ANDERSON MAN CHARGED WITH ARMED ROBBERY

PRESS RELEASE

Timothy M. Morrison, United States Attorney for the Southern District of Indiana, announced that CURTISS M. DOAN, II, 36, Anderson, Indiana, was indicted by a federal grand jury sitting in Indianapolis for three counts of armed robbery affecting interstate commerce and three counts of brandishing a firearm during a crime of violence, following an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives, Shelbyville Police Department, Yorktown Police Department and Alexandria Police Department.

The indictment alleges that DOAN committed three armed robberies and brandished a firearm in each robbery. The three robberies took place at the following locations on the following dates: 1) On November 18, 2008, at MedWorks Pharmacy, in Shelbyville, Indiana; 2) On August 28, 2008, at Yorktown Healthcare Pharmacy, in Yorktown, Indiana; and, 3) On July 22, 2008, at Medicine Shoppe Store, in Alexandria, Indiana

According to Assistant United States Attorney James M. Warden, who is prosecuting the case for the government, DOAN faces a maximum possible prison sentence of 20 years per count for each armed robbery; not less than 7 years consecutive to all other counts for one count of brandishing a firearm; and, not less than 25 years consecutive to all other counts for the other two counts of brandishing a firearm. DOAN also faces a maximum possible fine of \$250,000 on each count. An initial hearing will be scheduled before a U.S. Magistrate Judge in Indianapolis, Indiana.

The indictment is an allegation only, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty at trial or by guilty plea.
