

U.S. SECURITIES AND
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ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST LEONARD L. GOOCH AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on Leonard L. Gooch of Santa Clara, California. The NASD censured Gooch, fined him \$1,000, and suspended him for one year from association with any NASD member as a principal, with the proviso that he must requalify by examination before re-entering the securities industry in that capacity.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that Gooch engaged in private securities transactions without giving his firm proper notification, and, in effecting such transactions, improperly engaged in business as an unregistered broker-dealer.

In affirming the NASD's sanctions, the Commission stated that Gooch's professed ignorance of applicable requirements did not excuse his serious failure to comply with the high standards required of those in the securities business. (Rel. 34-16751)

ROBERT BERKSON BARRED

The Commission has barred Robert Berkson of East Hills, New York, from association with any broker or dealer. After 18 months, Berkson may become so associated in a non-proprietary and non-supervisory capacity, upon an appropriate showing to the Commission of adequate supervision.

In 1976, Berkson was convicted of violations of antifraud provisions of the securities laws, mail fraud, transporting forged securities, and conspiracy to commit those offenses. That same year, he was also convicted, on his plea of guilty, of filing a false federal income tax return.

The Commission concluded that, since all of the misconduct that led to Berkson's convictions occurred nearly 10 years ago, it would affirm the qualified bar imposed on Berkson by an administrative law judge. (Rel. 34-16753)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN E. MARQUEE AND SHELDON LUBITZ ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on April 24 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking to enjoin John E. Marqusee of New York City and Sheldon Lubitz of East Meadow, New York, from further violations of the antifraud, reporting and foreign corrupt practices provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The Commission's complaint alleged, among other things, that in 1976, 1977, 1978 and 1979, the defendants, officers of Atlantic Improvement Corporation, diverted \$170,000, \$1,500,000, \$850,000 and \$750,000, respectively, from Atlantic to a corporation owned by Marqusee and his family, Paddington Press Limited. In furtherance of this scheme, the complaint alleged that the defendants falsified the books and records of Atlantic. By falsifying the books and records, the diversion of Atlantic's funds was not discovered by Atlantic's outside auditors. All of Atlantic's funds were repaid, with interest, by Paddington in 1976, 1977 and 1978. As of the date of the complaint, however, an amount of the \$750,000 diverted in 1979 has not been repaid.

Simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's complaint, Marqusee and Lubitz consented to the entry of final judgments of permanent injunction, without admitting or denying the allegations set forth in the complaint. In addition, the court has ordered Marqusee to use his best efforts to return to Atlantic the funds diverted in 1979. (SEC v. John E. Marqusee and Sheldon Lubitz, S.D.N.Y., 80 Civil 2289 [GLG]). COMPLAINT NAMES HETRA COMPUTER AND COMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRIES, INC.

The Commission announced that on April 25 it filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia a civil injunctive action against Hetra Computer and Communications Industries, Inc. of Melbourne, Florida, alleging violations of the securities laws and seeking a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief.

The complaint alleges that Hetra, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct, has failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended December 1979, required to have been filed with the Commission by March 30, 1980. The complaint requests that the Court order Hetra to file that report forthwith, with the Commission and requests that the Court enjoin Hetra from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Hetra Computer and Communications Industries, Inc., U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 80-1051). (LR-9068)

An order has been issued on an application of Centennial Capital Cash Management Trust, amending a prior order of exemption from Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 under the Investment Company Act of 1940, to permit it to calculate its price per share to the nearest one cent on a share value of one dollar. OPPENHEIMER MONETARY BRIDGE, INC.

An order has been issued on an application of Oppenheimer Monetary Bridge, Inc., amending a prior order of exemption from Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 under the Investment Company Act of 1940, to permit it to calculate its price per share to the nearest one cent on a share value of one dollar. (Rel. IC-11141 - Apr. 25)

FIDELITY FUND

An order has been issued on an application filed by Fidelity Fund, Puritan Fund, Fidelity Trend Fund, Salem Fund, Fidelity Equity-Income Fund, Contrafund, Congress Street Fund, Magellan Fund, Fidelity Destiny Fund, Fidelity Corporate Bond Fund, Fidelity Daily Income Trust, Fidelity Thrift Trust, Fidelity Limited Term Municipals, Fidelity Municipal Bond Fund, Fidelity Aggressive Income Fund, Fidelity High Yield Municipals, Fidelity Asset Investment Trust, Fidelity Money Market Trust, Fidelity Government Securities Fund, Fidelity Cash Reserves, Fidelity Tax-Exempt Money Market Trust and Fidelity Triad Fund (Applicants), each an open-end investment company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, declaring that Bertram H. Witham Jr., a director, trustee, or general partner of Applicants, shall not be deemed to be an "interested person" of Applicants solely by reason of his status as a consultant to Merrill Lynch International Incorporated and, pursuant to Section 10(f) of the Act, exempting Applicants from the provisions of Section 10(f) so as to permit Applicants to purchase securities in public offerings in which Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc., which may be deemed to be an affiliated person of Mr. Witham, participates as a principal underwriter. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

OHIO POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Ohio Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to make a combination of long-term loans and cash capital contributions by Ohio Power to Southern Ohio Coal Company, subsidiary of Ohio Power, of \$40,600,000. (Rel. 35-21537 - Apr. 25)

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 20 to request a hearing on a proposal of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to increase the number of its authorized shares of common stock. An order has been issued authorizing the solicitation of proxies in connection therewith. (Rel. 35-21538 - Apr. 25)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

CHRYSLER CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 14 to request a hearing on an application by Chrysler Corporation, pursuant to Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939, declaring that the successor trusteeship of the J. Henry Schroder Bank and Trust Company under two indentures of Chrysler is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest so as to make it necessary to disqualify the J.
