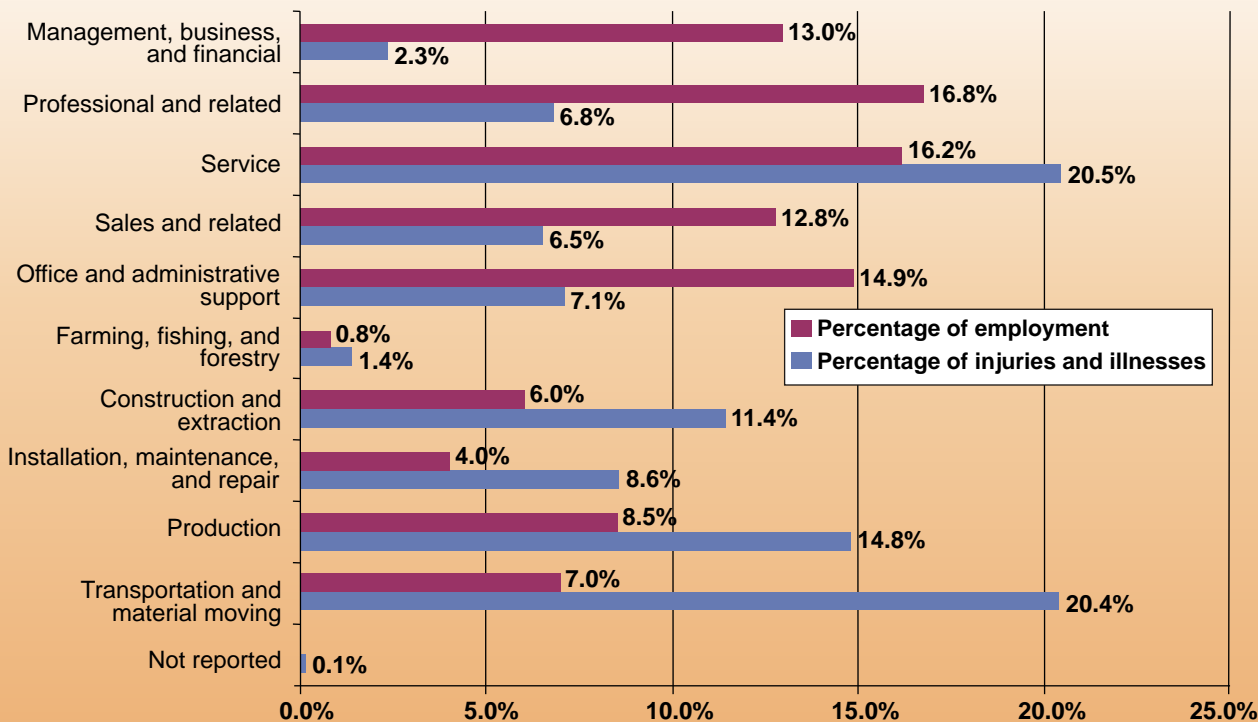
Transportation and material-moving occupations accounted for almost 3 times the share of injuries and illnesses as their employment share.

Transportation and material movers; production workers; installation, maintenance, and repair workers; construction and extraction workers; farming, fishing, and forestry workers; and service workers had a higher share of injuries and illnesses than their employment share would suggest.

Management, business, and financial workers; professional workers; sales workers; and office and administrative support workers had a lower share of injuries and illnesses than their employment share would suggest.
