SPENCER COUNTY MAN CHARGED WITH SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF A CHILD AND RECEIPT AND POSSESSION OF SEXUALLY EXPLICIT MATERIAL INVOLVING MINORS

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that JIMMY B. GLOVER, 35, of Evanston, Indiana, was indicted by a federal grand jury sitting in Indianapolis for four counts of sexual exploitation of a child, one count of receipt sexually explicit material involving minors, and one count of possession of sexually explicit material involving minors, following an investigation by the Indiana State Police.

The indictment alleges that between August 12, 2003, and January 14, 2008, Glover recorded four videos of a minor female engaged in sexually explicit conduct using materials that had moved in interstate or foreign commerce. The indictment also alleges that Glover, using a computer he operated from his residence in the Southern District of Indiana, downloaded, received and saved sexually explicit videos involving minors and possessed more than 600 images of minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct that were saved on data storage disks.

According to Assistant U. S. Attorney Todd S. Shellenbarger, who is prosecuting the case for the government, GLOVER faces a maximum possible prison sentence of 30 years and a maximum possible fine of \$250,000. An initial hearing will be scheduled before a U.S. Magistrate Judge in Evansville, Indiana.

This case was brought as a part of Project Safe Childhood. In February 2006, the Department of Justice launched Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative designed to protect children from online exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorneys Offices, Project Safe Childhood uses federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the Internet, as well as identify and rescue victims. The indictment is an allegation only, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at trial or by guilty plea.
